## HEADLINES

- The Jets make their first of four trips to the west coast, as they will log more than 25,000 miles on the road this year. The Jets also visit OAK (10/19), SF (12/7) and SEA (12/21).
- The Jets have won three of their last five on Monday Night Football (17-21 overall). The Jets last appeared on Christmas Night, 2006, at MIA, and came away with a 13-10 win in the rain.
- The Jets defense, ranked eighth in the NFL, squares off against the Chargers offense that ranks fifth in the NFL.
- **Brett Favre** is set to make his 34th start on MNF (18-15). He will appear on Monday night for the 16th consecutive year.
- The Jets seven sacks are tied for third in the NFL. **Bryan Thomas** is tied for the AFC lead and second in the NFL with three sacks.

# GAME NOTES

## FAVRE VS. THE CHARGERS

**Brett Favre** is undefeated against the Chargers in five starts. In his last appearance vs. the Chargers last season, Favre hit **Greg Jennings** with a 57-yard scoring pass with 2:03 remaining to lift the Packers to a 24-21 lead on their way to a 31-24 win. The touchdown pass, Favre's third of the day, was his 420th of his career, which tied him with **Dan Marino**. The fourth-quarter comeback was the 38th of his career, and his 369 yards passing represented his eighth-highest total in a game.

## FAVRE ON MONDAY NIGHT FOOTBALL

**Brett Favre** is set to make his 34th appearance on Monday Night Football, and appear in a Monday Night Football game for the 16th consecutive season, tying him with **Marcus Allen** (1982-97, OAK, KC), **Bill Romanowski** (1988-2003, SF, PHI, DEN, OAK) and **Ed White** (1970-85, MIN, SD) for the longest such streaks in NFL history. He has had his share of moments on this particular national stage:

**10/29/07** - At DEN, he completed 21-of-27 passes for 331 yards and two touchdowns (142.4 rating), throwing only one incompleteness after halftime in a 19-13 overtime win. He hit **Greg Jennings** with an 82-yard touchdown on the first play of overtime to win the game. Also, he completed a 79-yard scoring pass to James Jones early in the contest.

**12/22/03** - At OAK, playing one day after the sudden death of his father, Irvin, Favre completed 22-of-30 passes for 399 yards and four touchdowns (154.9 rating) in a 41-7 victory. He threw for 311 yards and all four touchdowns in the first half, and completed six passes of 30-yards-or-more on the night.

**11/6/00** - At GB, Favre threw for two touchdowns, including an underhanded, five-yarder to Ahman Green. But it was the 43-yard touchdown pass to **Antonio Freeman** in overtime, giving the Packers a 26-20 victory that this game is remembered. Freeman got off his back, held on to the ball, got up and ran into the end zone as **Al Michaels** famously said "He did what?!"

**9/1/95** - At CHI, Favre hooks up with **Robert Brooks** for a 99-yard scoring pass, tying the NFL record and setting a Monday Night Football record, during a 27-24 victory.

## BRETT, PEYTON, JAWZ

**Brett Favre** is preparing to start his 256th consecutive regular season game, by far a record for quarterbacks. Actively trailing Favre is **Peyton Manning** at 162 through Week 2. The third-longest streak is held by Monday Night Football analyst **Ron Jaworski**, who started 116 straight games for PHI, 1977-84.

## NO DOUBTING THOMAS

**Thomas Jones'** off-field career running OuttaPocket Entertainment has taken off with the debut single, "Late Night Creep," from his first recording artist, *Myko*. On the field, Thomas is fifth in the NFL in rushing since 2005, adding to his total with 101 yards and a touchdown on 22 carries in the 2008 opener at MIA, 9/7, the 23rd 100-yard rushing game of his career. He leads the team in 2008 with 171 yards on 39 carries (4.4).

## BAKER CONNECTS

Seventh-year tight end **Chris Baker** has improved his numbers for receptions and receiving yards in each year of his career. After contributing two receptions for 14 yards his rookie season, he has produced steady increases through 2007 (41-409). He has opened the 2008 season with two catches for 34 yards, including a 29-yarder 9/7 at MIA, that marked his longest reception since hauling in a 30-yarder vs. JAC, 9/25/05.

## LAVERANUES COLES

In his ninth NFL season, Laveranues Coles is among the elite receivers of this decade. He has four catches for 72 yards this season, including a 54-yard catch-and-run vs. NE, 9/14. Coles has the most career receptions (565) among receivers that entered the NFL in 2000, and he is currently tied for 65th all-time for receptions with **Ed McCaffery** (see chart in notes) and 89th all-time for receiving yards (7,322). His 393 receptions as a Jet place him sixth on the franchise's all-time list.

## GO JERRICHO

After two straight seasons of 82 receptions, **Jerricho Cotchery** is no longer a secret weapon. On the opening play of the second possession of the 2008 season, Brett Favre hit Cotchery after a play-action fake for a 56-yard touchdown pass. Cotchery is averaging 25 yards per reception this season on four catches. Last season, Cotchery improved to 1,130 yards (13.8) from 961 (11.7) in 2006. He registered four 100-yard receiving games, and 13 receptions of 25 yards or longer, which was tied for second in the NFL with **Terrell Owens** and **Roddy White**, trailing only **Reggie Wayne**. His combined total of 164 receptions in 2006 and 2007 tied for the second-best two-year total in Jets history with **Coles**, who produced 164 receptions from 2005-06. The duo set the Jets record for most catches by a tandem with 173 (Coles 91, Cotchery 82) in 2006.

# GAME NOTES

## FAVRE TAKES A CHAN-SI

Most players remember their first NFL touchdown, but **Chansi Stuckey's** first NFL touchdown on opening day at MIA, 9/7, was just plain memorable. On fourth-and-13 from the MIA 22 in the second quarter and kicker **Mike Nugent** nursing a thigh injury, the Jets went for it. After the snap, **Brett Favre** avoided one would-be tackler, and as he was hit, he threw the ball in the direction of Stuckey, the second-year WR making his NFL debut. Stuckey made a leaping grab at the goalline for his first career reception and touchdown. Favre: *"I tried to throw it to where somebody was and just give someone a chance. I saw him, but I didn't think he had a chance in hell in catching it."* Stuckey: *"Somehow he maneuvered and was able to get the ball off. It seemed like it was up there forever."*

Stuckey became the 46th player to catch a touchdown pass from Favre. He is the first Jets player since the AFL/NFL merger in 1970 to catch a touchdown pass in his first two games and the first Jets player to score a touchdown in his NFL debut, excluding 1987 replacement games, since safety **Darrol Ray** returned a fumble 75 yards in a season-opening, 17-14 loss to the Colts, 28 years earlier to the day, 9/7/80. The last Jets rookie to score on offense in his NFL debut was tight end **Mickey Shuler**, who caught a one-yard touchdown pass from **Richard Todd** in the Jets 33-20 win over MIA, 9/1/78. Stuckey, with six receptions for 80 yards and two touchdowns, is tied for the team lead in receptions.

## TOP OF THE LINE

The Jets are the first team to start four first-round draft picks on the offensive line since the 2002 Steelers (**Alan Faneca**, **Wayne Gandy**, **Jeff Hartings** and **Kendall Simmons**).

The Jets "other" member of the offensive line has perhaps been one of the the most consistent Jets over the past four seasons. **Brandon Moore**, who first signed with the Jets as a free agent DEFENSIVE tackle in 2002, learned how to play offensive guard by spending time on the practice squad and NFL Europe in 2003 and was signed to the Jets active roster, 10/22/03. After playing in three games in 2003, he earned a starting job in 2004 at right guard. Since missing three games with an injury in 2004, he has started 59 straight games at right guard for the Jets.

