HEADLINES

- The Jets have won two straight and four-of-five to earn a tie for first place in the AFC East with BUF and NE at 5-3.
- **Thomas Jones** is second in the AFC in rushing (601 yards) and the Jets are tied for fourth in yards per carry (4.5).
- **Kris Jenkins** was named to the *Pro Football Weekly* Mid-Season All-Pro Team, as part of a defense that is third in the NFL with 29 sacks and is fourth in the NFL against the run (76.0 yards per game, 3.1 yards per carry). Jenkins has 24 tackles, seven pressures, six tackles-for-loss and three sacks on the season.
- **Darrelle Revis** is tied for the league lead with four interceptions, and recorded his first sack in addition to an interception at BUF, 11/2, vs. **Trent Edwards**.

SIX TD PASSES; PLAYER OF WEEK

Brett Favre, for the first time in his career, threw six touchdown passes (12, 34, 2, 17, 40, 24) vs. ARI, 9/28, tying the Jets franchise record set by **Joe Namath**, 9/24/72.

- Favre finished 24-of-34 passing for 289 yards, with three scoring passes each in the second and fourth quarters.
- His six-touchdown effort was his 20th game with four-or-more, one shy of the NFL record (21, **Dan Marino**).
- He earned Offensive Player of the Week for Week 5, the first Jet since **Chad Pennington** after Week 1 in 2006. This was Favre's 13th Player of the Week honor and first in the AFC.
- Favre was the first Jets quarterback to throw 12 touchdown passes in the first four games of the season and the first Jets QB to throw nine TD passes in two consecutive games.
- Favre is the fifth quarterback since 1976 to throw six touchdown passes without throwing for 300 yards.

Leon Washington became the 50th player to catch a scoring pass from **Brett Favre** with his 18-yard reception vs. KC, 10/26. Favre, who has 15 touchdown passes this season and 457 in his career, has connected with six different Jets for scores.

COTCHERY KEEPS CATCHING

Jerricho Cotchery is no longer a secret weapon. On the opening play of the second possession of the 2008 season, **Brett Favre** hit Cotchery after a play-action fake for a 56-yard touchdown pass. He went over 100 yards, catching nine for 102 yards vs. KC, 10/26. He led the Jets with 85 yards receiving on eight catches vs. CIN, 10/12. Against ARI, 9/28, Cotchery grabbed four passes for 67 yards, including two fourth-quarter touchdowns. In 2008, Cotchery leads the team with 42 receptions for 492 yards (11.7 yards per catch) and has three touchdowns.

FAVRE ADDS WILSON TO LIST

The Jets win at BUF, 11/2, at Ralph Wilson Stadium allowed **Brett Favre** to continue adding to his record-breaking career. The 26-17 victory was Favre's first triumph at Ralph Wilson Stadium in four tries and was the 31st NFL venue in which Favre has quarterbacked a team to victory, which ties **Dan Marino** for the all-time NFL record.

Favre will have two opportunities this season to set the record: The Jets travel to LP Field to play TEN, 11/23, where Favre is 0-1 in one start; and the Jets will play at SEA, 12/21, at Qwest Field, where Favre has also lost in his only start.

T-RICH MORE THAN A BLOCKER

Tony Richardson's first rushing attempt as a Jet, which came at BUF, 11/2, on third-and-one, went for three yards and gave the Jets a key first down with under four minutes to go in the game. T-Rich has blocked for four running backs who have compiled a combined total of six 1,000-yard seasons. Richardson has earned three Pro Bowl berths (2003, 2004, 2007).

LEON WASHINGTON'S IMPACT

SPECIAL TEAMS

Leon Washington is sixth in the NFL with a 27.0 average on kickoff returns and fourth in the NFL at 13.0 on punt returns.

At BUF, 11/2, Washington opened the game with a 40-yard kickoff return, and on the second play from scrimmage, took a screen pass for 40 yards to put the Jets in field goal range.

Against KC, 10/26, Washington's 37-yard punt return with 3:00 remaining set up the game-winning drive. Washington finished the game with 274 all-purpose yards on 13 touches.

Versus CIN, 10/12, Washington's returns helped create field position on four of the five Jets scores, as all five Jets scoring drives started in CIN territory during the 26-14 victory. He averaged 15.4 yards on five punt returns and 32.5 yards on two kickoff returns vs. the Bengals. The Jets overall effectiveness on kickoff returns has spurred the team to first in the NFL in average kickoff drive start (30.8 yard line).

At SD, 9/22, Washington posted a career-high 198 kickoff return yards, including a 94-yard return. Washington led the Jets to a record-breaking 291 kickoff return yards at SD, breaking the franchise mark of 290, set at BUF, 9/8/02, when **Chad Morton** returned two kicks for touchdowns. In breaking the franchise record, **Jerricho Cotchery** contributed with a 54-yard return and **Brad Smith** chipped in a 26-yard return.

At MIA, 9/7, Washington returned five punts for a 12.8-yard average.

Buoyed by **Leon Washington's** 4.9 yards per carry (168 yards on 34 rushes) and **Thomas Jones' 4.5 yards per carry** (601 yards on 134 rushes), the Jets are tied for fourth in the NFL at 4.5 yards per rush.

HEADS-UP PLAY LEADS TO TD

With 3:32 to go in the third quarter at BUF, 11/2, and the Jets holding a 16-10 lead, the Bills' **Rian Lindell** kicked off to **Leon Washington**. As the ball dribbled down the sideline, Washington put one foot out-of-bounds and grabbed the ball. After a few seconds and a quick discussion between two officials, a flag was thrown. By rule, that is a kickoff out-of-bounds and the Jets were awarded the ball on the 40-yard line. Four plays, 60-yards later, **Thomas Jones** scored from seven yards to extend the Jets lead, 23-10.

Coach Mangini on the play: "I'd say my favorite play (at Buffalo) was probably Leon's awareness on the sideline, stepping out of bounds before he fielded the ball ... We've practiced that quite a bit. That's something that Mike (Westhoff) has emphasized since he's been here. Leon actually got that same exact situation, it wasn't this past week, but it was the week before during practice where we had one right on the sideline. He stepped out and fielded the ball. Really an aware play on his part and a substantial change in field position."

FOUR SCORES VS. CHIEFS

In the Jets 28-24 win over KC, 10/26, **Leon Washington's** impact was felt on all four Jets touchdowns as he produced 274 all-purpose yards.

First quarter: He scored on an 18-yard catch-and-run, the first receiving touchdown of his career, to complete the Jets 73-yard drive after the opening kickoff.

Second quarter: On second-and-four, Washington broke quickly through the line and never stopped on his 60-yard touchdown run. It was the longest run by a Jet since **Lamont Jordan's** 61-yard run, at SD, 11/3/02.

Third quarter: On third-and-eight at the KC 10, Washington took a short pass in the left flat and earned the first down at the two-yard line. **Thomas Jones** scored a one-yard touchdown two plays later to complete the 13-play drive.

Fourth quarter: Washington fielded a punt at the Jets 17 and returned it 37 yards, setting **Brett Favre** up at the KC 46 and setting the tone for the winning touchdown pass six plays later.

The Jets rushed for 242 yards on 33 carries (7.3 yards per carry) at OAK, 10/19. About the total:

- Jets best since gaining 275 yards vs. MIA, 11/1/04, and third time in 20 seasons they've surpassed 240 yards.
- The 7.3 yards per carry is the fourth-highest single-game average for the Jets since 1970 and highest for that many rushing attempts in a single game for the Jets since 1970.
- The 242 yards was the sixth-highest total in 2008 through Week 7. The 7.3 avg. was third-best through Week 7.

FOUR UNDER 50 - BEST IN NFL

The Jets have held four opponents under 50 yards rushing this season, twice more than any other defense, and are 5-0 when holding their opponent under 100 yards rushing. The Jets held teams under 50 yards rushing in consecutive games for the first time since 1993 when they contained CIN, 10/12, to 43 yards (21 carries) and ARI, 9/28, to 42 yards (15 carries).

It was the longest scoring drive by time elapsed by the Jets this season.

FIFTY-SIX (56) VS. ARIZONA

Where does the 56-point effort the Jets produced vs. ARI, 9/28, stand in franchise annals?

