New Findings You Won't Learn from Your Dentist

An exclusive interview with Harold Ravins, D.D.S.

Many vague eye complaints cannot be corrected by traditional methods.

That is because the cause of these problems lies not within the eye, but instead originates with stresses coming from within the mouth and jaw.

Are you a victim of eye dysfunction related to dental problems? Read this interview and find out.

The knowledge contained in the next several pages can be worth thousands of dollars in relief to those with certain eye problems.

SW: What kinds of eye problems can be related to the mouth?

RAVINS: The main category of problems is what I call 'undiagnosed eye pain.' Some of the various symptoms are:

Number one, patients complained that their eyes would change their focusing power. The power of their vision wouldn't be stable.

Two, patients complained that their eyes would be hazy. Many times people would say that this would happen after they would get through eating.

Thirdly, patients would complain of pressure in the back of their eyes or the top of their eyes. Many times, they would also experience a pain sensation. Others complain of simple eye sensitivity, in which their eyes felt irritated by light. Some people complain of spots in their eyes, or floaters.

SW: Why would patients mention their eye problems to you? You are a dentist.

RAVINS: I always have patients write down all their symptoms when they begin treatment. I also have them do this every time they come in. I only noticed these eye

problems when patients began writing them down on their personal case histories. That was about ten years ago.

Patients would comment about their jaws and would also complain about pain in the rest of their face, including their eyes.

SW: What did you do when patients complained of vision problems?

RAVINS: I referred them to an ophthalmologist for eye examinations. The diagnosis would be that there was nothing wrong. The patients had no detectable dysfunction or structural damage.

Even though the patient would experience pressure behind the eye, the eye doctor would check for glaucoma and find nothing wrong. The pressure could be coming from tensions in the bones and muscles in the jaw.

SW: What did you find out when you treated these patients?

RAVINS: Most often, their pain and discomfort disappeared. When we treated these patients for their dental problems, they would tell us that their eye problems also cleared up.

We were using certain types of removable orthopedic dental appliances that generated certain corrective pressures within the mouth. I treat most of my patients who complain about pain with a combination appliances that develop the upper jaw, and relieve the stresses in it.

The patients would tell us that the eye sensations that were annoying them would come right back again when they took the appliance out of their mouths.

A common treatment for pain is a lower splint. I feel tht a combination of dental appliances is far more effective.

SW: How could problems in the mouth and jaw affect the eyes?

RAVINS: There are several ways. First, you have to realize that the bones that form the optical area are closely related to the bones that support the upper and lower jaw. There are a lot of sutures (movable "joints") in the bones that make up the orbit of the eye.

Stress is one part of the mouth is transmitted to the rest of the skull. When you have stress in the sutures that form the bones of the jaw, this stress is transmitted to the sutural area around the eye. This could result in vague eye complaints.

The second way the jaw can affect the eyes is via the nerves. The facial and jaw area is rich with nerves. Stress in the mouth is transmitted to these nerves.

One of the main groups of nerves coming out of the skull is the cranial nerves. The second cranial nerve is called the optic nerve. The third cranial nerve is the ocular motor nerve, which is responsible for the motor function of the eye.

In other words, more than one nerve regulates the eye.

The stress in the bones can place pressure on the blood vessels and nerves that service this region.

When one nerve is overloaded by stress, this will influence the function of other nerves. You can have an overload situation, where a continued dental stress from the mouth overburdens the nerves regulating the eye area.

Undiagnosed infection in the mouth is another possible source of eye problems. When you have inflammation in the upper or lower jaw, the nerves become irritated. This can cause confusion in brain centers that may cause dysfunction in the eye.

Also, when there is infection, the muscles can go into spasm, which in turn can cause a change in nerve activity, and could cause eye symptomatology.

SW: Can traditional orthodontics cause eye problems?

RAVINS: Many techniques used in traditional orthodontics have caused a great deal of oral stress — but I can't really connect this stress directly to eye problems.

SW:How can a person tell if they have an eye problem that is coming from their jaw?

RAVINS: The first thing is to have your eyes checked by an opthamologist, a medical doctor who has been trained in diagnosing and treating eye problems.

Then, if this turns nothing up, I would recommend the person have all their teeth X-rayed for hidden infections. The person should ask for what is called periapical X-rays.

The person should also have their fillings evaluated to make sure there are no faulty dental restorations, which can encourage infection in the mouth.

Then the person can check with a dentist who has experience in treating dental stress, which could affect the eyes. Some dental stress symptoms related to eye problems are difficulty in chewing, pain or other problems in

the temporo-mandibular joint just in front of the ears, clicking in the jaw joint, and chewing on one side of the mouth.

If the person has headaches, and the medical doctor can find no apparent solution, the person should suspect dental stress. It is a 75% chance the headaches are related to dental problems.

SW: How can a person find a dentist qualified to treat dental stress?

SW: My final comment is that such problems cross medical boundaries, but that is not the patient's problem.