## LEON OF ALL TRADES

**Leon Washington** plays a versatile role for the New York Jets. He is currently tied for the team lead in receptions with **Chansi Stuckey** with six (for 39 yards) and has gained 37 yards rushing on eight carries. His most significant contribution has been on special teams, where he has returned five punts for a 12.8-yard average. Those returns came at MIA, 9/7, and marked the third-best punt-return performance by a Mangini-led team (Washington averaged 16.7 per return, 12/17/06 at MIN; **Tim Dwight** averaged 13.8 per return, 10/29/06 at CLE). Washington, who returned three kickoffs for touchdowns in 2007 en route to being named the Jets **Curtis Martin** Team MVP, has two kickoff returns for a 17.0 average.

## BUBBA FRANKS, TD TARGET

Bubba Franks, who signed with the Jets as a free agent in March, is fourth in touchdown receptions by a tight end during his career (2000-07). He has been on the receiving end of 29 Brett Favre scoring strikes, placing him fifth on that list.

# GAME NOTES

## BT LEADS SACK CHARGE

The Jets have registered seven sacks, tied for third in the NFL. **Bryan Thomas**, has led the way with three, including a career-high tying two of his ex-teammate **Chad Pennington** in the opener at MIA, 9/7. Thomas also had two sacks in a game of David Carr vs HOU, 11/26/06. Thomas nabbed **Matt Cassel** for his third sack, giving him 20.5 sacks in his career. **Calvin Pace** has 1.5 sacks, **Kris Jenkins** and **Shaun Ellis** have one sack apiece and defensive back **David Barrett**, who split a sack with Pace of Cassel, got credit for a sack for the first time in his nine-year career.

## BIG KRIS

**Kris Jenkins**, the eight-year veteran and three-time Pro Bowler whom the Jets acquired from CAR via trade, 2/29/08, has played as advertised. In two games, the nose tackle has seven tackles, a team-leading four tackles-for-loss and a sack of NE's **Matt Cassel**. Jenkins play in the middle has been a big part of why the Jets stand fifth in the NFL in rushing yards per attempt (3.1) and sixth in rushing defense. Jenkins now has 21.5 sacks in his NFL career.

## CHARTING SHAUN ELLIS

**Shaun Ellis** is the longest-tenured player in the Jets organization. Ellis has played in 126 regular season games in nine seasons, fourth-most among Jets defensive linemen. He now trails **Mark Gastineau** (137 games) for third place. Ellis' sack of fellow 2000 draftee **Chad Pennington** in the opener at MIA gives him 54 1/2 career sacks, fourth in franchise history. Next on the list is **Gerry Philbin** (1964-72), whose 64 1/2 sacks rank third.

## YOUTHFUL CORNERS

The Jets are starting a second-year player and a rookie at cornerback. Rookie **Dwight Lowery**'s start at cornerback at MIA, 9/7, marked the second straight season the Jets have had a rookie start at corner on opening day. **Darrelle Revis** made his first start at corner vs. NE, 9/9/07.

Lowery, in his first start, was credited with four tackles and three pass breakups, including two pass breakups in the end zone to end a Dolphins drive at the Jets two-yard line in the beginning of the fourth quarter.

Also in the opener, Revis picked off **Chad Pennington** in the back of the end zone in the final 10 seconds of the game, out-dueling **Ted Ginn Jr.** for the ball to preserve the Jets 20-14 victory. Revis has eight tackles so far this season and two pass breakups.

The young tandem (Revis is 23 years old, Lowery is 22 years old) has yet to allow a touchdown pass to a wide receiver. Next up are the Chargers **Chris Chambers** and **Vincent Jackson**, who have four touchdown receptions between them and together have averaged more than 17.6 yards per catch.

## BARRETT'S RECORD HALF-SACK

Nine-year veteran **David Barrett** recorded a half-sack of **Matt Cassel** vs. NE, 9/14, sharing the credit with **Calvin Pace**. For Barrett, it was his first appearance in the sack column in his 122 NFL games. *According to Elias, no player has gone further in his career to record his first sack credit since sacks became an official statistic in 1982.*

## RHODES TO SUCCESS

Fourth-year veteran **Kerry Rhodes** has started every game in his career, and has paid dividends from the safety spot. In two games, Rhodes is second on the team with three tackles for loss in his 10 tackles, plus a pass breakup in the first two games. He came out of the gate with six tackles and a pass breakup at MIA, 9/7.

Over the past two seasons, he led all NFL defensive backs with seven sacks and, in that same time period, he led the Jets in take-aways (interceptions + fumbles forced) with 11.

## ABOUT DAVID HARRIS

When he was called upon in 2007 to step in for an injured **Jonathan Vilma** at CIN, 10/28/07, second-year linebacker **David Harris** did not miss a beat. As a rookie, he logged 116 tackles, including 101 in the last nine games. He also registered five sacks, to share the team lead with **Shaun Ellis**. Harris leads the team in 2008 with 19 tackles. He started 2008 with an 11-tackle performance at MIA, 9/7 and then tied for the lead vs. NE, 9/14, with **Eric Barton**, as each registered eight tackles. The Jets rank eighth in the NFL in total defense.

## SMART BARTON

Ten-year veteran **Eric Barton**, who is third on the team with 11 tackles this season, has been credited by Coach Mangini for helping with the development of **David Harris** in 2007, and for the ability to recognize formations and read plays. After **Jonathan Vilma** was injured last season, Barton switched inside linebacker positions to enable Harris to step in to the other ILB slot. While Harris took over relaying the signals from the sidelines, it was Barton who helped him make reads and calls. Barton had a solid year on the field as well, registering 98 tackles, two sacks and an interception, including a rare sack and interception on the same series vs. WAS, 11/4/07.

He led the team with a career-high 20 tackles vs. WAS, 11/4. Harris posted 11 tackles and his second sack of the season in the Jets 19-16 overtime win vs. PIT, 11/18. At DAL, 11/22, Harris registered six tackles.

#### NFL Defensive Player of the Week (Week 11): DE Shaun Ellis

After the Jets lost Pro Bowler Justin Miller for the season, the team turned to second-year running back Leon Washington, who was named the team's Most Valuable Player. His 2007 accomplishments:

- Washington returned a Jets-record three kickoffs for touchdowns – a 98-yard kickoff return for a touchdown vs. MIA, 9/23; a 98-yarder at NYG, 10/7 and an 86-yard return on the opening kickoff vs. WAS, 11/4. After 41 years, the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center in Florham Park, N.J. is the new home of the New York Jets. The team completed its move from Hofstra University and Weeb Ewbank Hall, 9/2/08.

Located at One Jets Drive, this 224,000 square-foot complex sitting on a majestic 27-acre campus provides players, coaches and staff with a state-of-the-art learning, practice and working environment. The facility is a short drive to the Meadowlands and to Newark Liberty International Airport. The complex has five full-length fields, three natural grass fields, one Sportex (Momentum 51) synthetic turf field outdoors and one Sportex (Momentum 51) synthetic turf field in the Field House. The goalposts on two of the natural grass fields can be re-positioned and the fields re-lined in order to get maximum use out of the grass. Each field also has a permanent scoreboard.

Inside the complex, players use a new 5,500-square-foot locker room, a weight room that is approximately 11,000 square feet, 11 classrooms and two individual study rooms, with each lo-

cation just steps from the practice fields, as the facilities are strategically located in between the indoor facility and the outdoor fields. Sixty large-screen TV monitors throughout the building support all the Jets coaching video functions as well as the club's business interests. The "Players Gallery," consisting of giant murals of Jets fans from past games spanning the corridor that runs the length of the building, will remind everyone in the organization of the tremendous support the Jets receive from their faithful.

The Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, serving as the home base for the entire Jets organization, is equipped with sleekly-designed workstations and state-of-the-art technology to create an efficient

and friendly work environment. A large terrace, which overlooks the practice fields, is an excellent business entertainment area for both the team and its corporate partners. The Atlantic Health Jets Training Center provides the organization with a new competitive advantage and a new community to call home.

## THE LAST MOVE - 1968

The last time the Jets changed training camp and headquarter locations occurred before the 1968 season, when the organization moved from Peekskill Military Academy to Hofstra University.

Here's how *The New York Times* reported the New York Jets last change of venue, 3/20/68:

"The Jets will find a considerable improvement in their living quarters at Hofstra. Instead of being housed in a two-story wooden house, they will reside in one of six modern dormitories Hofstra has constructed in the last two years.

"Our dormitories are all air-conditioned and the Jets will have telephones in their rooms," said Howdy Myers, the Hofstra athletic director and football coach. "We have three football fields, two of them fully marked. Our stadium seats 8,000 should the Jets decide to charge admission for certain scrimmage games.'"

After getting used to their new surroundings, the 1968 Jets went 11-3 in the regular season, capturing the AFL Eastern Division. That team, led by Hall of Famers Joe Namath and Don Maynard, AFL All-Stars Al Atkinson, Verlon Biggs, Emerson Boozer, John Elliott, Dave Herman, Winston Hill, Gerry Philbin, George Sauer and Jim Turner, as well as Super Bowl heroes Matt Snell and Randy Beverly, went on to defeat the Raiders in the AFL Championship game, 27-23 at Shea Stadium, 12/29/68. The Jets then wrapped up the World Championship at the Orange Bowl with a 16-7 win over the Baltimore Colts in Super Bowl III, 1/12/69.

- **Brett Favre**, in his first appearance in a Jets uniform, engineered the Jets only touchdown on a six-play, 46-yard drive in the first quarter, capping it off with a four-yard pass to rookie

tight end **Dustin Keller**. Favre finished the night five-of-six passing for 48 yards and a touchdown.

- Linebacker **Cody Spencer** produced five tackles, including two quarterback sacks. Rookie defensive end **Bryan Mattison** also recorded a sack in the game.
- Safety **James Ihedigbo** had the Jets one interception against Washington, stepping in front of a Derek Devine pass at the Jets one-yard line to end a Redskins scoring chance.
- Veteran running back **Jesse Chatman**, making his Jets debut, carried 11 times for 45 yards to lead the Jets.

### Game P1

**Jets 24, Browns 20**  
**(8/7 - Cleveland Browns Stadium)**

- Fourth-round pick **Dwight Lowery** returned a punt 62 yards in the fourth quarter for the deciding score. The rookie defensive back also led the Jets with seven tackles and picked off **Ken Dorsey** in the end zone late in the fourth quarter, returning it 15 yards to help cement the Jets victory.
- Quarterback **Brett Ratliff** hit receiver **David Clowney** with a 71-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter on his first NFL play from scrimmage, setting the pace for his 145.8 passer rating (14-of-20, 252 yards and two touchdowns). Ratliff was in camp with the Jets in 2007, but did not take a snap in the pre-season. He spent all of 2007 on the practice squad. Friday evening (8/8/08), Ratliff celebrated with his wife, Shailey, his first NFL action, his 23rd birthday and the birth of their first daughter, **Ellenor Shai**, at 9:04 p.m.
- Clowney, who was signed by the Jets off the Green Bay practice squad last season but did not see action for the Jets in 2007, registered four catches for 163 yards, including two touchdown catches (71, 70) from Ratliff.

## STREAK EXTENDS TO 12 YEARS

The Jets have not had a losing preseason since 1996 (1-3), the year prior to both Mike Tannenbaum's arrival and Eric Mangini's first stint with the team. Since that time, the Jets have produced nine winning preseasons and three preseasons with a .500 mark. Coach Mangini is 8-4 in his coaching career in the preseason.

## HEAD COACHES

### **JETS HEAD COACH ERIC MANGINI**

(THIRD YEAR AT JETS)  
15-19, 0-1 POSTSEASON

### **CHARGERS HEAD COACH NORV TURNER**

(SECOND YEAR AT CHARGERS/11TH YEAR OVERALL)  
72-91-1 (69-89-1 REGULAR SEASON, 3-2 OVERALL)

After he was named the 14th full-time head coach of the New York Jets on January 17, 2006, Eric Mangini led the Jets to a 10-6 record and a trip to the AFC Wild Card Game. Mangini's Jets used an innovative, multiple-formation offense that emphasized the strengths of his players in getting the most out of his offense. The defense morphed each week depending on the opponent. Mangini's efforts were recognized when he was named AFC Coach of the Year by the Kansas City Committee of 101.

Mangini is in his second stint with the Jets, having previously served on Bill Parcells' staff from 1997-1999, where he worked primarily as the defensive assistant/quality control coach responsible for advance opponent film breakdowns and analysis. Between his stints with the Jets, Mangini spent six seasons with the New England Patriots under head coach Bill Belichick. He was the defensive backs' coach for five years before he was promoted to defensive coordinator for the 2005 season.

Mangini played nose tackle and earned four letters (1989-90, '92-93) at Wesleyan University in Middletown, CT. He began his NFL career as a ballboy with the Cleveland Browns in 1994. He then moved into an intern position in the Browns' public relations department where his efforts were noticed by then-Cleveland head coach Belichick, who offered Mangini a position on his Browns' coaching staff in 1995. When the Browns relocated to Baltimore in 1996, Mangini moved with the franchise and joined Ted Marchibroda's staff.

Mangini was born on January 19, 1971, in Hartford, CT. He hosts a one-day Football Fundamentals mini-camp in Hartford each year giving athletes in grades 8-12 a chance to be taught by some of the NFL's top players and coaches. Proceeds from the camp benefit The Carmine and Frank Mangini (CFM) Foundation.

A veteran coach of 23 NFL seasons, Norv Turner became the 14th head coach in team history on February 19, 2007. In his first season, Turner led the Chargers (11-5) to the AFC West title, the team's third in the last four years. In the postseason, he led the Chargers to the AFC Championship Game. The Chargers' playoff wins over Tennessee and Indianapolis were the team's first since the 1994 season.

A two-time Super Bowl champion as an offensive coordinator with the Dallas Cowboys, this is Turner's second stint with San Diego. He spent the 2001 season as the Bolts' offensive coordinator. A Bay Area native from Martinez, California, Turner was the offensive coordinator for the San Francisco 49ers in 2006 after two seasons as head coach of the Oakland Raiders (2004-05).

Turner has spent 10 seasons as a head coach including seven for the Washington Redskins (1994-2000), before his stint in Oakland and last season with the Chargers. In 1999, he led the Redskins to a division title. He spent 13 seasons as an NFL assistant coach, including seven as an offensive coordinator with the Cowboys (1991-93), Chargers (2001), Dolphins (2002-03), and 49ers (2006).

Turner began his NFL coaching career as an assistant with the Los Angeles Rams in 1985. He coached wide receivers from 1985-86 before adding the responsibility of the team's tight ends from 1987-1990. While with the Rams, he learned the famous Chargers "Air Coryell" offense under offensive coordinator Ernie Zampese. Turner then made his mark during his three seasons in Dallas as the Cowboys won back-to-back Super Bowls (XXVII and XXVIII) following the 1992 and 1993 seasons.

Turner played quarterback at Oregon, spending two seasons behind former Charger and NFL Hall of Fame quarterback Dan Fouts. Turner coached collegiately at Oregon (1975) and Southern California (1976-1984). At USC, he coached defensive backs for one season (1980), and tutored future Hall-of-Famer Ronnie Lott, Dennis Smith and future NFL head coach Jeff Fisher. During his nine-year tenure at USC, the Trojans played in four Rose Bowls, winning all four. One of those was a win over Michigan after the 1978 season that capped a 12-1 season and gave USC the National Championship.