- It marked the second-most points scored in a single game in franchise history, trailing only the 62 the Jets scored vs. TB, 11/17/85, in a 62-28 victory.
- The 91 combined points (56-35) between the two teams tied for the third-most points in franchise history, only matched when the Titans defeated DEN, 46-45, 11/22/62. The most combined points scored by both teams in a Jets game was 96, 9/21/86, when the Jets defeated MIA, 51-45 in overtime.
- The 34 points scored in the second quarter is a franchise record for points in any quarter. The previous team record for points in a quarter was 30, set vs. MIA, 10/23/00.

JETS SACK PAST NUMBERS

The Jets 29 sacks through eight games is the most by any Jets team in franchise history. The 29 sacks is also among the most for any in-season, eight-game streak for the Jets franchise (records available since 1966). The last time the Jets had 29 sacks in an eight-game span was 9/10-10/29/1995 (Games 2-9). The only time the Jets had more than 29 sacks in an eight-game span was in 1981, during the days of the Sack Exchange 39 sacks from 11/1-12/20/1981 (Games 9-16), en route to franchise-record 66 sacks.

The major difference between 1981 and 2008 is the distribution of sacks. In 1981, **Joe Klecko** posted 20.5 sacks from one defensive end while **Mark Gastineau** posted 20 sacks from the other defensive end. In 2008, 13 different Jets players have posted at least 0.5 sacks, led by **Shaun Ellis** with seven sacks.

FINISHING STRONG

The Jets are 5-0 this season when leading after three quarters. In the last three Jets victories (vs. CIN, vs. KC, at BUF), the defense has allowed a combined total of six points in the second half while outscoring those three opponents, 36-20 in the second half overall. The two touchdowns scored against the Jets in the second halves of those three games were on interceptions returned for touchdowns (vs. KC, at BUF). Defensively, the Jets held CIN scoreless in the second half, and limited KC and BUF to just one field goal each. In the fourth quarter, **Brett Favre** has a passer rating of 98.3, which is second in the AFC and fifth in the NFL. Favre has completed 71.8 percent of his passes (56-of-78) for 522 yards, seven touchdowns and four interceptions.

QUIRKY FIRSTS FOR BARRETT

David Barrett earned the start at safety at SD, 9/22. Barrett, in his ninth season in the NFL, had started 75 games in his career at cornerback before the start at safety. In his fifth season with the Jets, he had started previously for the team in 36 games, all at cornerback. Against SD, Barrett picked up an interception of **Philip Rivers**, the 18th of his career, and returned it 25 yards for his first career touchdown. Barrett's interception marked the eighth consecutive season in which he has recorded a pick, going back to 2001. When Barrett recorded a half-sack of **Matt Cassel** vs. NE, 9/14, it was his first appearance in the sack column in his 122 NFL games. *According to Elias, no player has gone further in his career to record his first sack credit since sacks became an official statistic in 1982.*



GAME NOTES

TJ PRODUCING ON AND OFF

Thomas Jones is currently second in the AFC and ninth in the NFL with 601 yards on 134 carries (4.5 yards per carry). He leads the team with six total touchdowns and five rushing touchdowns. He became the 49th back in NFL history to surpass 7,000 rushing yards and now stands at 7,104 yards.

His music production company, OuttaPocket Entertainment, has taken off with the debut single, "Late Night Creep," from his first recording artist, *Myko*, who sang the National Anthem before the game vs. KC, 10/26.

At BUF, 11/2, Jones accounted for 40 yards on the key fourth-quarter drive that sealed the win. He scored his first three-touchdown performance vs. CIN, 10/12 and then logged his second-highest rushing total of his career, 159 yards (6.6 avg.) at OAK, 10/19. The 100-yard performance is the 24th of his career and second of 2008. Against CIN, he scored on two runs (7, 1) and a two-yard reception. He became the 49th player to catch a touchdown pass from **Brett Favre**. In the season opener at MIA, 9/7, Jones hit for 101 yards and a touchdown.

THREE TDS FOR TJ AND LC

The Jets, in successive games, had a player score three touchdowns, the first time in five years any Jet has scored three touchdowns in a game (**Santana Moss**, vs. NYG, 11/02/03).

Thomas Jones found the end zone three times vs. CIN, 10/12, twice on runs (7, 1) and once on a two-yard reception from Brett Favre. Against ARI, 9/28, **Laveranues Coles** pulled off a natural hat-trick of sorts, catching three touchdown passes from Favre in the second quarter. The last time an NFL team had two different players score at least three touchdowns in successive games was NO in Dec, 2006, with **Reggie Bush** (4 TD, 12/3/06) and **Mike Karney** (3 TD, 12/10/06).

For Jones:

- First career three-touchdown game.
- Eighth time in his career he has had a multiple-touchdown game (six regular season, two postseason).
- First-quarter touchdown reception was the second of his career, both with the Jets (vs. KC, 12/30/07).

For Coles:

- Three touchdown receptions were a career high.
- First Jet to catch three touchdown passes in one quarter since **Mickey Shuler**, 11/17/85, in a 62-28 win vs. TB.
- Seventh time Coles has caught at least two TDs in a game.
- Sixteenth time a Jet has caught at least three touchdown passes in a game. **Santana Moss** last caught three for the Jets, 11/2/03, vs. NYG. The Jets record is four by **Wesley Walker**, 9/21/86, vs. MIA.

COLES 46TH TO 600 CATCHES

In his ninth NFL season, **Laveranues Coles**, once unheralded, is among the elite receivers of this decade. He is second on the team with 40 receptions and 473 yards (11.8 per catch) and five touchdown receptions. A look at Laveranues:

- His 601 career receptions place him 46th all-time. He became the 46th player in NFL history to catch over 600 passes.
- His 7,718 career receiving yards are 81st all-time.
- With his three-touchdown performance (8-105) vs. ARI, 9/28, Coles recorded four scores in the first four games for the second consecutive season, which had not been accomplished by a Jet in one season since **Keyshawn Johnson** in 1998.
- His 105 yards vs. ARI represented the 20th 100-yard receiving game of his career.
- Coles is the sixth player to catch at least 400 passes in a Jets uniform.
- Coles was the 13th wide receiver selected in the 2000 draft (3rd round, 78th overall, Jets).
- Coles was the third wideout taken from Florida State in the 2000 NFL Draft, behind **Peter Warrick** (4th overall, Bengals) and **Ron Dugans** (3rd round, 66th overall, Bengals).
- Was not the first WR with "Cole" in his name drafted in 2000 - WR **Chris Cole** from Texas A&M (3rd round, 70th overall, Broncos) went eight slots ahead of Coles.
- Current Jets CB **Hank Poteat** was drafted by the Steelers in 2000 one slot ahead of Coles at 77th overall.

MAKING MOST OF FIRST CHANSI

Most players remember their first NFL touchdown, but **Chansi Stuckey's** first NFL touchdown on opening day at MIA, 9/7, was just plain memorable. On fourth-and-13 from the MIA 22 in the second quarter and with kicker **Mike Nugent** nursing a thigh injury, the Jets went for it. After the snap, **Brett Favre** avoided one would-be tackler, and as he was hit, he threw the ball in the direction of Stuckey, the second-year WR making his NFL debut. Stuckey made a leaping grab at the goal line for his first career reception and touchdown. Favre: "I tried to throw it to where somebody was and just give someone a chance. I saw him, but I didn't think he had a chance in hell in catching it." Stuckey: "Somehow he maneuvered and was able to get the ball off. It seemed like it was up there forever."

Stuckey became the 46th player to catch a touchdown pass from Favre. Stuckey has caught a touchdown in each of his first three NFL games, the first player to do that since **Andre Davis** and **Donte Stallworth** in 2002. He was the first Jets player since the AFL/NFL merger in 1970 to catch a touchdown pass in his first two games and the first Jets player to score a touchdown in his NFL debut, excluding 1987 replacement games, since safety **Darrol Ray** returned a fumble 75 yards in a season-opening, 17-14 loss to the Colts, 28 years earlier to the day, 9/7/80. The last Jets rookie to score on offense in his NFL debut was tight end **Mickey Shuler**, who caught a one-yard touchdown pass from **Richard Todd** in the Jets 33-20 win over MIA, 9/1/78. Stuckey, with 19 receptions for 225 yards and three touchdowns, is fifth on the team in receptions.