A Case History Pain in the Eyes

One woman had pain in her eyes, and her eye doctor wanted to cut one of the nerves in her face. I saw her for a routine dental examination, and I noticed on one of her X-rays that there was a suspicious area in one of her front teeth.

The X-ray showed that she had an old plastic filing in that tooth. I was suspicious that the filing was leaking. I elected to take the plastic filling out. It turned out that the nerve was being irritated from decay in the tooth. You could not detect the decay because of the old filling. We replaced the filing with a temporary medicated dressing, and her eye pain subsided within hours.

<u>Unknown</u> Aspects of Eyesight and Nutrition

An Unpublished Interview with Dr. Paul Eck

In this exclusive interview, Dr. Eck explains major aspects of vision problems that have never been covered before. He gives recommendations that are different from those you will find in typical nutrition books.

He explains why common nutritional recommendations, namely, to give large doses of vitamin C, B-vitamins, and vitamin E, may, for some people, cause increased stress on the eye.

If you are concerned about any vision problems — far-sightedness, near-sightedness, cataracts, macular degeneration, diabetic retinitis, or others, you will want to read this interview.

If you have results with the suggestions contained in this interview, please let us know.

SW: Why don't you start by giving us a general overview?

ECK: You cannot get caught up in single deficiencies when you consider eye problems. I have found that eye problems are related to overall systemic distortions in mineral levels.

The biggest mistake made in nutrition is to consider the eyes apart from the rest of the body. [You have to think of the pattern in the whole body.]

Improvement in visual problems cannot be attained with isolated nutrients that are known to be good for the eyes. Unless you reduce one's overall metabolic stress level, you are treating the eyes on a symptomatic basis.

SW: How does a person's metabolism relate to his susceptibility to eye problems?

ECK: People with a fast rate of metabolism have far more eye problems than people with a slow rate of metabolism.

It is very unusual to see a fast metabolizer who doesn't have some sort of eye problem. He has either got astigmatism, he's got diabetic retinitis, severe myopias, cataracts, glaucoma, diabetic, retinitis, etc.

I see a lot of children with eye problems who have an extremely fast metabolism. They have high levels of sodium and potassium, which represent excessive adrenal gland activity. They also have a low ratio of calcium to magnesium, and they are in a state of relative burnout.

There is no question in my mind that there is a relationship between hyperactivity and eye problems.

SW: What can you tell us about cataracts?

ECK: I used to think that people with cataracts suffered from excessive calcium deposits on the lens of the eye.

I expected to find this condition most often in people with slow metabolisms — who tend to accumulate calcium in their body tissues.

Yet oddly, cataracts are associated most often with fast metabolizers — at least 10 or 12 times as often as in over slow oxidizers. It is odd, but tissue calcium levels tend to be very low in cataract people.

The person with a fast metabolism is losing his calcium from the tissues and from the bone, i.e., he is in a negative calcium balance.

And yet, taking calcium by itself wouldn't necessarily help a person with cataracts. If their copper levels are low, they can't properly utilize the calcium.

Fast oxidizers are notoriously low on copper, which is needed to retain calcium in the tissues. A low copper level (or high copper levels that are not biologically available) cause calcium to be leached out from the tissues.

Such calcium appears as tartar on the teeth, and as rheumatoid arthritis when it deposits into the joints. The eyes become affected when the calcium deposits into the lens of the eye.

SW: Fast oxidizers are also low on zinc. How does this affect their vision?

ECK: Fast oxidizers are high-stress, highly nervous, energetic people. The constant stress they are under often causes them to be chronically low on zinc.²

Zinc is found in higher abundance in the eye than in

any other organ of the body. Therefore, when the zinc levels are down, it is impossible to build-up and maintain the protein structure in the eye.

Zinc affects protein metabolism, especially the protein structuring of the eye. If the eye protein structure is distorted, changes in the focus of the eyes occur. Then the image forms before or behind the retin. The result is near- or far-sightedness.

Stress depletes zinc. The result will be a flare-up in eye problems during periods of stress. The eyes can become sore and the eyelids inflamed. The eyes may become tender, slightly painful, and sensitive to light.

Protein breakdown is also caused by excessive stress. This is the pattern you find in people with a fast metabolic rate. In children particularly, family problems, emotional stresses, and poor diet can lead to severe eye disorders.

SW: What can you tell us about glaucoma?

ECK: The typical glaucoma mineral pattern shows calcium, magnesium, and zinc all deficient. You find the sodium low and the potassium high — a classic exhaustion pattern.³

People with a low sodium-to-potassium ratio are prone to inflammation and swelling in a general way. I suspect that this tendency toward accumulation of fluids also affects the eyes and may lead to glaucoma.

SW: What do you think about the use of vitamin C for glaucoma patients?

ECK: I have seen papers in which it was stated that vitamin C reduced intra-ocular pressure. In many people with a low sodium-to-potassium ratio, vitamin C might indeed help. Vitamin C raises sodium levels and would tend to correct the imbalance between sodium and potassium.