Turner was born in LeJeune, N.C., May 17, 1952. He and his wife, Nancy, have three children - Scott, Stephanie, and Drew.

### Quarterbacks

#### **#9 Erik Ainge**

Fifth-round pick in 2008 from Tennessee where he threw for 8,700 yards and 72 touchdowns in college. He was 10-of-16 for 131 yards and a touchdown in preseason action. He was inactive in the first two games.

#### **#11 Kellen Clemens**

In his third year, he started eight games in 2007 and threw for 1,529 yards and five touchdowns. He was 21-of-38 for 195 yards this preseason. He was listed as the second quarterback and did not play in the first two games.

#### **#4 Brett Favre**

He is 33-of-48 passing for 375 yards, three touchdowns and one interception for a passer rating of 104.1 in the first two games. In defeating MIA, 9/7, he completed 15-of-22 passes for 194 yards and two touchdowns for a rating of 125.9. He hit Jerricho Cotchery for a 56-yard score on the Jets second drive of the game, and on a third-quarter, fourth-and-13 play, he threw as he was hit and Chansi Stuckey came up with a 22-yard touchdown reception. In his 18th NFL season, he is the league's all-time leader in touchdowns passes (445), completions (5,410), attempts (8,806), yards (62,030) and victories as a starter (161) as a quarterback. Since 9/27/92 vs. PIT, he has started 255 consecutive regular season contests (277 including postseason), for a record of 161-94 (.631).

#### **#5 Brett Ratliff**

He was listed as the third quarterback in the first two games after spending the 2007 season on the Jets practice squad. In the preseason opener, he threw for 252 yards on 14-of-20 passing, including scoring passes of 70 and 71 yards to David Clowney. This preseason, he was 32-of-47 for 499 yards and an AFC-high four touchdowns for a conference-best 122.5 passer rating.

### Running Backs

#### **#22 Jesse Chatman**

Signed as an unrestricted free agent, 3/11/08, the five-year veteran rushed for a career-high 515 yards for the Dolphins in 2007. He led the Jets with 51 carries for 164 yards and one touchdown rushing and nine catches for 101 yards receiving in the preseason. He is eligible to rejoin the team after Game 4 vs. Arizona, 9/28.

#### **#20 Thomas Jones**

Leads the Jets with 171 yards rushing on 39 carries (4.4). Posted his fifth 100-yard game as a Jet with 101 yards on 22 carries and scored on a six-yard run in the third quarter, his second rushing touchdown as a Jet. He registered 1,119 yards rushing (10th in the NFL) on 310 carries (fifth in the NFL) in 2007, the third consecutive 1,000-yard season in his eight-year career.

#### **#49 Tony Richardson**

Recorded his first reception as a Jet (for four yards) vs. NE, 9/14. In his 14th year in the NFL, has played in 186 games, blocking for six 1,000 yard rushers (Adrian Peterson – 2007, Chester Taylor – 2006, Larry Johnson – 2005, Priest Holmes – 2001, 02, 03), helping them qualify for five Pro Bowls and earning three Pro Bowl berths himself.

#### **#29 Leon Washington**

Posted a 12.8-yard average in five punt returns at MIA, 9/7. Has totaled 37 yards rushing and 39 yards receiving (on six catches, which tie him for the team lead with Chansi Stuckey) in the first two games. He was the 2007 team MVP as selected by the Jets players, returning three kickoffs for touchdowns, scoring three rushing touchdowns and tying Laveranues Coles for the team lead with six total touchdowns.

### Wide Receivers

#### **#17 David Clowney**

He was inactive for the first two games. He led the AFC in the preseason with 222 yards receiving on eight catches with two touchdowns. Originally signed by the Jets, 10/3/07, released after three games and signed to the practice squad after being drafted by Green Bay in the fifth round in 2007. In the first preseason game at Cleveland, he caught four passes for an NFL preseason-high 163 yards and two touchdowns. The scoring plays were for 70 and 71 yards from Brett Ratliff. He left the game vs. WAS, 7/16, with a shoulder injury.

#### **#87 Laveranues Coles**

Led the Jets with 72 yards receiving on three catches, including a 54-yarder vs. NE, 9/14. He caught Brett Favre's first Jets pass, a five-yarder, his only reception at MIA, 9/7. In his ninth year in the NFL and seventh with the Jets, Coles has 568 career receptions, 67th all-time, 7,250 receiving yards, 96th all-time, and 37 touchdowns. He led the team with six touchdown catches in 2007.

#### **#89 Jerricho Cotchery**

He has four receptions for 100 yards and a touchdown. He led the Jets with three receptions for 80 yards, including a 56-yard touchdown strike from Brett Favre on the Jets second possession of the game at MIA, 9/7. In his fifth year in the NFL, he has caught 82 passes in each of the past two seasons, logging a team-leading 1,130 yards in 2007.

#### **#14 Marcus Henry**

Inactive in the first two games, the sixth-round pick in the 2008 draft finished his career at Kansas with 104 catches for 1,598 yards and 13 touchdowns. He notched seven catches for 94 yards in the preseason.

### **#16 Brad Smith**

He has played in the first two games as a reserve, recording a special teams tackle. A third-year pro, he has played wide receiver, running back and quarterback. He has 386 yards receiving and two touchdowns on 41 receptions and 148 yards rushing on 30 carries. In the preseason, he had two catches for 37 yards and one run for 12 yards on a reverse.

### **#83 Chansi Stuckey**

He has recorded six receptions, tied for the team high with Leon Washington, for 80 yards, and a team-leading two touchdown catches. He caught a two-yard touchdown from Brett Favre vs. NE, 9/14. In his first NFL action, he recorded two receptions for 37 yards and a touchdown. His first NFL reception was a 22-yard touchdown pass from Brett Favre on fourth-and-13 in the second quarter. He became the first Jets player since the AFL/NFL merger in 1970 to record a touchdown in each of his first two NFL games.

### **#15 Wallace Wright**

He has logged seven special teams tackles this season, second on the team. Originally signed as a tryout player in 2006, he started his first career game in the NFL in the 2007 season finale vs. KC. He produced four catches for 35 yards and led the team with four special teams tackles in the preseason.

### **Tight Ends**

#### **#86 Chris Baker**

He has caught two passes for 34 yards, including a 29-yarder on the opening drive of the second half at MIA, 9/7, his longest reception since the 2005 season. The sixth-year pro 126 career receptions and 12 touchdowns.

#### **#85 James Dearth**

The Jets long-snapper since 2001, he has appeared in 114 consecutive regular-season games, tied for seventh on the Jets all-time list with former center John Schmitt (1966-73).

#### **#88 Bubba Franks**

He has caught four passes for 15 yards in 2008. In his ninth season in the NFL, Franks was signed as a free agent in March. The three-time Pro Bowler has 260 career receptions and 32 touchdowns.

#### **#81 Dustin Keller**

The 30th pick in the 2008 draft caught a 19-yard pass vs. NE, 9/14, his first NFL reception. At Purdue, he had 142 receptions and 16 touchdowns. In the preseason, he had eight catches for 85 yards and one touchdown, a four-yard reception from Brett Favre in the first quarter vs. WAS, 8/16. Favre presented him with the ball autographed after the game.

### **Offensive Line**

#### **#66 Alan Faneca**

He has started 155 career games, including the last 98 consecutively. The seven-time Pro Bowl left guard signed with the Jets in March after 10 years with the Steelers.

#### **#60 D'Brickshaw Ferguson**

The fourth-overall pick in 2006 from Virginia, he has started 34 straight regular-season games at left tackle.

#### **#78 Wayne Hunter**

He saw his first action as an extra tight end in a short yardage situation vs. NE, 9/14. Signed to the practice squad, 12/26/07, he appeared in three regular season games for Jacksonville and Seattle in five seasons.