QUICKIES AFTER THE BYE

Eric Mangini's teams are now undefeated (3-0) in the game following the bye week. The Jets also defeated NE, 17-14, 11/12/06 in Foxborough, and PIT, 19-16 in overtime, 11/17/07, at the Meadowlands...The Jets are 3-1 in the Titans throwback uniforms since introducing them during the 2007 season and have won their last three games while wearing those uniforms.



GAME NOTES

BIG JENKS A MIDSEASON ALL-PRO

Kris Jenkins, the eight-year veteran and three-time Pro Bowler whom the Jets acquired from CAR via trade, 2/29/08, has made the trade look good over the first half of the season, as he was named to the *Pro Football Weekly* Midseason All-Pro team. Jenkins' play in the middle has been a big part of why the Jets stand fourth through nine weeks in the NFL in rushing yards per attempt (3.1) and fourth in rushing defense (76.0). In 2008, the nose tackle has 24 tackles, seven pressures, six tackles-for-loss and three sacks. At BUF, 11/2, Jenkins had two sacks of **Trent Edwards**, the fourth time in his career he's registered two sacks in one game and first time since 2003. On the last play of the first quarter, Jenkins pressured Edwards as he threw, the play resulting in **Abram Elam's** first career interception, which Elam returned for 92 yards and a touchdown. He blocked the fourth kick of his career in the first quarter vs. ARI, 9/28, when he plunged through the middle of the line and got a hand on **Neil Rackers'** 37-yard attempt. Jenkins now has 23.5 sacks in his NFL career.

VET LEADERSHIP FROM ELLIS

Shaun Ellis is the longest-tenured player in the Jets organization. Ellis has played in 132 regular season games in nine seasons, fourth-most among Jets defensive linemen, trailing **Mark Gastineau** (137 games) for third place. Ellis leads the team with seven sacks in eight games this season, moving his career total to 60.5 sacks, fourth in franchise history. Next on the list is **Gerry Philbin** (1964-72), whose 64.5 sacks rank third.

BOWENS INSIDE PRESENCE

Ten-year veteran **David Bowens** started his first game as an inside linebacker, filling in for the injured David Harris at BUF, 11/2. He had four tackles, a sack and hit the quarterback twice. Earlier this season, he posted a two-sack game for the second time in his career when he dropped **Kurt Warner** twice vs ARI, 9/28. Both sacks were strip-sacks that led to turnovers, one recovered by Bowens and the other by **Calvin Pace**, that produced 11 points. Bowens' other multi-sack game was vs. OAK, 11/27/05 for MIA, when he sacked **Kerry Collins** twice. On the season, Bowens has 16 tackles, six pressures, 3.5 sacks, one pass defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery on defense and seven special teams tackles.

CONSISTENCY FROM KERRY

Fourth-year veteran **Kerry Rhodes** has started every game in his career at the safety spot. Rhodes is third on the team with 41 tackles, has a team-leading eight tackles-for-loss, two quarterback pressures, one sack and two pass breakups. Against KC, 10/26, Rhodes broke through the line to sack **Tyler Thigpen** for his first of the season and ninth of his career. At BUF, 11/2, Rhodes broke threw the line to stonewall Fred Jackson on a fourth-and-one at the Jets 8 in the second quarter. In the fourth quarter, he came across the field to knock down a pass intended for Lee Evans at the goal line.

REVIS AMONG NFL LEADERS

Darrelle Revis, the second-year cornerback from Pittsburgh, is tied for the NFL lead in interceptions (4). The latest sealed the game as he picked off **Trent Edwards** in the end zone with 1:21 to play. Earlier in the game, he picked up his first career sack, coming from the corner to hit Edwards, knocking the ball loose and recovering the fumble, leading to a Jets field goal. Against ARI, 9/28, he picked off **Kurt Warner** twice, including a 32-yard interception return for his first career touchdown. In the opener, 9/7 at MIA, Revis intercepted **Chad Pennington** in the back of the end zone in the final 10 seconds of the game, out-dueling **Ted Ginn Jr.** for the ball to preserve the Jets 20-14 victory. Revis has 31 tackles and eight pass breakups this season.

ELAM THE PLAYERS' CHOICE

Jets safety **Abram Elam**, starting for the injured **Eric Smith**, picked off a **Trent Edwards** pass and returned it 92 yards for a touchdown at BUF, 11/2, on the final play of the first quarter, outrunning **Marshawn Lynch** to the end zone. Interestingly enough, during the week leading up to the BUF game, the defensive backs were given a quiz by DB coach **Jerome Henderson** that contained the following question: "If we pick the ball off and go 99 yards for a touchdown, who is most likely to do the following.?" One of choices was, "It doesn't matter, he can't run it back that far anyway." **Coach Mangini** explains: "You had to assign a DB for each answer, and every DB put Abe down for that answer. I don't know whether Jerome was just being a prophet there, or just lucky, but they all chose Abe. It wasn't 99, and maybe if it was 99 he wouldn't have gotten there, but 92 he did."

SETTING A NEW PACE

Calvin Pace, who signed with the Jets after five years with ARI, is fifth on the Jets with 36 tackles, including seven tackles-for-loss. Pace also has six quarterback pressures, 3.5 sacks, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and one pass breakup.

ABOUT DAVID HARRIS

As a rookie in 2007, linebacker **David Harris** logged a team-leading 116 tackles, including 101 in the last nine games, after stepping in for an injured **Jonathan Vilma**. He also registered five sacks, to share the team lead with **Shaun Ellis**. Harris started 2008 with an 11-tackle performance at MIA, 9/7, and leads the team in tackles with 52 and added one-half sack. He was inactive for the first time in his career at BUF, 11/2.

EB THE LB

Ten-year veteran **Eric Barton**, who is second on the team with 50 tackles this season, has one sack, three pressures and two passes defended. Barton had a solid year last year while tutoring then-rookie **David Harris**, registering 98 tackles, two sacks and an interception, including a rare sack and interception on the same series vs. WAS, 11/4/07.

DRAFTING TO START

For the second time in the three-year Tannenbaum/Mangini era, the Jets had two first-round selections in the NFL Draft. After selecting LB **Vernon Gholston** at No. 6, they drafted TE **Dustin Keller** at No. 30. Also on the roster is CB **Dwight Lowery** (4th).

SIX WITH JETS TIES NAMED TO 2009 HALL NOMINEE LIST

Joe Klecko, Boomer Esiason and Marvin Powell lead the list of six people with ties to the Jets among the list of 133 players, coaches and contributors who make up the preliminary list of modern-era nominees for election to the Pro Football Hall of Fame's Class of 2009.

From this preliminary list of modern-era nominees, Hall of Fame selectors will choose 25 candidates who will advance as semifinalist nominees. The list of 25 modern-era semifinalists will be announced later next month.

The 25 will be reduced by a mail ballot to 15 modern-era finalists.

The final list of nominees that will be considered for election will consist of the 15 modern-era finalists and the two previously announced senior nominees, **Bob Hayes** and **Claude Humphrey**. Hayes and Humphrey were selected this past August by the Hall of Fame's Senior Selection Committee.

JOE KLECKO

Played 11 seasons with the Jets (1977-1987) before finishing his career with the Colts (1988)...The first player in NFL history to make the Pro Bowl at three different positions: DE (1981), DT (1983-84), NT (1985)...Was a consensus All-Pro and *Sports Illustrated's* Player of the Year as he led the NFL in 1981 with 20.5 sacks and recorded 136 quarterback pressures...Was a member of the "New York Sack Exchange," the Jets defensive line that featured **Marty Lyons, Abdul Salaam** and **Mark Gastineau** and peaked with 66 sacks in 1981.

MARVIN POWELL

Played nine seasons with the Jets (1977-85) before finishing his career with the Buccaneers (1986-87)...Was an All-Rookie selection in 1977 and was elected to the Pro Bowl for five consecutive years (1979-83)...Is a past president of the NFLPA.

