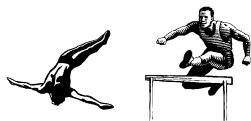

2008 INDUCTION CLASS

The **1975 Football Team** with head coach John Becker won the Metro Conference Title, the Potato Bowl, and was ranked #2 in the country by the *J.C. Gridwire*.

The **1975 Women's Basketball Team** was picked to finish no better than 5th in the challenging state tournament, but they defied the odds and defeated all the top ranked teams to clinch the Southern California State Championship.

Football player **Eric Yarber** was a Community College All-American at Valley College in 1982-83 as wide receiver and kick returner. He also had a stellar career at the University of Idaho as well as the NFL.

Sue Gossick swam on the Valley College women's swim team in 1966-67, but made a name for herself as an Olympic Gold Medalist in Springboard Diving in the 1968 games. This heralded diver was also a Gold Medalist in the 1967 Pan American games and was recognized as the Los Angeles Times' "Woman of the Year" in 1967.

Melanie Clarke arrived at Valley College in 1990 beginning a remarkable string of successes that included awards such as two-time California State Junior College

heptathlon Champion, two-time Southern California Heptathlon Champion, Women's athlete of the Year (1990 and 1991), and Western State Conference Champion in both the 200 and 400 meters.

Laszlo Tabori, a legendary distance coach in Track & Field and Cross Country at Valley College from 1967-1974, coached seven individual national title holders, and coached the Cross Country teams to three State Championships (1968, 1969, and 1970). Tabori was also a 1956 Olympian and is the third man to ever run the mile in under four minutes.

Richard Windham was a multi-talented athlete at Valley College in 1954-56. As an All-Metro running back on the football team, Windham led the Monarchs to a Metro Conference Title as well as the Orange Show Bowl in 1955. He was also a standout centerfield in baseball and was the Metro Player of the Year in 1956.

David Summers is the recipient of six varsity letters from 1951-52 that included Tennis, Basketball, and Football. As captain of the Tennis Team in 1952, Summers led the Monarchs to the Metro Conference Championship and also to a second place finish in the State Championship.