#### **#74 Nick Mangold**

The 29th overall pick in 2006 from Ohio State, he has started 34 straight regular season games at center.

#### **#68 Will Montgomery**

He was active but did not play in the first two games. He signed with the Jets, 9/19/07, as a free agent, and appeared in the final seven games of the season. Originally selected in the seventh round out of Virginia Tech by Carolina in 2006, he started six games for the Panthers at both guard positions.

#### **#65 Brandon Moore**

Originally signed as an undrafted free agent defensive lineman out of Illinois in 2002, he has started the last 59 regular season games at right guard.

#### **#75 Robert Turner**

He was inactive for the first two games. He appeared in the final two games of the 2007 season as a guard after he was signed to the active roster from the practice squad, 12/19/07. He first signed as a free agent, 5/16/07.

#### **#67 Damien Woody**

Started the first two games at right tackle. The 10-year veteran signed, 3/3/08, after four seasons with Detroit. He has played all three offensive line positions (center, guard and tackle), entering the league as a center in 1999 as the 17th overall pick by New England from Boston College.

### **Defensive Line**

#### **#98 Kareem Brown**

He was inactive for the first two games. He made his NFL debut in the 2007 season finale vs. Kansas City after he was claimed off waivers, 11/29/07. Originally drafted by the Patriots in the fourth round of the 2007 draft, he contributed 12 tackles, fourth on the team, and one sack in the preseason.





## OVERVIEW BY POSITION

### **#93 Kenyon Coleman**

In his seventh season in the NFL, he led all Jets defensive linemen with a career-high 90 tackles in 14 starts in 2007. Signed as an unrestricted free agent, 3/6/07, after four seasons with the Cowboys. He has five tackles on the season.

### **#70 Mike DeVito**

He has four tackles this season in a reserve role. He appeared in seven games as a rookie in 2007, logging 11 tackles. He signed as an undrafted free agent, May 2007, after finishing his career at Maine with 112 tackles and 16 sacks.

### **#92 Shaun Ellis**

In his ninth year, Ellis picked up a sack of Chad Pennington at MIA, 9/7 and now has 54.5 in his career, fourth on the Jets all-time list. He has played in 125 games, fourth-most all-time among Jets defensive linemen. He has five tackles this season.

### **#77 Kris Jenkins**

In his eighth year in the NFL and first with the Jets after he was acquired from CAR, 2/29. Jenkins had two tackles and was instrumental in holding the Dolphins to 2.9 yards per carry and 49 yards rushing in the victory, 9/7. He picked up a sack of Matt Cassel and added five tackles vs NE, 9/14.

### **#69 C.J. Mosley**

In his fourth season in the NFL, he was acquired by the Jets from Minnesota in a trade for Brooks Bollinger in 2006. He picked up one tackle in a reserve role at MIA, 9/7.

### **#91 Sione Pouha**

Registered a career-high 39 tackles in 2007, including 17 in the last four games of the season. He was originally drafted in the third round in 2005 after playing at Utah. He has registered five tackles as a reserve this season.

### **Linebackers**

#### **#50 Eric Barton**

In his 10th NFL season and fifth with the Jets, he has 11 tackles this season, tying David Harris for the team lead vs. NE, 9/14. Last season, he logged 98 tackles, two sacks and an interception while mentoring rookie David Harris.

#### **#96 David Bowens**

He signed with the Jets in 2007 after six seasons with Miami. He scored his first career touchdown at NE, 12/16/07, when he blocked a Chris Hanson punt and returned it 26 yards. Bowens recorded a quarterback pressure at MIA, 9/7 and registered a tackle vs. NE, 9/14.

#### **#56 Vernon Gholston**

The 2008 sixth-overall pick from Ohio State, he compiled 22.5 sacks in two seasons. He was named Big Ten Lineman of the Year and a second-team All-America in 2007. He compiled one

quarterback pressure at MIA, 9/7, in his NFL debut.

#### **#52 David Harris**

He leads the team with 19 tackles this season. A 2007 second-rounder out of Michigan, he became a starter midway through his rookie season and led the team with 117 tackles. He tied for the lead in sacks with Shaun Ellis with five while earning All-Rookie honors.

#### **#94 Marques Murrell**

Played in two games with one special teams tackle. He appeared in four games in 2007, recording four special teams tackles. The two-time All-American at Appalachian State is the younger brother of former Jets running back Adrian Murrell.

#### **#97 Calvin Pace**

Recorded a sack and four tackles in his first game as a Jet at MIA, 9/7 and followed that up with six tackles, a pass defended and one-half sack vs. NE, 9/14. He signed as an unrestricted free agent after five seasons in Arizona.

#### **#53 Cody Spencer**

He has posted a team-leading eight special teams tackles in two games this season. In his fifth year in the NFL and third season with the Jets. Last season, he was limited to one game before being placed on the non-football injury list.

#### **#99 Bryan Thomas**

Leads the team with three sacks, and also has seven tackles on the season. He tied his career high with two sacks at MIA, 9/7. In his seventh year with the Jets, he has accumulated 19.5 career sacks.

### **Defensive Backs**

#### **#36 David Barrett**

In his ninth season in the NFL and fifth with the Jets, Barrett picked up his first career half-sack when he shared a sack of Matt Cassel with Calvin Pace vs. NE, 9/14. Barrett has 17 career interceptions, including at least one in each of the last seven seasons.

#### **#31 Ahmad Carroll**

A 2004 first-round pick by Green Bay, he appeared in 35 regular-season games, starting 28 times over three seasons for the Packers and Jaguars, recording 104 tackles, three sacks and three interceptions. He has four special teams tackles, and was Jets Special Team Player of the Week for his three-tackle performance at MIA, 9/7.

#### **#30 Drew Coleman**

A sixth-round pick in 2006, he has played in 28 games in two seasons starting four, recording one sack and one interception. He has posted six tackles this season.



## OVERVIEW BY POSITION

### **#27 Abram Elam**

Appeared in 13 games at strong safety in 2007, starting eight after signing as a free agent, 9/12/07. He also played 15 games for Dallas in 2006. He has recorded two special teams tackles.

### **#34 Dwight Lowery**

He got the start at cornerback, posting four tackles and three pass breakups, including two on one goal-line stand in the fourth quarter at MIA, 9/7. Added two tackles in a start vs. NE, 9/14. A fourth-round pick in 2008, he logged 13 interceptions and one touchdown on defense and another touchdown on a punt return in two seasons at San Jose St. He returned a punt 62 yards for a touchdown in the preseason at Cleveland.

### **#21 Justin Miller**

He was inactive for the first two games. A second-round draft choice in 2005, he has started 12 games at cornerback. He was limited to two games in 2007 before being placed on injured reserve. He has three career kickoff returns for touchdowns, including two in 2006 when he led the NFL (28.3 average) and made the Pro Bowl. In the preseason, he recorded three tackles and one kickoff return for 20 yards.

### **#24 Darrelle Revis**

Recorded a game-saving interception in the end zone with five seconds remaining to preserve the Jets 20-14 victory at MIA, 9/7. Recorded three tackles and a pass breakup vs. NE 9/14, limiting Randy Moss to two receptions for 22 yards. The 14th-overall pick in 2007, he started every game in his rookie season, logging 91 tackles to rank third on the team adding three interceptions and a forced fumble.

### **#25 Kerry Rhodes**

In his fourth year, Rhodes had seven sacks in 2006-07 to lead all NFL defensive backs. He has eight career sacks and 10 interceptions, including a team-leading five in 2007. He has recorded 10 tackles, three for losses, and a pass breakup in two games this season.