BOOMER ESIASON

Played three seasons with the Jets (1993-95) in a career that spanned 14 seasons with the Bengals (1984-92, '97) and Cardinals (1996)...Threw for 37,920 career yards and 247 touchdowns...Led the Bengals to Super Bowl XXIII...Was named to four Pro Bowls (1986, '88, '89, '93) and was the NFL MVP in 1988...Threw for 522 yards in a overtime win for Arizona against Washington in 1996...In his Pro Bowl season with the Jets in 1993, he threw for 3,421 yards and 16 touchdowns.

NICK LOWERY

Played the final three seasons of his 18-year career with the Jets (1994-96), hitting 54-of-68 field goals (79.4 percent) and 76-of-78 extra points...Also played with the Patriots (1978) and the Chiefs (1980-93)...Made the Pro Bowl twice (1990, '92), led the league in field goal percentage three times and in points scored once, with 139 points for the Chiefs in 1990.

CHUCK KNOX

A head coach with the Rams (1973-77, '92-94), Bills (1978-82) and Seahawks (1983-91), began his NFL coaching career with **Weeb Ewbank** at the Jets in 1963...He coached the offensive line for four seasons before moving on to the Lions, where he coached for six seasons before he was hired as head coach by the Rams...Knox had a career record of 193-158-1 in the NFL.

RON WOLF

Was with the Jets briefly from June 1990 – Nov. 1991, before he was named the general manager of the Packers...He retired from the Packers in 2001...Wolf started his career with the Raiders (1963-75) and was the VP of Operations for the Buccaneers (1975-78), before rejoining the Raiders (1978-90) in personnel...During his tenure in Green Bay, the Packers had the second-best record in the NFL (92-52), went to the Playoffs six times and won one Super Bowl...Named Executive of the Year in 1992.

The facility is a short drive to the Meadowlands and to Newark Liberty International Airport. The complex has five full-length fields, three natural grass fields, one Sportex (Momentum 51) synthetic turf field outdoors and one Sportex (Momentum 51) synthetic turf field in the Field House. The goalposts on two of the natural grass fields can be re-positioned and the fields re-lined in order to get maximum use out of the grass. Each field also has a permanent scoreboard.

Inside the complex, players use a new 5,500-square-foot locker room, a weight room that is approximately 11,000 square feet, 11 classrooms and two individual study rooms, with each lo-

cation just steps from the practice fields, as the facilities are strategically located in between the indoor facility and the outdoor fields. Sixty large-screen TV monitors throughout the building support all the Jets coaching video functions as well as the club's business interests. The "Players Gallery," consisting of giant murals of Jets fans from past games spanning the corridor that runs the length of the building, will remind everyone in the organization of the tremendous support the Jets receive from their faithful.

The Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, serving as the home base for the entire Jets organization, is equipped with sleekly-designed workstations and state-of-the-art technology to create an efficient and friendly work environment. A large terrace, which overlooks the practice fields, is an excellent business entertainment area for both the team and its corporate partners. The Atlantic Health Jets Training Center provides the organization with a new competitive advantage and a new community to call home.

THE LAST MOVE - 1968

The last time the Jets changed training camp and headquarter locations occurred before the 1968 season, when the organization moved from Peekskill Military Academy to Hofstra University.

Here's how *The New York Times* reported the New York Jets last change of venue, 3/20/68:

"The Jets will find a considerable improvement in their living quarters at Hofstra. Instead of being housed in a two-story wooden house, they will reside in one of six modern dormitories Hofstra has constructed in the last two years.

"Our dormitories are all air-conditioned and the Jets will have telephones in their rooms," said Howdy Myers, the Hofstra athletic director and football coach. "We have three football fields, two of them fully marked. Our stadium seats 8,000 should the Jets decide to charge admission for certain scrimmage games.'"

After getting used to their new surroundings, the 1968 Jets went 11-3 in the regular season, capturing the AFL Eastern Division. That team, led by Hall of Famers Joe Namath and Don Maynard, AFL All-Stars Al Atkinson, Verlon Biggs, Emerson Boozer, John Elliott, Dave Herman, Winston Hill, Gerry Philbin, George Sauer and Jim Turner, as well as Super Bowl heroes Matt Snell and Randy Beverly, went on to defeat the Raiders in the AFL Championship game, 27-23 at Shea Stadium, 12/29/68. The Jets then wrapped up the World Championship at the Orange Bowl with a 16-7 win over the Baltimore Colts in Super Bowl III, 1/12/69.

HEAD COACHES

JETS HEAD COACH ERIC MANGINI

(THIRD YEAR AT JETS)
19-21 REGULAR SEASON, 0-1 POSTSEASON

After he was named the 14th full-time head coach of the New York Jets on January 17, 2006, Eric Mangini led the Jets to a 10-6 record and a trip to the AFC Wild Card Game. Mangini's Jets used an innovative, multiple-formation offense that emphasized the strengths of his players in getting the most out of his offense. The defense morphed each week depending on the opponent. Mangini's efforts were recognized when he was named AFC Coach of the Year by the Kansas City Committee of 101.

Mangini is in his second stint with the Jets, having previously served on Bill Parcells' staff from 1997-1999, where he worked primarily as the defensive assistant/quality control coach responsible for advance opponent film breakdowns and analysis. Between his stints with the Jets, Mangini spent six seasons with the New England Patriots under head coach Bill Belichick. He was the defensive backs' coach for five years before he was promoted to defensive coordinator for the 2005 season.

Mangini played nose tackle and earned four letters (1989-90, '92-93) at Wesleyan University in Middletown, CT. He began his NFL career as a ballboy with the Cleveland Browns in 1994. He then moved into an intern position in the Browns' public relations department where his efforts were noticed by then-Cleveland head coach Belichick, who offered Mangini a position on his Browns' coaching staff in 1995. When the Browns relocated to Baltimore in 1996, Mangini moved with the franchise and joined Ted Marchibroda's staff.

Mangini was born on January 19, 1971, in Hartford, CT. He hosts a one-day Football Fundamentals mini-camp in Hartford each year giving athletes in grades 8-12 a chance to be taught by some of the NFL's top players and coaches. Proceeds from the camp benefit The Carmine and Frank Mangini (CFM) Foundation.

Mangini and his wife, Julie, have three sons, Jake, Luke and Zack.

RAMS INTERIM HEAD COACH JIM HASLETT

(FIRST YEAR AT RAMS/SEVENTH YEAR OVERALL)
47-53 REGULAR SEASON, 1-1 POSTSEASON

Jim Haslett began the 2008 season as the Rams' defensive coordinator and was appointed head coach on Sept. 29, 2008, succeeding Scott Linehan.

Under Haslett's guidance as defensive coordinator, the Rams made dramatic improvements in the running game. In 2007, the rushing defense ranked 20th in the NFL (115.3 yards per game), jumping 11 spots after finishing 2006 ranked 31st in the league. The Rams defense did not allow a 100-yard rusher until Week 16 of the season. The 14-game stretch marked the longest stretch that the Rams have not allowed a player to rush for 100 yards in a game since the end of 2000 in to the 2002 season, when the Rams went 21 straight games without allowing a 100-yard rusher. The Rams also nabbed 18 interceptions, the most since 2003.

Haslett guided the Saints to the NFC West championship and their first playoff victory, 31-27 over the Rams, after the 2000 season, resulting in his winning NFL Coach-of-the-Year honors.

In 2003, Haslett helped the Saints weather a 1-4 start to win seven of the team's final 11 games – with three of the four losses coming by a touchdown or less. Haslett held the team together during a difficult beginning and helped keep the Saints in playoff contention until the 16th week of the season.

Haslett made his NFL coaching debut, tutoring linebackers for the Los Angeles Raiders in 1993. Jim was defensive coordinator for the World League of American Football's Sacramento Surge from 1991-92. The Surge won the WLAF Championship in 1992. Haslett began his coaching career in 1988 at the University of Buffalo. He was defensive coordinator in 1989-90.

After being drafted in the second round (51st overall) by the Buffalo Bills in 1979, Haslett was voted the *Associated Press* NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year. He played eight seasons for the Bills, earning All-Pro honors in 1981, and finished his playing career in 1987 with the New York Jets.