In other cases, however, increasing one's vitamin C intake could cause harm, because sodium promotes the retention of fluid within the tissues. Some people with glaucoma will already have a high sodium-to-potassium ratio.

Individuals with high sodium-to-potassium ratios, particularly over 4 to 1, are prone to fluid retention.

In these cases, the vitamin C can further increase the sodium levels and promote excess inflammation — or fluid build-up. Therefore, anyone using vitamin C for eye problems has to be alert to any such side-effects.

You can't just assume that vitamin C has only good effects. Those people most likely to be harmed by an increase in vitamin C intake are those with a rapid metabolism. This would be signified by sweaty palms, a high level of physical and mental activity, and a high level of nervous tension.

SW: Do you have any comments on the use of vitamin A for eye problems?

ECK: Fast oxidizers are prone to eye problems and fast

oxidizers are almost always deficient in vitamin A.

Vitamin A is essential to adrenal gland function. Adrenals become hyperactive when a vitamin A deficiency exists.

If the adrenal glands are allowed to remain hyperactive, the person will be unable to retain calcium and will be prone to cataracts. We have mentioned this earlier.

Also, if the adrenal glands are hyperactive, which occurs in vitamin A deficiency states, the body's protein tissue breaks down. This could result in a breakdown in the protein structure of the eyes. One of the potential consequences of this breakdown in older people is macular degeneration.

I feel that vitamin A alone, however, has been overrated for eye problems. Vitamin A is synergistic with zinc; that is, they work together. Without adequate zinc, vitamin A's effectiveness is be severely reduced.

In a zinc deficiency, the adrenals become hyperactive, just as they do in a vitamin A deficiency.

Zinc and vitamin A both slow down adrenal activity, which would result in an increase of <u>available</u> calcium and magnesium. In addition, the taking of calcium and magnesium (along with the zinc and vitamin A) would help improve eye problems in many individuals.

SW: What about vitamin B-2 for eyes. It is mentioned often in the literature

ECK: Again, as with vitamin A, vitamin B-2 is overrated for night-blindness. My research indicates that zinc is far more important. Zinc spares both vitamin A and vitamin B-2.

Personally, when I notice I am having trouble adjusting to night vision, I take zinc and a combination tablet of vitamins A and C. Within two or three days all is well.

SW: What can you tell us about near-sightedness?

ECK: Near-sightedness is very closely related to excessive stress, particularly at an early age. When I was under severe stress, my eyes deteriorated. I would say I lost a good 35% of my vision within a period of eight months.

Fast oxidizers like myself are more susceptible to near-sightedness than slow oxidizers. Children — who are fast oxidizers — go to optometrists much more often for near-sightedness than for other eye problems.

On the other hand, people with a slow rate of metabolism are more prone to far-sightedness. As you become older, your body metabolism slows down, and this is when you see an increase in far-sightedness.

To sum up, people with a fast metabolism generally have low levels of calcium to magnesium. It may be that the low calcium-to-magnesium ratio affects the eye muscles in such a way that incoming images focus before the retina.

Those with a slow metabolism generally have a high level of calcium to magnesium. This is associated with

far-sightedness, in which the incoming images focus behind the retina.

SW: What about floaters, in which the person is bothered by floating particles in the eyes?

ECK: I can't offer a lot of proof on this, but I found out that most people with floaters have a severe zinc deficiency.

Just giving them zinc will not cure them, however, because zinc is related to other minerals.

For example, there is a relationship between magnesium and zinc. Magnesium acts as a buffer or "biological cushion" to protect the body against stress and shock. As a buffer, magnesium acts to prevent the body from losing zinc.

If the magnesium levels are depleted, then zinc alone may not produce satisfactory results. Ordinarily, giving magnesium along with zinc result in a double- or triplefold response.

SW: What can you say about detached retinas?

ECK: Almost all detached retinas occur as a result of chronic stress and is triggered by a major acute stress. Optometrists know that.

A person goes through a severe period of stress and all of a sudden he has a detached retina. The stress depletes the zinc in the eye, which is needed for building up proteins. Without the zinc as a protection, there is an increase in copper activity, which dissolves the protein structuring.

The tissue weakens, and then it tears.

I see an almost 85% correlation of detached retina with a severe zinc deficiency. I am not talking about moderately low zinc levels of 15 (normal is 22 mg./percent. I am referring to zinc levels 8 or lower, which is quite rare except in children with failure-to-thrive syndrome.

These children have zinc levels even lower, 4 to 5, and they have the same eye symptomatology.

Detached retinas occur mostly in people who have a tendency toward copper accumulation in the tissues. The presence of high copper levels in the tissues worsens the effects of stress, because the excess copper competes against the available zinc.

Thus, a person with high copper is highly susceptible to stress damage and detached retinas.

SW: In other conversations, you have mentioned to me the relationship between near-sightedness and infection, including dental decay.

ECK: There is a known relationship between infection and other diseases, such as diabetes. Infection, oddly enough, is a zinc deficiency. This is why it is also related to near-sightedness.