### **#33 Eric Smith**

He has recorded 14 tackles on defense, strating at safety, and two on special teams this season. A third-round selection in 2006, he has played in 32 games, starting six, recording two interceptions. He finished second on the team in 2007 with 19 special teams tackles.

### **Specialists**

#### **#1 Mike Nugent**

He was inactive vs. NE, 9/14. At MIA, he hit two extra point attempts and missed his only field goal attempt while nursing an injured thigh. A second-round pick in 2005, he posted a career-high 110 points in 2007, which included 29-of-36 field goals. He posted 18 consecutive made field goals in 2006 and 2007. His career best is a 54-yarder vs. Houston in 2006.

### **#3 Jay Feely**

The eight-year veteran was signed by the Jets, 9/10. He hit one-of-two field goals at NE, 9/14, missing from 31 and connecting from 21. Feely was 21-of-23 in 2007 for MIA.

### **#7 Ben Graham**

He has punted 10 times for a 43.4 average. At MIA, 9/7, kicked off once after an injury to Mike Nugent. He played 12 seasons for the Geelong Football Club, including a League MVP season in 1999, referred to as the "Best and Fairest."

### **No Shame In Losing To Brady-Less Pats**

THERE is no reason to jump off the green-painted bandwagon now, same as there was no reason to crowd on top of it a week ago. The Jets' season didn't end yesterday, and their pursuit of an unlikely AFC East title didn't evaporate, despite the convincing 19-10 beating the Patriots put on them.

It was Brett Favre who delivered a sage analysis befitting his birth certificate when it was all over: "This can be as long or as short as we want to make it," Favre said of the journey that awaits the Jets across the season's final 16 games. "The more you lose, the longer it gets."

Favre could have been even more blunt about the necessary formula if someone would have thought to slip a little sodium pentothal into his Gatorade: That in order to ensure that shorter, more agreeable ride, it would behoove the Jets' coaching brain trust to latch on to the same page as its franchise quarterback.

And quickly.

It has been two weeks now, and what we have seen from the Jets is this: a distinct reluctance to fully embrace the brave new course they have charted for themselves.

For two weeks, it's seemed as if head coach Eric Mangini and offensive coordinator Brian Schottenheimer were still working off the template they had in mind if they'd needed to go into this season with Chad Pennington as their quarterback, or Kellen Clemens.

They offer us - and their team - flashes of buying into Brett, glimpses of it, tastes and teases of it. But we haven't gotten the full menu. That has to change. Look, it may not be the way they're most comfortable coaching. It may involve some risks they aren't necessarily inclined to take. And, yes: If they give Favre the keys to the car, he might get pulled over a time or two.

Or the whole thing may fail spectacularly.

But they have to start understanding what it means to have Favre on the team. They have to let him expand his wings.

We saw yesterday that there can be a downside to all of this, that Favre is still capable of throwing the kinds of interceptions that force even No. 4 himself to say, "I wish I had a better excuse than this, but it was just a bad throw by me." It also led directly to New England's only touchdown of the day.

That's part of having Favre on your side. And here's another part: he's going to make some plays that make you scream "Wow!" involuntarily, like sneezing, a reaction you simply can't help. There's so little sheer, unscripted joy in the NFL these days, and you have a guy on your team who's been responsible for most of it for almost 20 years. You have to utilize him. You have to have better than three running plays in your headset when you have first-and-goal at the 3-yard line, as the Jets did yesterday, trailing 6-0 in the second quarter.

Maybe if you are scared to death of your quarterback, it makes sense.

But if this is the kind of dreck you're going to give Brett Favre on the goal line, then why in the world would you have traded for him in the first place? What's the point in buying the Porsche if you're going to fill it with unleaded regular gasoline? Would you put ketchup on a Luger's porterhouse?

"Sure, I'd like to throw there but I'd like to throw every down and you're not going to win that way," Favre said. "Yes, I'd like to throw. But that doesn't mean I'm going to second-guess Brian's call. If we get in on either first, second or third down then it's a great play."

No, it isn't. Right now, the Jets shouldn't be about proving whether the ends justify the means. This should be about establishing a new philosophy and a fresh attitude, about delivering messages. Last week, this was the message: We're still too timid to take the game into our own hands.

This time, it was worse: We're too scared to take it out of yours.

That has to change, and soon, or else someone might as well see if anyone still have Bubby Brister's number on speed dial.

### **New York Jets fall to Patriots, 19-10, minus Tom Brady**

The Jets were supposed to take out years of frustration on the Patriots Sunday. This was payback time.

Patriots quarterback Tom Brady was out for the season with a knee injury. Then, running back Laurence Maroney's day was over in the second quarter after a shoulder injury. Finally, Jets cornerback Darrelle Revis held Pro Bowl wide receiver Randy Moss to two catches for 22 yards.

But Brett Favre and the Jets couldn't seize the moment, as they fell, 19-10, to substitute quarterback Matt Cassel and the Patriots at Giants Stadium. It was the Patriots' eighth straight win against the Jets at Giants Stadium and their 10th win in the past 11 meetings between the teams.

"Obviously we're disappointed, but I wouldn't look at it as a setback," said Jets right tackle Damien Woody. "A lot was said about Brady being out and, granted, Brady is a great quarterback, but he doesn't play defense, he doesn't play special teams. They have a lot of very good players over there."

"They were pretty simple," said Jets linebacker David Bowens. "They had the quick passes to Wes Welker (seven catches, 72 yards). It was pretty solid and consistent. Cassel did a good job of seeing what (defense) we were in."

"They didn't change much. That's what they do. You would've probably felt more comfortable with Brady taking shots, but Cassel did a heck of a job of managing the game."

The Jets (1-1) had breakdowns in all three phases of the game, and Favre's golden arm and resourcefulness weren't enough to overcome them. In fact, the offense sputtered throughout the game and Favre's first interception as a Jet set up the Patriots' only touchdown midway through the third quarter.

In two games, Favre has led the Jets to just four touchdowns in 19 possessions, and two came on a 56-yard laser to Jericho Cotchery and a fourth-down prayer to wide receiver Chansi Stuckey. Both of those plays came against Miami.

Wide receiver Laveranues Coles did have three catches for 72 yards, including a 54-yarder, but he had two key drops.

"They have a good defense," said Favre, who completed 18 of 26 passes for 181 yards, one touchdown and one interception. "Their front seven guys are as good as anyone in football in their scheme. It didn't run as smoothly as we would have liked. I give the Patriots a lot of credit."

"But we're not that far off. When will we turn the corner? I have no idea."

Fact is, Patriots coach Bill Belichick apparently has Favre's number. In 2006, Favre completed just 5 of 15 passes for 73 yards in a 35-0 loss to the Patriots in Green Bay.

"They're as fundamentally sound as any team you're going to play," said Favre. "We had to play our best football to win and we didn't do that. We had a lot of opportunities, but once

again we didn't make the most of those."

Consider:

New kicker Jay Feely missed a 31-yard field-goal attempt on the Jets' opening possession.

Running back Thomas Jones (17 carries, 70 yards) was stonewalled on a first-and-goal from the 3-yard line and the Jets had to settle for a field goal.

The Jets had key plays of 41 yards and 15 yards called back in the third quarter because of penalties.

The Patriots started five drives inside Jets territory that led to 13 points.

Jets linebacker Calvin Pace was called for a roughing-the-passer penalty that led to a field goal that pretty much sealed the victory with 5:18 left.

Favre was dumped for a 20-yard sack as the Jets attempted a comeback with five minutes remaining and trailing by nine points.

"It was a very disappointing loss," said coach Eric Mangini.

"We had some excellent opportunities throughout the course of the game to make a lot of plays and do a lot of very positive things. We weren't able to execute on those opportunities consistently. I take nothing away from New England. They're a good football team."