Haslett played defensive end at Indiana University of Pennsylvania, where he was a four-time All-America selection after enrolling in the school and joining the football team as a walk-on. Haslett set school records with 20 sacks and five fumble recoveries in one season. As a senior, Haslett took over as punter and averaged 41.5 yards. His career was recognized with induction into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2001.

Haslett is a native of Pittsburgh, PA, and is married to Beth with two daughters, Kelsey and Elizabeth, and a son, Chase. They live in Clayton, MO.

OVERVIEW BY POSITION

Quarterbacks

#11 Kellen Clemens

The third-year man has been the second quarterback in the first eight games, seeing action at SD, 9/22, where he was three-for-five passing for 26 yards and an interception. He started eight games in 2007, throwing for 1,529 yards and five scores.

#4 Brett Favre

He is 180-of-263 passing for 1,812 yards, 15 touchdowns and 12 interceptions for a passer rating of 87.8 in the first eight games. He threw for a career-high six touchdown passes vs. ARI, 9/28, tying Joe Namath's Jets record in being named AFC Offensive Player of the Week. In defeating MIA, 9/7, he completed 15-of-22 passes for 194 yards and two touchdowns for a rating of 125.9. He hit Jerricho Cotchery for a 56-yard score on the Jets second drive of the game, and on a third-quarter, fourth-and-13 play, he threw as he was hit and Chansi Stuckey came up with a 22-yard touchdown reception. In his 18th NFL season, he is the league's all-time leader in touchdown passes (457), completions (5,557), attempts (9,021), yards (63,467) and victories as a starting quarterback (165). Since 9/27/92 vs. PIT, he has started 261 consecutive regular season contests (283 including postseason), for a record of 165-96 (.632).

#5 Brett Ratliff

He was listed as the third quarterback in the first eight games. Spent 2007 on the Jets practice squad. In the preseason opener, he threw for 252 yards on 14-of-20 passing, including scoring passes of 70 and 71 yards to David Clowney. This preseason, he was 32-of-47 for 499 yards and an AFC-high four touchdowns for a conference-best 122.5 passer rating.

Running Backs

#20 Thomas Jones

He is the 49th running back to surpass 7,000 career rushing yards (7,104). Has logged 601 yards rushing this season and six touchdowns, five on the ground. Gained 159 yards on 24 carries at OAK, 10/19. Scored a career-high three touchdowns vs. CIN, two rushing (7, 1) and one receiving (two yards). Opened the season at MIA, 9/7, with 101 yards on 22 carries and scored on a six-yard run.

#26 Marcus Mason

Mason was signed from the Baltimore Ravens practice squad, 10/29. Was declared inactive at BUF, 11/2. He originally signed with the Washington Redskins as an undrafted free agent, 4/30/07 and signed to the Washington practice squad, 9/12/07. Mason played all five 2008 preseason games for Washington and led the NFL with 317 yards rushing (4.8 yards per carry). He also caught eight passes for 56 yards (7.0 avg.) and one touchdown before he was released by the Redskins, 8/30.

#49 Tony Richardson

Recorded his first carry as a Jet in the fourth quarter at BUF, 11/2, gaining three yards on third-and-one for a key first down

with under four minutes to go. Logged one reception for four yards vs. NE, 9/14. Has started twice this season. In his 14th year in the NFL, has blocked for six 1,000 yard rushers (Adrian Peterson – 2007, Chester Taylor – 2006, Larry Johnson – 2005, Priest Holmes – 2001, 02, 03), earning three Pro Bowl berths.

#29 Leon Washington

Averaging 27.0 yards per kick return and 13.0 per punt return. He has totaled 168 yards rushing (including touchdown runs of 60 and 11 yards). His 24 receptions have netted 195 yards receiving and one touchdown. Has scored three touchdowns this season. Against KC, he scored twice, on a 60-yard run, the longest by a Jet since 2002, and on an 18-yard pass. At OAK, he scored on an 11-yard run. At SD, 9/22, he returned a kick-off 94 yards which led to a touchdown. Totaled a career-high 198 yards on five kickoff returns in that game (39.6 average). Averaged 15.4 yards per punt return vs. CIN, 10/12, and a 12.8-yard average in five punt returns at MIA, 9/7.

Wide Receivers

#17 David Clowney

He has been inactive for the first eight games. He led the AFC in the preseason with 222 yards receiving on eight catches with two touchdowns. Originally signed by the Jets, 10/3/07, released after three games and signed to the practice squad after being drafted by Green Bay in the fifth round in 2007. In the first preseason game at Cleveland, he caught four passes for an NFL preseason-high 163 yards and two touchdowns. The scoring plays were for 70 and 71 yards from Brett Ratliff. He left the game vs. WAS, 7/16, with a shoulder injury.

#87 Laveranues Coles

Second on the team with 40 catches for 473 yards and a team-leading five receiving touchdowns, including the game winner on a 15-yard pass from Brett Favre with one minute to go, vs. KC, 10/26. He posted three second-quarter touchdowns and finished with eight catches for 105 yards vs. ARI, 9/28. Scored his first touchdown of 2008 on a three-yarder from Brett Favre at SD, 9/22, where he had six grabs for 75 yards. Led the Jets with 72 yards receiving on three catches, including a 54-yarder vs. NE, 9/14. He caught Brett Favre's first Jets pass, a five-yarder, his only reception at MIA, 9/7.

#89 Jerricho Cotchery

Leads the team with 42 grabs for 492 yards and three scores. Led the team with nine receptions for 102 yards vs KC, 10/26, the eighth 100-yard receiving effort of his career. Pulled in eight receptions for a team-high 85 yards vs. CIN, 10/12. Recorded four receptions for 67 yards and two touchdowns at ARI, 9/28. His 10 catches (for 76 yards) at SD, 9/22, were a career high. At MIA, 9/7, he led the Jets with three receptions for 80 yards, including a 56-yard touchdown strike from Brett Favre on the Jets second possession of the game.



OVERVIEW BY POSITION

#16 Brad Smith

He started at OAK, 10/19. Has rushed eight times for 93 yards (36-yard run at OAK is the Jets' long this season), caught four passes for 29 yards, zero-for-one passing, recorded two kickoff returns (21.0 average) and logged four special teams tackles for the season. A third-year pro, he has played wide receiver, running back and quarterback.

#83 Chansi Stuckey

He has posted three touchdowns on 19 receptions for 225 yards. He had a touchdown catch in each of his first three games as a pro, the first to do that since Donte Stallworth and Andre Davis in 2002. At SD, 9/22, he hauled in six passes for 42 yards, including a four-yard touchdown from Brett Favre. He caught a two-yard touchdown from Favre vs. NE, 9/14. In his first NFL action, he recorded two receptions for 37 yards and a touchdown. His first NFL reception was a 22-yard touchdown pass from Favre on fourth-and-13 in the second quarter. He became the first Jets player since the AFL/NFL merger in 1970 to record a touchdown in each of his first three NFL games.

#15 Wallace Wright

He has logged a team-leading 16 special teams tackles this season. Originally signed as a tryout player in 2006, he started his first career game in the 2007 season finale vs. KC.

Tight Ends

#86 Chris Baker

He led the Jets with five receptions at OAK, 10/19, and has caught 12 passes for 117 yards, including a 29-yarder on the opening drive of the second half at MIA, 9/7, his longest reception since the 2005 season. The sixth-year pro has 136 career receptions and 12 touchdowns to his credit.

#85 James Dearth

The Jets long-snapper since 2001 has appeared in 120 consecutive games. Has one special teams tackle.

#88 Bubba Franks

Has caught six passes for 47 yards in 2008. He was inactive for the past two contests. His 25-yard reception vs. ARI, 9/28, was his longest since a 27-yarder for GB at HOU, 11/21/04. In his ninth year, the three-time Pro Bowler has 262 receptions and 32 touchdowns. He was credited with a six-yard kickoff return at SD, 9/22, the first of his career.

#81 Dustin Keller

He has 13 catches, two for scores, for 147 yards this season. He caught four passes for 41 yards at SD, 9/22, including his first touchdown, a 13-yarder late in the fourth quarter. Picked up his second touchdown pass, a 24-yarder in the fourth quarter vs. ARI, 9/28. The 30th pick in the 2008 draft caught a 19-yard pass vs. NE, 9/14, his first NFL reception. In the pre-season, he caught a four-yard TD reception from Brett Favre vs. WAS, 8/16. Favre presented him with the ball after the game.