Many children's eyes go bad on them early in life because of chronic infections — ear infections or various other bodily infections. As a result, their eyes deteriorate rapidly.

Children with hidden or overt copper toxicity have recurrent ear infections. These children need zinc desperately.

Of course, one can't always give zinc by itself, however, because in some cases, zinc can lower sodium levels and increase one's susceptibility to infections. That is why it is prudent to add some vitamin B-6, which tends to raise sodium.

SW: What recommendations could you give our readers about diet and the eyes?

ECK: Those with eye problems should make sure they aren't ingesting excessive amounts of dietary copper. One generally unknown source of copper is soybean proteins. Another is chocolate, which is high in copper. Other foods that are high in copper include wheat germ, liver, brewer's yeast and torula yeast.

Individuals who are taking herbs should have them analyzed to see if they are high in copper.

People think of herbs as a source of nutrition and benefit, not as a source of toxic metals or excess metals. Unless you perform mineral research, you would never consider the minerals in herbs as even being important.

However, the minerals in herbs are important. For instance, black cohosh is high in iron and copper, which is why it is so excellent for female menstrual problems. Unfortunately, any mineral that is beneficial to human life is also toxic in excess.

People should also be careful about eating too much whole grains in the form of cereals or breads. Whole grains — except in sprouted form — are rich in phytates, substances that can reduce calcium, magnesium, and zinc — the nutrients that are particularly protective of eye function.

In some individuals, even a slice or two or whole grain bread is enough to trigger problems.

Another little-known factor affecting eyesight is the water you drink. If the water is acid, it can leach copper and other minerals from pipes, even though the water itself is low in these minerals. From galvanized pipes, you ingest cadmium and zinc.

Drinking water could be high in iron, or high in calcium relative to magnesium, which suppresses copper activity and could contribute to low copper tissue levels. Other drinking water promotes excessive copper tissue levels. In either case, the eyes can be affected.

We have a family in Texas that had been poisoned by the high iron levels in their drinking water. They were suffering from nosebleeds, from headaches, hypertension, allergies, and severe muscular rigidity.

Who ever thinks to check their drinking water, however, if they have an eye problem, or <u>any</u> sort of problem?

SW: I myself noticed that I developed pains in my eyes when I took iron supplements I didn't need.

ECK: That's because iron, whether in the water or in food or supplements, lowers zinc and magnesium levels. The result is an increase in stress, which can be felt as an increased sensitivity to light, or as eye pains.

Excess iron also could lower copper, which is necessary for connective-tissue formation. This could lead to all the same eye problems as those caused by copper excess.

Another recomendation for your readers is that zinc, or zinc combined with magnesium, will often relieve the sensitivity of sore, painful eyes.

On the other hand, be careful with zinc because it can lead to tremendous fatigue — by causing iron to be displaced from the tissues.

Remember: You cannot necessarily raise zinc levels by giving zinc. A low zinc (or an abnormally high zinc under the circumstances) is indicative of adrenal failure. It takes more than zinc to correct adrenal depletion.

SW: What else can people do?

ECK: One final suggestion I can make is eye exercises.

I have seen a least 15 people who were helped dramatically by eye exercises, including my mother. When my mother was about 31 years old, she had to wear very thick lenses. She became excited about a book by Bates entitled <u>Sight without Glasses</u> and practiced the exercises religiously.

Today my mother is 84 years old and she has perfect vision. She doesn't wear any glasses whatsoever.

SW: Do you have anything you wish to say in conclusion?

ECK: Yes, first, it is not going to be easy for anyone to find references on what we have been discussing, because this is a new area of research.

Second, regarding nutritional research, the sad thing is that when results aren't forthcoming from one single nutrient, researchers tend to "put down" nutrition as a helper for health problems.

Nutrition can help, but you will never solve eye problems by searching for isolated nutritional deficiencies.

Eye problems are the result of <u>overall imbalances</u> — <u>not single deficiencies</u>. Until these overall patterns are identified and evaluated, there will be very little progress in nutritional eye research.

Vitamin E and Eyes

Vitamin E can increase inflammation in the eyes, or of the eyelids, and you must be alert for this affect. Vitamin E raises sodium levels, which can increase inflammation — a result that is not widely known.

Any time I took vitamin E, I became edgy, very uncomfortable, and anxiety-ridden — that is, hyperactive.

I mentioned earlier the association between hyperactivity and eye diseases. For some individuals, any nutrient that raises their sodium levels will increase their tendency to develop eye dysfunction.

Copper and Children's Vision Problems

Out of 300-400 hair analyses I have done with children between the ages of 2 to 13 with vision defects, I have found that almost every single one of them had a high copper level. Such children almost always had a sodium-to potassium inversion, i.e., a ratio of less than 2.5 to 1.

They were also hyperactive, and suffered from learning disabilities, behavorial problems and were frequently autustic. It is well-known that there is a relationship between such problems and visual disorders.