Sammy Morris' 1-yard plunge gave the Patriots a 13-3 lead with 6:20 remaining in the third quarter. The play came after an interception by safety Brandon Meriweather on a pass intended for tight end Chris Baker that gave the Patriots the ball at the Jets' 31-yard line.

"I just underthrew him," Favre said of Baker. "I saw the guy (Meriweather). Maybe I got greedy. I could've dumped it in the flat. I think if I made the throw I wanted to, there's no guarantee it would have been caught, but it would've been a much better opportunity."

The Jets climbed to within 16-10 with 10:18 to play on a 2-yard touchdown pass from Favre to Stuckey. It was the Jets' best drive of the game -- a 10-play, 83-yard march.

But the Patriots quickly answered on their ensuing possession. Cassel came out throwing and led the Patriots to a 27-yard field goal by Stephen Gostkowski that gave them a 19-10 edge with 5:18 remaining.

### **Names change, but results stay the same for Jets**

EAST RUTHERFORD, N.J. - It was a little after 7:30 p.m. last night, and the big white Ryder trucks that carry helmets and shoulder pads and video equipment were idling on the ground level of the Meadowlands. On one side of the trucks was a crowd of cameras and bright spotlights with a smiling young Patriots quarterback in the middle of it all. On the other side was a quiet Jets locker room, athletic tape strewn everywhere and a steady stream of all-too-familiar sound bites being offered in somber voices.

It wasn't supposed to be this way again, wasn't supposed to feel this way again. It was supposed to be different this time, not like all the times before when the Jets looked like the little brother trying to stand up to the mighty Pats. It was supposed to be a new beginning.

Instead it was this: Patriots 19, Jets 10. Same scenes we've seen before. Same old story.

The Jets spent all week talking about how Tom Brady's season-ending injury in Week 1 wasn't that devastating to the Patriots, about how Brady only played one position and how the Patriots were still a great team, even with the best player in the league on crutches now.

They said the same things afterward, too, but it sounded hollow. Even though Brady "doesn't cover on kickoffs, doesn't cover on passes," as Brett Favre said, that doesn't mean his presence shouldn't change the tenor of a game (and a season).

On a week-to-week basis, the Patriots aren't going to score as many points with backup Matt Cassel as they did with Brady. They just aren't. They're going to struggle to come back from late deficits and they're going to use a more conservative passing game, much like they did yesterday.

Yet the Jets didn't take advantage of that, didn't take advantage of their moves into the Patriots' end of the field. Brady wasn't literally keeping them out of the end zone, but his absence magnified the Jets' failures to convert their chances.

"We left plays on the field," offensive lineman Alan Faneca said.

"We had the opportunities," Favre said.

"We have to grade ourselves hard," receiver Jerricho Cotchery said. Cotchery is, of course, right, and in a league where there really are only two grades - A's for wins and F's for losses - the Jets take another "F" against the Patriots, against a team they haven't beaten at home in eight years. Haven't beaten at all since 2006.

"I've been playing these guys for a long time now," Sean Ellis said. "Always it's a hard-fought game, and they always come out on top to win."

This was the year that changed. Or at least it was supposed to be. The Jets had Favre, the Patriots didn't have Brady and

suddenly the AFC East was supposed to be wide-open, right there for the taking. A win last night was more than just a win; it was a statement, or as much as one as you can make in Week 2, a jolt for the Jets and a shot to the confidence of Cassel, who was making his first start in any meaningful game since high school.

The Jets couldn't deliver. They had 12 men in the huddle on the second play of the game (costing them a 5-yard penalty) and it was emblematic of the offense's day: No rhythm, no sustained dominance and a disconcerting inability to move the ball.

They had moments: A third-down conversion in the first quarter when Favre hit Jerricho Cotchery for 20 yards over the middle; another in the second quarter when Laveranues Coles reached back for a ball just behind him and took it 54 yards; a great run to the shadow of the goal line only moments later, when Leon Washington did a stutter-step that made Patriots safety Rodney Harrison literally fall backwards.

But that series ended disappointingly, with three straight runs up the middle that had fans booing as the Jets kicked a short field goal and reporters questioning coach Eric Mangini's play-calling afterward.

Mangini offered the expected answers about how the Jets were confident in their running game at that point, but even he couldn't deny that settling for three points instead of seven was critical.

Ultimately, that was the Jets' day, and, really, the Jets' history against the Patriots - decent, but not enough. Favre was 18 for 26 for 181 yards and a touchdown, but also threw up a bad interception in the third quarter that led to a New England touchdown; the Jets got decent pressure on Cassel early, but couldn't rattle him enough late; the Jets scored a touchdown to pull within six with 10 minutes remaining, but the defense couldn't get off the field, giving up one more field goal to put the game out of reach.

In the end, there was Favre, like so many Jets quarterbacks before him, crumpling way behind the line of scrimmage after being dragged to the ground by the Patriots' rush; and then there was Cassel, like at least one Patriots quarterback before him, running off the field with a smile and then standing in the middle of those lights in the tunnel, talking to cameras as the Ryder trucks idled beside the loading dock.

It was supposed to be different this time, supposed to be something new. It wasn't. Same old scenes for the Jets. Same old story.

- Is the NFL's most accurate passer among those with at least 6,000 career attempts, his 61.4 career completion percentage placing him ahead of No. 2 Marino (59.4 percent).
- Surpassed Dan Marino's NFL record of 420 touchdown passes against Minnesota (9/30/07).

Posted 105.2 passer rating, completing 22-of-40 passes for a season-high 390 yards (then his third-highest total as a pro) and two touchdowns with no interceptions.

**1998 (GB)** Led the NFL in both passing yards (4,212), completions (347) and passer rating (62.9)...Finished third in the NFC with 31 touchdown passes and led the conference with a 113.0 passer rating on third down... Led the Packers to a come-from-behind, 37-30 victory with a signature performance at CAR (9/27). Despite uncorking an interception deep in Green Bay territory on his first attempt vs. the Panthers, he rebounded to equal his career high (and the team record) with five touchdown passes while throwing for a season-best 388 yards (then the fourth-highest total of his pro career), earning national Miller Lite 'Player of the Week' honors in the process...Led the Packers to a Wild Card playoff appearance, completing 20-of-35 passes for 292 yards, two touchdowns with two interceptions in a loss at SF (1/3).

**1996 (GB)** Named as the starting quarterback for the NFC in the Pro Bowl for the second straight year...In addition to being voted as the NFL's 'Most Valuable Player' by AP for the second year in a row, he earned the same award from the Professional Football Writers of America and PFW...Earned 'Player of the Year' honors from TSN, *Football Digest*, Miller Lite, the Maxwell Club, the Touchdown Club of Columbus and the Victor Awards...Selected as Pro Football 'Performer of the Year' by ESPN's ESPY Awards...Named league 'Offensive Player of the Year' by PFW, *College & Pro Football Newsweekly* and the Newspaper Enterprise Association...Selected NFC 'Player of the Year' by Football News...Also chosen NFC 'Offensive Player of the Year' by *United Press International* and the Kansas City Committee of 101...Tabbed as NFL 'Quarterback of the Year' by the National Quarterback Club and Footaction...Garnered first-team All-Pro honors from AP, *College & Pro Football Newsweekly*, *Football Digest*, PFW/PFWA, TSN, SI and USA Today...Earned 'All-NFC' honors from *Football News* and UPI...Set the NFC record for most touchdowns in a season (39) for the second straight year...Ranked as the third-highest, single-season total in NFL history...Led the NFL in touchdown passes for the second year in a row...Threw for an NFC-best 3,899 yards...tied Joe Namath for the honor of being the third-fastest player in league annals to reach 15,000 yards passing in his 66th game... two touchdown passes in 12 consecutive games, equaling the NFL record held by Johnny Unitas (1959), Don Meredith (1965-66) and Dan Marino (1986-87)...Had the NFL's highest completion percentage inside the red zone (66.2 percent)... At CHI (9/11), completed 21-of-37 passes for 312 yards and three touchdowns, including a team-record 99-yard scoring pass to Robert Brooks early in the second quarter – only the eighth time in NFL history that feat had been accomplished ...At CLE (11/19), he passed for three touchdowns and ran for another, completing 23-of-28 passes for 210 yards for a career-best 82.1 completion percentage....Led the Packers to the NFC Championship Game, with eight touchdown passes and two interceptions on 66-of-102 passing for 805 yards in three games.