Offensive Line

#66 Alan Faneca

He has started 161 career games, including the last 103 consecutively. The seven-time Pro Bowl left guard signed with the Jets in March after 10 years with the Steelers.

#60 D'Brickshaw Ferguson

The fourth-overall pick in 2006 from Virginia, he has started 40 straight regular-season games at left tackle.

#78 Wayne Hunter

He saw his first action as an extra tight end in a short yardage situation vs. NE, 9/14. Signed to the practice squad, 12/26/07, he appeared in three regular season games for Jacksonville and Seattle in five seasons before joining the Jets.

#74 Nick Mangold

The 29th overall pick in 2006 from Ohio State, he has started 40 straight regular season games at center.

#65 Brandon Moore

Originally signed as an undrafted free agent defensive lineman out of Illinois in 2002. He has started the last 65 regular season games at right guard.

#75 Robert Turner

Has seen action as a tackle-eligible in the last two contests. He was inactive for the first three games and was active but did not play in games 4-6. He appeared in the final two games of the 2007 season after he was signed to the active roster from the practice squad, 12/19/07. He first signed as a free agent, 5/16/07.

#67 Damien Woody

Started the first eight games at right tackle. The 10-year veteran signed, 3/3/08, after four seasons with Detroit. He has played all three offensive line positions (center, guard and tackle), entering the league as a center in 1999 as the 17th overall pick by New England from Boston College.

Defensive Line

#93 Kenyon Coleman

In his seventh season in the NFL, he has 32 tackles, one forced fumble, one pass defensed and one quarterback pressure this season. He led all Jets defensive linemen with a career-high 90 tackles in 14 starts in 2007. Signed as an unrestricted free agent, 3/6/07, after four seasons with the Cowboys.

#70 Mike DeVito

He has 14 tackles this season in a reserve role. He appeared in seven games as a rookie in 2007, logging 11 tackles. He signed as an undrafted free agent, May 2007, after finishing his career at Maine with 112 tackles and 16 sacks.



OVERVIEW BY POSITION

#92 Shaun Ellis

In his ninth year, Ellis has a team-leading seven sacks in eight games and now has 60.5 in his career, fourth on the Jets all-time list. He has played in 132 games, fourth-most all-time among Jets defensive linemen. He also has logged 24 tackles, eight quarterback pressures, five tackles-for-loss and a forced fumble.

#77 Kris Jenkins

In his eighth year in the NFL and first with the Jets. He has 24 tackles, seven pressures three sacks and six tackles-for-loss. He tied his career high with two sacks at BUF, 11/2. In his Jets debut, he had two tackles and was instrumental in holding the Dolphins to 2.9 yards per carry and 49 yards rushing in the victory, 9/7. He picked up his first sack, dropping Matt Cassel and added five tackles vs NE, 9/14. He blocked a Neil Rackers field goal attempt vs. ARI, 9/28.

#69 C.J. Mosley

He has seven tackles, including one tackle-for-loss and 0.5 sacks on the season. In his fourth season, he was acquired by the Jets from MIN in a trade for Brooks Bollinger in 2006.

#91 Sione Pouha

He has registered 15 tackles as a reserve this season. Logged a career-high 39 tackles in 2007, including 17 in the last four games of the season. He originally was drafted in the third round in 2005 after playing at Utah.

Linebackers

#50 Eric Barton

In his 10th NFL season and fifth with the Jets, is second on the team with 50 tackles this season, and has also added three QB pressures, one sack (CIN, 10/12) and two passes defended. Last season, he logged 98 tackles, two sacks and an interception while mentoring rookie David Harris.

#96 David Bowens

Has started once at inside linebacker (at BUF, 11/2). He has 16 tackles, 3.5 sacks, six pressures, one pass defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery on defense and seven tackles on special teams this season. He registered two sacks for the second time in his career vs ARI, 9/28, forcing fumbles on both and recovering one. Both turnovers led to points. At SD, 9/22, he was credited with a seven-yard kickoff return.

#56 Vernon Gholston

He has six special teams tackles and three tackles plus one pressure on defense. Was named Jets Special Teams Player of the Week vs. ARI, 9/28, leading with four tackles. He recovered Jay Feely's onside kick attempt at SD, 9/22.

#52 David Harris

He leads the team with 52 tackles this season and also has a half-sack, a tackle-for-loss, a pressure and a fumble recovery.

Was inactive, 11/2 at BUF, for the first time in his career. The 2007 second-rounder from Michigan became a starter midway through his rookie season and led the team with 117 tackles.

#94 Marques Murrell

Played in four games with five special teams tackles. Was inactive Games 4-7. He appeared in four games in 2007, recording four special teams tackles. The two-time All-American at Appalachian State is the younger brother of former Jets running back Adrian Murrell.

#97 Calvin Pace

Has posted 36 tackles, seven tackles-for-loss, 3.5 sacks, six pressures, one pass defended, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Recorded a sack and four tackles in his first game as a Jet at MIA, 9/7. He signed as an unrestricted free agent after five seasons in Arizona.

#53 Cody Spencer

He has posted 12 special teams tackles and one tackle on defense this season. In his fifth year in the NFL and third season with the Jets. Last season, he was limited to one game before being placed on the non-football injury list.

#99 Bryan Thomas

Second on the team with 4.5 sacks, also has 26 tackles, seven tackles-for-loss, seven pressures and one forced fumble. He tied his career high with two sacks at MIA, 9/7. In his seventh year with the Jets, he has accumulated 22 career sacks.

#57 Jason Trusnik

Was activated off PUP, 11/1, and registered a special teams tackle at BUF, 11/2, in his 2008 debut. He appeared in six games last season as a rookie after being signed to the active roster, 11/17, logging six special teams tackles.

Defensive Backs

#36 David Barrett

He has 12 tackles and three pass breakups on the season. He was inactive vs. KC, 10/26. In his ninth season in the NFL and fifth with the Jets, he earned the start at safety at SD, 9/22. He had started 75 games in his career at cornerback, 36 for the Jets. His interception of Philip Rivers at SD was the 18th of his career, and his 25-yard touchdown return marked his first career touchdown. Barrett's interception also marks the eighth consecutive season in which he has recorded a pick, going back to 2001. Barrett picked up his first career half-sack when he shared a sack of Matt Cassel with Calvin Pace vs. NE, 9/14.

#31 Ahmad Carroll

He has 14 special teams tackles this season, and was the Jets Special Teams Player of the Week for his three-tackle performance at MIA, 9/7. A 2004 first-round pick by GB, he played three seasons for GB and JAC, recording 104 tackles, three sacks and three interceptions.



OVERVIEW BY POSITION

#30 Drew Coleman

He has posted 17 tackles, five passes defended and a sack this season, along with three special teams tackles. He was inactive at OAK, 10/19. A sixth-round pick in 2006, he has recorded two sacks and one interception in his career.

#27 Abram Elam

He has 11 tackles, one tackle-for-loss, an interception and two passes defended this season. In his second start, at BUF, 11/2, he picked off a Trent Edwards pass and returned it 92 yards for a touchdown. In his first start of 2008 at safety vs. CIN, 10/12, he recorded four tackles and one tackle-for-loss. He has also recorded eight special teams tackles. He appeared in 13 games at strong safety in 2007, starting eight after signing as a free agent, 9/12/07. He also played 15 games for Dallas in 2006.

#44 James Ihedigbo

Saw his first NFL action on special teams at BUF, 11/2. Originally signed by the Jets, May 2007, he spent the 2007 season on Injured Reserve. He was a three-year starter at Massachusetts, where he recorded 12.5 sacks and eight interceptions. In the 2008 preseason, he recorded eight tackles, one interception, three passes defended and one fumble recovery.

#34 Dwight Lowery

In eight starts, he has recorded 38 tackles, a team-leading 10 passes defended and two forced fumbles. The lone rookie starter on defense, he posted four tackles and three pass breakups, including two on one goal-line stand in the fourth quarter of his NFL debut at MIA, 9/7. He forced a fumble vs. ARI, 9/28, while leading the team in tackles with nine. A fourth-round pick in 2008, he logged 13 interceptions and one touchdown on defense and another touchdown on a punt return in two seasons at San Jose St. He returned a punt 62 yards for a touchdown in the preseason at Cleveland.