Observations on Eye Problems

Diabetes and vision: People with diabetes eventually go blind. If the diabetes is corrected, vision is improved.

The thyroid and eye problems: The thyroid gland greatly affects eye health. For example, people with a fast thyroid can have bulging eyes with a panic-stricken look. People with sluggish thyroid activity suffer from a retention of fluid in their tissues, which will be detrimental to the eyes, resulting in near- and far-sightedness.

Vitamin C and eye problems: Vitamin C can temporarily raise metabolism, resulting in improved vision.

People with a fast rate of metabolism can sometimes find benefit by taking vitamin C combined with vitamin A. This will give them the benefit of vitamin C, while neutralizing its ability to raise sodium. Those with a sluggish metabolism can take a product called Cytocyn-C, which contains factors designed to accelerate metabolism. Calcium and eye problems: If a person takes more calcium than he needs, it could lead to a deterioration of vision.

For one thing, <u>calcium lowers potassium</u>, which is necessary for thyroid hormone activity. If thyroid function is reduced, metabolism slows down. As we become older, the human body accumulates more calcium. The higher the calcium level becomes, the slower the rate of protein metabolism.

Vision is dependent on protein metabolism. People who take unnecessary calcium can slow down their protein metabolism — even if they are eating sufficient protein.

As one's rate of metabolism decreases, the person becomes prone to far-sightedness and other eye disorders.

Also, high calcium levels lead to low potassium levels, which in turn lead to zinc loss and copper build-up. As we have discussed, this change can damage the proteins in the eyes.

Even people with a fast rate of metabolism, who need calcium, could run into problems by taking calcium by itself.

Fast oxidizers, in general, suffer from a copper deficiency. If such people merely take calcium, it could further lower their copper levels and cause many existing eye conditions to worsen.

Fast oxidizers also eat too much lean protein, which lowers their levels of calcium and magnesium and causes anxiety. The lowered levels of calcium and magnesium can then lead to a protein breakdown, which can cause the same problems as those derived from too little protein.

(As we have mentioned previously, one sign of calcium loss from excess stress or excess protein is tartar on the teeth.)

Once again, low calcium and magnesium levels result in a deterioration of the muscles that shape the lens of the eye.

Copper and vision

High copper levels can reduce or block zinc activity.

Even fast metabolizers with supposedly low copper levels can have surges of copper activity when they are under severe stress — and this will block zinc-activated enzymes.

When you lose zinc under stress, the zinc loss multiplies the potency of the copper in your tissues. For this reason, you could have a low copper and still suffer from eye problems caused by copper toxicity.

Inflamed eyelids and sore, painful eyes are often a major sign of copper elimination.

Copper excess tends to dissolve protein, including the muscle tissues associated with eye function. You can see why copper elimination — or low zinc — can affect the muscles that shape the eye.

Zinc is anabolic in its action; it builds up protein. Whereas copper is catabolic, it tears down protein. Zinc gives the eye proteins their strength. Copper gives them their flexibility. A balance is needed or else vision may deteriorate.

Color Blindness

People who have accumulations of copper in their tissues have a strong tendency toward color blindness. There may be stored deposits of copper that may not show-up on early tissue mineral tests.

I have never had any of these people call me and tell me their color blindness cleared up. However, I knew one woman personally who was helped. Her name was Sue and she used to go through red and green and yellow lights. I used to be scared to ride with her. Her color blindness cleared up completely when she eliminated the excessive copper locked-up in her tissues.

I cannot say whether this would happen to other individuals with high copper.

'A person with a fast metabolism typically has low levels of calcium, magnesium, and zinc and higher than normal levels of sodium and potassium.

A person with a slow metabolism has higher than normal levels of calcium, magnesium, and zinc, and lower than normal levels of sodium and potassium. High levels of calcium, magnesium, and zinc are still deficiencies, because the excesses are not normally available for metabolic purposes.

^aSome fast oxidizers suffering from low sodium-to-potassium ratios need copper far more than they need zinc — even when a cursory reading of a tissue mineral analysis reveals a supposed zinc deficiency. Giving copper to such individuals will actually cause a normalization of their zinc levels, without ANY supplemental zinc being given.

The sodium level may actually be high, but it will be less than 2.5 times the level of the potassium. Likewise, the potassium level may actually be low, but it will be high — when compared to the sodium level.

'If the person has a high level of calcium to magnesium, then the body's magnesium activity will be blocked by calcium. A high calcium-to-magnesium ratio blocks the action of magnesium, even if the tissue magnesium levels are high.

¹A low zinc level, by removing a primary inhibitor of copper, can potentiate the effects of small amounts of copper. Thus, a person could have a low copper level and yet suffer eye damage from copper toxicity.

*Copper excess or zinc deficiency can sometimes result in white spots in the fingernails.

'Zinc is needed for anabolic activity, i.e., the building of of proteins. This in zinc deficiency or infection, there is a breakdown of tissue proteins. In prolonged exhaustion, this protein breakdown is registered in tissue mineral analysis as a sodium-to-potassium inversion, i.e. a sodium-to-potassium ratio of less than 2.5 to 1. If a sodium-to-potassium inversion becomes prolonged, the person will experience a steady deterioration in eyesight.

