Q: Exciting! Anything else we should know about?


A: Actually, yes. ANNMA (Agricultural Neighborhood Network with Motive Aid) is the branch of Multi-Mode Technologies devoted to sustainable food distribution. ANNMA is an online resource that creates a marketplace for part time food growers, connects consumers with local sources of food, and provides a convenient food distribution and delivery system. ANNMA provides families and communities with an affordable, dependable food supply.

It gives me a lot of joy to see that more and more of us are gaining confidence that we can grow our own food. The word is out...it really isn't that difficult. Here is a little reminder: One of the simplest ways to see the miracle of food



growing before your very eyes in about a week or less is to get the largest locally grown beet you can find - preferably from a local organic farmer. Give it some good organic compost, good food, the way you would feed your pet. Did any of you go and adopt your own beet from the local market yet?

Remember, you are supposed to eat the greens, but KEEP The BEET. Do not eat it, it will be your friend. Your very own KEEP The BEET will keep growing more and more greens. You can eat the greens raw, steamed, or in various recipes. At home here in the *Enchanted Garden Intentional Community* in San Diego, California, Leslie has more than ten pots of beets. I do not mind sharing my pot with edible flowers, or other sprouts either, which means more nutrition for you. During the second year, I will send out a large stalk and make hundreds of seeds. Then you can grow beets from seeds as well, share them with friends or trade them. Seeds have always been a real currency.

SOL: Miss BEET, how did you learn to talk?

KEEP The BEET: All plants talk. The question is: Are you hearing me? Learning to "Talk Beet" is a question of learning how to keep the beat with nature. For thousands of years, we have each had natural abilities. That is why everyone is so drawn to Anastasia. She never lost what we all inherently have. When you start to keep your own beet in a pot, you will start to hear it and you will remember how to keep the beat with your own nature.

SOL: You mentioned the Enchanted Garden. What is that?

KEEP THE BEET: The Enchanted Garden is a name for our renewed earth that grows one plant at a time, and one dream at a time. Mother Earth is looking to each of us for her rebirth. We each have Seed Dreams that are meant to come down to earth. Growing our dream begins in our own backyard, so dig in. (The *Enchanted Garden* is also the name of our own intentional community.)

Q: Miss Beet, I understand you can answer relationship questions. My name is Molly. My boyfriend Bill loves city life and I am excited by the idea of life in the country. He says he wants to get married and have children, but only if I move into his Los Angeles condominium with him. What should I do?

M.B.: My dear Molly! That sure sounds like a dilemma. Look at how many things you and Bill have in common. Do you have mutual beliefs regarding children, family life and work out on your land? Why don't you tell him that you went to talk to...ehm...get advice from a plant and see what he says. You will find out very quickly whether he is rooted in your reality or over the top with his life-style. If he is curious and asks you more questions, he is a good listener. That is important. Make sure he loves gardening. A man who loves flowers will appreciate a woman. It's not so much city or country, but whether he will honor who you are and respect your needs and wonderful connection to the plant-kingdom.