#21 Justin Miller

He was inactive for the first six games before debuting on special teams and defense vs. KC, 10/26. He had two special teams tackles and returned one kick for 22 yards. Also inactive, 11/2, at BUF. A second-round draft choice in 2005, he has started 12 games at cornerback. He was limited to two games in 2007 before he was placed on Injured Reserve. He has three career kickoff returns for touchdowns, including two in 2006 when he led the NFL (28.3 average) and made the Pro Bowl. In the 2008 preseason, he recorded three tackles and one kickoff return for 20 yards.

#24 Darrelle Revis

Has logged 31 tackles and eight passes defended this season. He leads the team with four interceptions, including two on Kurt Warner vs. ARI, 9/28, the first of which was a 32-yard return for his first career touchdown. Has recorded two game-ending interceptions in the end zone: At MIA, 9/7, he picked off Chad Pennington with five seconds remaining to preserve the Jets 20-

14 victory at BUF, 11/2, he picked off Trent Edwards with 1:21 to go to seal the 26-17 victory. Limited Randy Moss to two receptions for 22 yards vs. NE, 9/14, and Lee Evans to four catches for 41 yards at BUF, 11/2.

#25 Kerry Rhodes

He has recorded 41 tackles, third on the team, eight tackles-for-loss (leads team), one sack, two quarterback pressures and two pass breakups in eight starts this season. In his fourth year, Rhodes had seven sacks in 2006-07 to lead all NFL defensive backs. He has nine career sacks and 10 interceptions, including a team-leading five in 2007. Has started 56 consecutive games to begin his NFL career.

#33 Eric Smith

Was inactive at BUF, 11/2. He has started five games at safety, recording 23 tackles on defense and picking up an interception vs. ARI, 9/28. Also has picked up five tackles on special teams. He was on the Reserve/Suspended list for CIN, 10/12. A third-round selection in 2006, he now has three career interceptions. He finished second on the team in 2007 with 19 special teams tackles.

Specialists

#1 Mike Nugent

He has been inactive for the last seven contests. At MIA, he hit two extra-point attempts and missed his only field goal attempt while nursing an injured thigh. A second-round pick in 2005, he posted a career-high 110 points in 2007, which included 29-of-36 field goals. He posted 18 consecutive made field goals 2006-07. His career best is a 54-yarder vs. Houston in 2006.

#3 Jay Feely

The eight-year veteran was signed by the Jets, 9/10. He has hit 12-of-16 field goals and all 18 extra-point attempts for 54 points. Posted 14 points at BUF, 11/2, hitting four-of-five field goals, the seventh time he has hit at least four field goals in a game in his career. Hit a 52-yard field goal in the closing second of the fourth quarter to tie the game at 13 at OAK, 10/19. He executed an onside kick at SD, 9/22, the sixth of his career, which was recovered by Vernon Gholston. Feely hit 21-of-23 field goals in 2007 for MIA.

#6 Reggie Hodges

Averaging 41.6 yards per punt gross/36.2 net on 13 punts, with six inside-the-20. Debuted for the Jets vs. CIN, 10/12, and punted twice, averaging 37.0 yards gross and 32.0 net. His first punt was fair caught at the four-yard line. He was signed by the Jets, 9/17, and was inactive with a thigh injury at SD, 9/22, and vs. ARI, 9/28. Originally drafted by STL in the sixth round of the 2005 NFL draft, he punted in eight games combined in 2005, five for STL and three for PHI. In his career, he has punted 41 times for a 37.4 average (33.0 net), with a long of 55, nine inside-the-20 and two touchbacks.

Jets beat Bills, become a factor in AFC East

ORCHARD PARK - When Brett Favre threw the interception in the fourth quarter, he was momentarily stunned. As Buffalo cornerback Jabari Greer ran it back 42 yards for a touch-down, the wave of roars from the Buffalo crowd picked up through the sunny chill of Ralph Wilson Stadium and made it hard for the quarterback to hear anything distinct.

"We still had the lead, but we didn't have the momentum," Favre said.

Was this the moment the Jets lose their composure, the advantage and any chance of competing in the AFC East? Favre choked back the nerves and got back on the field. He yelled until his voice was as frayed as the denim in a favorite pair of old jeans. The Jets held on to that ball for nearly nine minutes, and a field goal gave them a nine-point lead with 2:12 left in the game.

The drive ate more time off the clock (8:41) than any other the Jets have put together all season, and killed the Bills' chances of getting the two scores they needed. The Jets won 26-17.

"That drive was one of the most important drives for us of the year offensively," said Favre, who went 19 of 28 for 201 yards and one interception. "Not only because it helped win the game, but it was a statement drive."

The simple statement was that the Jets could maintain control of a situation. After two chaotic wins and a loss in the last three weeks against teams with losing records, the 5-3 Jets managed to dictate pace over a team tied for first in their own division. The lead held up thanks to cornerback Darrelle Revis, whose interception on the Bills' final drive wasn't necessarily his best play of the game.

The Bills also are 5-3, but 0-2 in the division after a loss at Miami last week. And the Patriots lost to the Colts last night, creating a three-way tie for first place.

"To get ourselves back in the hunt was very important," Jets wide receiver Laveranues Coles said. "We just have to get ready for next week. We found out about ourselves today."

It was a good time for the Jets to get a little confidence. The next three games feature St. Louis, New England and the undefeated Titans, the only undefeated team in the league.

"Things are starting to come together," said fullback Tony Richardson, who had his first carry of the season, for 3 yards and a first down. "But we've still got a lot of work to do."

The Jets led 13-7 at the half despite Jay Feely's missed 37-yard field goal with 23 seconds left. It was his third attempt of the game, and he had hit the first after an opening drive that included a 40-yard catch by Leon Washington.

The Bills came out and scored in three plays, the last a 9-yard pass from Trent Edwards to Derek Fine with 11:26 left in the first quarter. The second Jets field goal came after the

Jets could not score despite taking possession 6 yards out of the Bills' end zone.

Revis had sacked Edwards and recovered his fumble for the stellar field position. But after Favre fumbled and threw two incomplete passes, Feely hit a 26-yard field goal to close the gap to 7-6.

The Bills held the ball for the next 15 minutes and eight seconds on the game clock, orchestrating 27 plays for 114 yards. But the only score that came during that time frame was when the Jets' Abram Elam picked off an Edwards pass on third-and-15, thrown into double coverage, and ran it back 92 yards for a touchdown on the final play of the first quarter. "Those things happen in a game," Jets linebacker Bryan Thomas said. "... You just have to try and overcome it. It is definitely good when you could give up no points."

The Bills closed to 16-10 with a field goal, but Thomas Jones (69 yards on 12 carries and 38 yards on six catches) scored on a 7-yard run to give the Jets a comfortable 23-10 lead with 1:07 left in the third quarter. It was enough of a spread that even Greer's momentum-stealing interception couldn't take the lead with it as well.

"If you want to do well in this league, you've got to be able to play well in the division," Jets center Nick Mangold said.

Jets defense shuts down bumbling Bills

ORCHARD PARK - It was the Jets' biggest road win in two years, a game that will be remembered for huge defensive plays and a gut-check drive by the offense after a here-we-go-again interception by Brett Favre in the fourth quarter. But maybe, just maybe, the foundation of Sunday's 26-17 victory over the Bills was set on Thursday in a team meeting. When Eric Mangini talked tough.

Facing a potential season-turning game at Ralph Wilson Stadium, the Jets' coach stepped out of character and "let guys know that nobody around here is safe," wide receiver Laveranues Coles said afterward in a loud, almost giddy locker room. "Basically, he said, 'Fill your role or somebody else will step in and fill it if you can't handle it.' "

D LEADS GANG GREEN PAST BILLS

It took a quarter to sink in, but the Jets overcame a sloppy start and delivered their most impressive performance of the season, recording five sacks, forcing three turnovers and grinding out an 8-minute, 41-second drive in crunch time that secured the win and perhaps saved their season.