**1994 (GB)** Finished second in the NFL with a 90.7 passer rating...Ranked third in the NFC with 3,882 passing yards... Named second-team All-Pro by *Football Digest*...In 30-3 win vs. TB (9/25), earned Miller Lite 'NFL Player of the Week' honors as he completed 30-of-39 passes for 306 yards and three touchdowns, with no interceptions...At DAL (Nov. 24), threw four touchdown passes while completing 27-of-40 passes – without an interception – for 257 yards against the NFL's then-No. 1 rated defense...Ended the season second in the NFL with 33 touchdown passes...Led the Packers to the Divisional playoffs.

**1993 (GB)** Started all 16 games for the first time in his career, one of only seven NFL quarterbacks to do so... Played in the Pro Bowl as a reserve when the Giants' Phil Simms could not take part due to a shoulder problem...First among all NFC passers (second in the NFL) with 318 completions and his 19 touchdowns ranked third in the conference (fifth in the NFL)...His 3,303 passing yards were second in the NFC...Set a Green Bay single-game record with 36 completions at CHI (12/5), breaking the previous record of 35 set by Lynn Dickey in 1980, also threw for a career-high 402 yards vs. Bears – representing the first 300- and 400-yard passing games of his career...Led the Packers to the Divisional playoffs...In the NFC Wild Card playoff at DET (1/8), with the Packers trailing 24-21 in the final minute, he scrambled out of the pocket to his left, found an "unguarded" Sterling Sharpe in the open and unleashed an across-the-body throw from extreme left to extreme right; Sharpe ran under the ball in the end zone with 55 seconds left and the Packers shortly became 28-24 winners. Had thrown two earlier scoring passes to Sharpe (a 12-yarder in the second quarter and a 28-yarder in the third period) while completing 15-of-26 passes for 204 yards overall...Threw two more touchdown passes in a losing effort (27-17) in Divisional playoff at DAL (1/16) – a 2-yarder to Robert Brooks and a 29-yarder to Sharpe...Finished 28-of-45 for 331 yards (one-yard short of Packers' single game playoff record) and two touchdowns.

**1992 (GB)** Traded to the Green Bay Packers from Atlanta for a first-round draft selection...Led the Packers to its second best record in 20 years (9-7)... Named as the third QB for the NFC Pro Bowl squad after finishing fifth among conference passers with an 85.3 overall rating, based on 302 completions in 471 attempts for 3,227 yards and 18 touchdowns with only 13 interceptions... At the time, was the youngest quarterback ever to play in Pro Bowl (since 1971) at 23 years, 3 months, 28 days of age...The 302 completions tied for first in the NFC...Ranked second in the conference with 64.1 completion percentage...Had a string of 111 passes without an interception broken at HOU OILERS (12/13)...Did not play vs. MIN (9/6), but saw action in second-half relief role the next week at TB (9/13), completing eight of 14 passes for 73 yards...Engineered two touchdown drives in last eight minutes of the game to pull out 24-23 victory over CIN (9/20) after relieving injured Don Majkowski in opening quarter. Threw for a season-high 289 yards on 22-of-39 passing...Made first NFL start vs. PIT (9/27) and responded by completing 14-of-19 passes for 210 yards and two touchdowns including a 76-yarder to Sterling Sharpe, with no interceptions.

**1991 (ATL)** Second-round draft selection by the Falcons (33rd overall)...He was the third quarterback selected, behind Dan McGwire and Todd Marinovich and one pick before Browning Nagle... Active for three games during the regular season, he played in two (10/27 vs. LA Rams, 11/10 at WAS), officially attempting four incomplete passes in Redskins contest...After the 2004 season, Elias Sports Bureau changed Favre's official passing attempts for that WAS game; in researching Favre's early career, viewing a tape of the CBS broadcast, Elias determined that Favre actually threw four passes in the game (the RFK Stadium press box had mistakenly credited him with five attempts in hand-written statistics).

- Led his Southern Mississippi team to 29 victories, including two bowl triumphs, during four varsity seasons (1987-90), and climaxed his collegiate career by earning a 'Most Valuable Player' award in the East-West Shrine game featuring the nation's best seniors.
- Set school records for passing yards (8,193), pass attempts (1,234), completions (656), completion percentage (53.0) and touchdowns (55), with only 35 interceptions.
- His production included five 300-yard passing games and five three-touchdown performances, while his 7,695 regular-season passing yards ranked him among the top 30 of all-time NCAA passers.
- His 1.57 interception ratio in 1988 was the lowest among the 50 top-ranked passers in the nation, and his 2.9 interception rate for his four-year career (based on 34 in 1,169 regular-season attempts) also ranks as one of the best in NCAA history.

- MVP of All-American Bowl at conclusion of senior year.
- Became starter at Southern Miss in third game of his freshman season.
- Earned five letters in baseball, leading the team in batting all five seasons and three in football at Hancock North Central High School.
- Played quarterback and strong safety, also serving as punter and placekicker.

- Born in Gulfport, MS ...Grew up in Kiln, MS (pronounced KILL).
- Majored in special education at Southern Miss.
- Married long-time girlfriend Deanna Tynes on July 14, 1996, after a 12-year courtship, the couple has two daughters, Brittany, 19, and Breleigh, 9
- Earned five letters in baseball (he led team in batting all five seasons) and three in football at Hancock North Central High School in Kiln, where his late father, Irvin, was his coach.
- Had his high school jersey (No. 10) retired in April of 1993; school further honored him May 8, 2004, by re-naming its field, 'Brett Favre Field,' and dedicating a new life-sized statue of Favre displayed at the entrance to the stadium.
- Also had the No. 4 jersey he had worn at Southern Mississippi retired in September 1993.
- Inducted into the Southern Miss Sports Hall of Fame in April of 1997 and was named to the Southern Mississippi Football Team of the Century in 2001.
- Father pitched for Southern Mississippi baseball varsity...Older brother, Scott, played quarterback for Mississippi State and younger brother, Jeff, was a free safety on Southern Mississippi football team...Sister, Brandi, is a former 'Miss Teen Mississippi'.
- Grew up idolizing a pair of Southern quarterbacks, the Saints' Archie Manning and the Cowboys' Roger Staubach.
- Established the 'Brett Favre Fourward Foundation' in 1996, its mission to provide aid to disadvantaged or disabled children residing in Mississippi and Wisconsin; in conjunction with his annual golf tournament, celebrity softball game and fundraising dinners, foundation has donated in excess of \$3 million to charities in the two states.
- In 2005 the charity took on a new cause, raising money in support of Hurricane.
- Katrina relief; the efforts raised approximately \$1 million to be used in the state's three Gulf Coast counties: Hancock, Harrison and Jackson.
- In 2005, his wife founded a charity, the Deanna Favre Hope Foundation to benefit uninsured and underinsured breast cancer patients; Deanna underwent successful treatment in 2004 for the disease...“A Night of Faith,” a dinner and concert featuring Grammy-winning artist Faith Hill was held March 12, 2005, in Biloxi, Miss.; the evening raised more than \$400,000 for her foundation, with proceeds used to endow assistance programs at Memorial Hospital in Gulfport, MS, and Forrest General Hospital in Hattiesburg, MS.