SW: If the person is in an inversion, he has a system that is electrically discharging, instead of charging. This means the person's system is not going to properly build-up proteins, no matter how much protein is being ingested.

*Signs of hidden copper on a tissue mineral analysis include a low sodium-to-potassium ratio, which may be present along with a high calcium, or a high calcium-to-potassium ratio.

An Introduction to Dr. Christopher's Herbal Eyewash — The Original Interview

Presenting... Dr. John R. Christopher

Dr. John R. Christopher was one of the nation's leading herbalists. Unlike many other herbal spokesmen today who have gained much of their information through books and magazines, Dr. Christopher has gained most of his herbal knowledge directly from first-hand clinical experience with thousands of patients over the last 35 years.

We consider Dr. Christopher to be one of the greatest healers of the century.

We think that Dr. Christopher was a giant of giants. In fact, we consider him to be one of the greatest healers of the century, and we are not saying that lightly. His herbal programs have gotten people well from some of the most "incurable" conditions you can imagine — conditions that both orthodox and unorthodox practitioners would find extremely difficult, if not downright impossible, to heal.

For example, Dr. Christopher has had patients who have regained their hearing after they had been stone deaf. His treatments have helped patients to regrow their teeth, which s supposedly a "medical impossibility." He has had people valk again after they had been completely crippled and bedridden, and he has even had people actually regrow new organs and bones - which is absolute medical heresy.

Dr. Christopher once told us a story about a woman who had regrown one of her lower vertebrae. A vertebra had been shattered in an accident and an x-ray showed a large open rea where it should have been. Dr. Christopher told us that his patient went on one of his herbal programs; within one year, cartilage started to form; and after another year, the soft cartilage started to turn to solid bone.

Dr. Christopher died on February 6, 1983, at the age of 13. At the time of the following interview, he was 70 years old and said that he felt better than when he was 25. He attributed is enormous vitality to a daily program of herbs and a atural foods diet.

Dr. Christopher was born with crippling rheumatoid arderitis and for the first 35 years of his life he hardly knew a ngle day of good health. He was in a wheel chair most of the time, and was near death on numerous occasions. When we visited him in Salt Lake City, he even pointed out to us the morgue where his mother once found him after he had been in a serious car accident. He was rushed to the hospital and suffered serious amnesia for many weeks. The doctors said his injuries were so severe that he would be doing well to live to be 35 years old.

Miraculously, he survived 38 years beyond their predictions.

Dr. Christopher said that if it hadn't been for herbal medicine, he wouldn't have lived past 40.

His whole life had been an uphill battle, and at the time of our interview, he was still going strong. He said that if it hadn't been for herbal medicine, he wouldn't have lived past 40.

Dr. Christopher is the author of *The School of Natural Healing*, a 639-page herbal encyclopedia and reference work for both laymen and professionals. Many herbalists and other natural practitioners consider it to be THE outstanding reference work on herbal medicine.

Dr. Christopher taught herbology in his home state of Utah. His school was called by the same name as his book, The School of Natural Healing. He had students from all over the country who took his week-long herbal course. At one seminar, he had students from New Zealand, Scotland and Australia. He offered degrees as a Master Herbalist and for advanced students he offered a doctorate in Herbology.

When Dr. Christopher was not busy lecturing or teaching, he spent much of his time developing new formulas. He told us that many of them came from divine inspiration. To some people, this may seem like a rather primitive and unscientific way to develop formulas, but we strongly feel that the results he has attained more than speak for themselves.

Dr. Christopher could keep an audience spellbound for hours while he lectured on the healing power of herbs. His knowledge was awesome.

Dr. Christopher was so dedicated to his work and to his strong belief in the healing power of herbs that he lectured constantly around the country to both lay and professional groups. His lecture schedule was so heavy that he frequently talked in three different cities during a single week.

Dr. Christopher was in a class by himself. Most persons live an entire lifetime and rarely meet anyone who comes even close to having the qualities that he had. He was a man of character and is a perfect gentleman.

It can be seen by looking at his face that he is a dedicated person and that he cared deeply about people. He wanted to see everyone become healthy. He had a sense of power about him that seems to come directly from God. If you could talk to him privately for a few moments, you would know what we mean.

From the time Dr. Christopher was a small boy, he knew that his mission in life was to heal the sick. It seems only logical and natural that a man of Dr. Christopher's stature and dedication would be chosen to teach the world the practical knowledge of herbalism.

You can live an entire lifetime and you will rarely meet anyone like Dr. Christopher.

Dr. Christopher did not have an easy time in presenting his. Once he was actually handcuffed by armed police and taken off to jail as he was lecturing to a small group of people. He has had many medical groups and state governments take him to court to try to ban him from lecturing.