Don't look now, but the Jets, who reached the halfway point at 5-3, remain a major player in the AFC East.

"What I'm most happy about is that I think this is a lot closer to the complete football that I believe we can play," said Mangini, whose \$118 million team had underachieved through the first seven games.

Big wins haven't been plentiful in the Mangini era ("Way to bring that up," he joked), which made this game so critical. Before upsetting the Bills (5-3), Mangini had won only three of 12 games against winning teams, only one on the road. Maybe that explains his sense of urgency on Thursday, which caught some players by surprise. Others downplayed it. The message got through.

"Believe me, that win feels as good as any win I've ever been a part of," Favre said.

For a change, the Jets played a relatively clean game (only one turnover, no sacks allowed), demonstrating tremendous poise in the crucible of a major momentum shift.

Favre's horrible interception, returned 42 yards for a touchdown by Jabari Greer, made it 23-17 with 10:53 remaining. The house was rocking, and Favre was concerned. Very concerned.

"I'm thinking, 'Boy, this ain't good,'" said Favre, who has knack for throwing touchdowns to the wrong guys. It was his 12th interception, the third returned for a touchdown.

Instead of choking, the Jets responded with the drive of the year - 14 plays and 65 yards, ending with Jay Feely's fourth field goal. It was a display of poise and power. They rushed eight times for 48 yards, including a 23-yarder by Thomas Jones. Favre, admitting he was "nervous as hell," went 5-for-

5. No completion was longer than six yards, but he made two huge third-down throws - a drive emblematic of the fairly conservative game plan.

Afterward, several players called it a team-galvanizing drive, a possible turning point in the season. The big-money offensive line, hardly dominant this season, controlled the line. Until then, the Jets had rushed for only 48 yards, and they matched that total with the game on the line.

"It was a statement drive," said Favre, who produced a late, fourth-quarter scoring drive for the third straight game.

"We rammed it right down the length of the field," tackle Damien Woody said.

"It reminded me of the old Pittsburgh Steeler teams, pounding it and pounding it, getting first downs," linebacker David Bowens said.

The Favre-led offense struggled for much of the day, especially in the red zone. Favre, perhaps haunted by last week's three-pick nightmare, became cautious, completing 19-of-28 for 201 yards. It wasn't pretty - the only TD was a 7-yard run by Jones - but it was good enough because of the way the defense was playing.

After allowing 171 total yards on the first three possessions, the Jets stiffened, yielding only 121 over the final six. Cornerback Darrelle Revis recorded a strip/sack and a game-ending interception, and safety Kerry Rhodes and Kris Jenkins combined to stop Fred Jackson on a fourth-and-1 from the Jets' 8 in the second quarter.

Jenkins was dominant at nose tackle, recording two sacks, spearheading a run defense that allowed only 30 yards and pressuring Trent Edwards into an interception that was returned 92 yards for a touchdown by safety Abram Elam. That gave the Jets a 13-7 lead at the end of the first quarter, and they never trailed again.

"Collectively, I'd say it was our best defensive game of the year," linebacker Calvin Pace said.

Mangini called it "complimentary football," a winning formula that had eluded the erratic Jets. To find it against a division nemesis - the Bills had won the previous three meetings - was huge for the Jets' psyche.

"This is big," Bowens said. "It does a lot of things for us. It gives us confidence, especially against teams with winning records. It turns the focus back to us."

ORCHARD PARK, N.Y. -- Shaun Ellis has experienced heart-break here so many times that he knows the Bills' scoring celebration song by memory.

But Sunday afternoon, the Jets defensive end didn't have that song -- a variation of "Shout" by the Isley Brothers -- ringing in his ears as he walked off the field at Ralph Wilson Stadium.

"It's a little special personally to come up here and get this win and silence their crowd," Ellis said after the Jets' defensive-fueled 26-17 victory against the Bills. "That's the one thing I was proud of. I knew as long as we didn't hear that song, we were doing good."

Suddenly the Jets (5-3), who had lost in four of their previous five trips to Buffalo, are in the AFC East hunt. The win put them in a position to tie for first place with the Bills and Patriots, pending the outcome of Sunday night's New England-Indianapolis game.

In the process the Jets, who have won four of their past five games and had a wild celebration in their locker room, might have found their identity -- short passes by Brett Favre and a stingy defense. Certainly they proved to themselves that they can play with one of the AFC's presumed heavyweights -- on the road.

"This was a big game," said safety Kerry Rhodes. "This is the team we keep saying can show up at any time. Now we have to keep it going. We took the right step."

Said nose tackle Kris Jenkins: "We still have a whole other half of the season we have to worry about. We just can't bask in one victory. This isn't going to guarantee us a playoff spot. If we can keep stringing them together. ... I'm going to enjoy it for a second, everybody is, but we have to keep on working."

Favre, who threw yet another interception that was returned for a touchdown but had success with a steady diet of short-yardage passes, said he thinks the win will be a boost for the Jets.

"It felt great coming into this locker room winning this game together as a team," said Favre, who completed 19 of 28 passes for 201 yards, no touchdowns and the interception.

Favre and the rest of the offense can thank the Jets defense, led by Jenkins and cornerback Darrelle Revis (interception, strip sack and fumble recovery).

The unit allowed a season-low 30 yards rushing and caught a break when Bills running back Marshawn Lynch (nine carries, 16 yards) missed 1½ quarters with nausea. It was the fourth time this season the Jets have held a team to fewer than 50 yards rushing.

The Jets forced three turnovers -- they had just one in their previous three games -- that were turned into 10 points. Most notably, safety Abram Elam picked off Trent Edwards inside the

Jets' 10-yard line and ran 92 yards for a touchdown -- the highlight of a 27-play stretch in which the Bills had the ball but were held scoreless.

And Jenkins, with five tackles, three quarterback hurries and two of the Jets' five sacks, was virtually unblockable.

"It's like trying to block a two-ton semi going downhill," said Bills center Duke Preston of Jenkins.

Jenkins said he had been challenged by coaches Bryan Cox and Dan Quinn.

"They've been really asking me to stop up," he said, "and I tried to do the best that I could to answer the call."

While the Bills were making errors, Favre and the offense did their part to take care of the ball. Even though no one would acknowledge it afterward, Favre was more cautious, turning in his best Chad Pennington impression.

Coach Eric Mangini had asked him during the week to be more judicious with his throws, and Favre repeatedly dumped the ball off to running back Thomas Jones (six catches, 38 yards) and short patterns to his receivers. Only two passes netted more than 20 yards.

"I stepped up in the pocket and it's hard to pass up the little dink in front of you," said Favre, adding that several plays were designed to go downfield but no one was open. "It's something that not only this year but throughout my career I've been willing to do. We tried to play the percentages."

After the Bills closed to within 16-10, the Jets answered with a 7-yard touchdown run by Jones (12 carries, 69 yards) late in the third quarter. With the game seemingly in hand and the Jets needing only to run, Favre tried to connect with Jerricho Cotchery on a sideline pattern.

But Bills cornerback Jabari Greer, shadowing Cotchery, intercepted the pass and raced 42 yards for the score to trim the deficit to 23-17 with 10:53 to play.

"I throw a pick, they score a touchdown, the game isn't over," said Favre, who has thrown eight in the past four games and an NFL career-high 300 in his career.

On the ensuing possession, the Jets iced the game with a 14-play, 65-yard drive that ate up 8:41 and was capped by Feely's 31-yard field goal.

"I was nervous as hell to be honest with you," Favre said of the final drive. "I can say that now. ... I'm not a non-human."

At CHI (9/11), completed 21-of-37 passes for 312 yards and three touchdowns, including a team-record 99-yard scoring pass to Robert Brooks early in the second quarter – only the eighth time in NFL history that feat had been accomplished ...At CLE (11/19), he passed for three touchdowns and ran for another, completing 23-of-28 passes for 210 yards for a career-best 82.1 completion percentage....Led the Packers to the NFC Championship Game, with eight touchdown passes and two interceptions on 66-of-102 passing for 805 yards in three games.

1994 (GB) Finished second in the NFL with a 90.7 passer rating...Ranked third in the NFC with 3,882 passing yards...