He told us that on several occasions the bank had to foreclose on his house because he could not meet the mortgage payments due to the high legal fees he had to incur. Once he saw his own furniture being auctioned off in front of his own home.

Even members of his profession have harassed him. Many years back a naturopathic physician sued him. The real reason was that he was able to get people well a lot more quickly than the naturopaths could and the naturopaths were losing business.

Even in his final years, Dr. Christopher still struggled as he lectured constantly to try to make a living. More than once, he has had his formulas stolen and marketed under other peoples' names. Many giant herb companies are flourishing today, and very few of them really seem to appreciate the work that he has done.

Many people seem to have jumped onto the herbal bandwagon today and they talk freely and openly about herb use with very little or no interference. When Dr. Christopher started advocating the use of herbs, there was no herbal bandwagon to jump onto.

Dr. Christopher has worked hard for the last 35 years and we feel that he earn'd praise and respect for the dedicated work he has done. As editors of the newsletter, we feel very honored that we have had the opportunity to spend many hours in his presence.

Almost everyone today has some sort of vision problem, ranging from minor problems, such as nearor farsightedness, eyestrain, and specks, all the way to major eye problems such as cataracts and glaucoma. Medical sources estimate that over 115 million Americans are affected by vision problems to one degree or another.

What can be done about eye problems? For most people with relatively minor eye problems, eye glasses or contacts are fine. You cure your problem and you can see — instantly.

However, as you grow older, as your sight deteriorates and gets worse, contacts and glasses offer less and less of a solution. If you happen to develop cataracts or glaucoma, you will have to consider either surgery or treatment with drugs.

SWANNANOA has been searching for a natural approach, for serious eye problems, an approach which was painless and restored good vision fairly rapidly.

We, of course, knew about eye exercises, which do work in many cases. But often they are quite involved, quite time-consuming — taking an hour a day or more, and frequently must be done for ayear or more before any results are noticeable. Most people just don't have the time to do them. And even if everyone had the time, they won't help you much if you have cataracts or glaucoma.

We also explored nutritional approaches to eye problems, since various nutrients such as vitamin A, calcium, vitamin C, and vitamin E are well-known to be needed for healthy eyes. But, as best as we could find, nutrition seems to do more to prevent eye problems than to correct them.

When we interviewed Dr. Christopher [for issue] on women's problems, we were aware of the success he had in treating eye problems. So we naturally asked him about his methods.

SWANNANOA: What have you got for eye problems? CHRISTOPHER: I've developed an herbal eyewash that corrects a wide variety of eye problems. In most cases, eye problems — even serious ones such as cataracts and glaucoma — will show tremendous improvement within a matter of months.

For example, many years ago, a man came to me from British Columbia, a province of Canada. When he stepped in my room, I noticed his glasses were as thick as the end of a Coke bottle. I said, "I can see your vision is terrible. How long have you had your problem?"

He said, "It's been going on for 20 years or more. My vision is diminishing rapidly. I'm a jeweler and it's the only trade I know. If I lose my eyes, I won't be able to work

anymore. I never thought it could happen to me."

I reassured him that this need not happen. Then I told him about the herbal eye formula. He went back home and I didn't hear from him for six weeks or so. Then I received a postcard from him. He said his eyes were starting to hurt when he wore his glasses. He said he had switched to a weaker pair he had laying around and that seemed to help.

I wrote back and told him that this normally happens when the eyes get stronger.

Three months later, he wrote again. He said that his eyes had continued to improve. He had gone through another two pairs of old glasses. He said he was now wearing glasses he had worn 15 years ago. He was elated. Three months later, he reported being able to work without any glasses. He said he could fix watches, and work on diamonds, without the soreness and eyestrain he had always known.

SWANNANOA: It sounds hard to believe. How can a person possibly experience such a dramatic improvement in vision after 20 years of poor sight. And how can it happen so quickly?

CHRISTOPHER: When you don't understand how the herbs work, it certainly would seem unbelievable. So let me explain my eye formula and how it works.

The formula contains a number of different herbs, each having their own purpose. For example, there is cayenne pepper, which stimulates the eye tissues and improves the circulation in them. There is golden seal root, which kills any infection or bacteria in the eye tissues. There is bayberry bark, and red raspberry which promote the growth of new healthy eye tissue. Finally there's eyebright, an herb which has been used to cure eye problems for the last seven hundred years.

Often, within a week after starting, people notice mucus and pus coming out of their eyes when they wake up. This is simply damaged cells and toxic materials which are being cleansed from the eyes. One lady called me after taking the eye formula for only two days. She said, "Dr. Christopher, I woke up this morning and my eyes were almost glued shut with mucus."

I told her she was lucky. I said, "If the mucus comes out of your eyes at that rate, you'll have your vision back in no time."

You see, when the entire eye is cleaned out, the vision will naturally improve. When the waste material comes out of the muscles, the muscles will become stronger and will be able to focus better. When the lens in the eye is cleaned out, it will become almost crystal clear.

When this happens, light rays will travel through the entire lens and will be focused on the retina without being distorted, which usually happens when the lens is cloudy. In addition, the optic nerve itself will become much more sensitive and it will send picture images to and from the brain many times quicker.

Also, the eyewash will increase the circulation in the eye. This means nutrients will travel more quickly to the eye and the eye will regenerate at a faster rate. This circulation is vitally important in relation to the eye lens. There are no blood vessels in the lens itself.

It depends entirely on the free-flowing humorous liquids which bathe the lens on both sides. So when nutrients can get

to the lens quickly, and when waste products can be discharged from the lens easily, a person's focusing ability is bound to improve.

SWANNANOA: You still didn't answer part of my question: How can your eye formula work so quickly?

CHRISTOPHER: The main reason it works so quickly is that I use it as an eyewash. I have people make a solution of the herbs and tell them to use it directly on the eyes as an eye wash. In this manner, the herbs are soaked directly into the eye tissues and go to work within minutes.

SWANNANOA: Could you tell us a little more about eyebright, the main herb in your formula?

CHRISTOPHER: Certainly. Eyebright is a small flowering shrub which is found in Europe and northeastern America. It has been used to alleviate eye problems on both sides of the Atlantic for centuries.

In Europe, back in Roman times, it was named Euphrasia, which means "cheerfulness due to improved vision." So even back at the time of Christ, they knew that eyebright helped to improve vision. Eyebright was used in Iceland as early as the thirteenth century.

Icelanders used to take the plant, squeeze the juice out, and put it right in the eyes. The Scots also used it in a similar manner. Eyebright was also used in England for centuries. The famous seventeenth century doctor, Nicolas Culpeper, said the following about eyebright:

"If the herb eyebright was but as much used as it is neglected, it would half spoil the spectacle makers' trade."

In America, eyebright was used by the Indians. It was used by the early settlers. It was used and recommended by famous herbalists at the turn of the century. Eyebright is listed in the official *Homeopathic Pharmacopiea of the United States*. It's also listed as an eye remedy in a standard medical reference book, *The American Illustrated Medical Dictionary*, written by W. A. Newman Dorland, M. D.

It all makes sense. How do you think eyebright got its name? Do you think it just happened by accident? Of course not. It was named eyebright for good reason — because it helped brighten people's vision. That's the reason the name has stuck for over 700 years.

SWANNANOA: How do you use the eyewash?

CHRISTOPHER: To make the eyewash, put one teaspoon of the formula in a cup of boiling distilled water. You should never use tap water. When the tea has cooled, and the herbs have settled to the bottom, pour the solution through a clean piece of cotton or wool. Don't use any synthetic fibers. Then pour a small amount in a glass eye cup, which you can get in any drug store.

Place the cup over one of the eyes and blink the eye for a few times, then rest the eye for a few moments. This will let the eye become accustomed to being washed. Then repeat with the other eye. Keep using the eyewash until you can blink about 20 times with each eye.

The second day, you can try to leave the eyes open for a few seconds in the solution. Your eyes may sting in the beginning. But the more you use the eyewash, the easier it will be.

Keep using the eyewash three times a day, and try to keep your eyes open in the solution for longer and longer periods. Hopefully, within a week you should be able to keep them open for five minutes at a time.

If you can do this persistently, day in and day out, you'll be well on your way toward correcting any vision problems you may have. If your eyes are really bad, you can take the eye wash 5 to 6 times a day.

Also, I urge you to take three capsules of the formula twice a day internally. This is absolutely essential if you expect to get complete results.

SWANNANOA: You mentioned earlier that your formula contains cayenne pepper. Cayenne is pretty strong. Wouldn't it be dangerous to put it in the eyes?

CHRISTOPHER: No, it isn't. In all these years, I've never had any problems, with the cayenne. It's true, it makes your eyes sting, but that won't hurt you. In fact, a few people have told me that the more their eyes sting, the better their eyes feel afterwards.

SWANNANOA: Do you believe in eye exercises for vision problems?

CHRISTOPHER: Yes I do. Exercises are beneficial in strengthening the eye muscles and increasing the circulation to the eye. However, if you just do the eye exercises, without the eye wash, it will take you a lot longer to get results, and you may not get results at all.

It makes sense when you think about it. How can you expect eye exercises to work when the eye muscles are full of mucus and toxic debris. This explains why exercises were so much more effective earlier in the century. People didn't eat so much junk food and sugar as they do now, so they didn't have as much waste matter and bad cells in their eyes.

There are quite a few people I've seen who read books on eye exercises and try them diligently, yet just don't get any dramatic results. If they would first clean out their eyes, and rebuild them — by using the eye wash — then they would see results a lot quicker.

SWANNANOA: How fast can a person expect results by using your eyebright formula?

CHRISTOPHER: It depends on the person and the problem. Sometimes there are results in three weeks. Other times it takes 5 or 6 months or longer.

For example, I helped a man who suffered from nearsightedness. His eyes were too weak to pass the driving requirementq. He was legally blind, so, being a person of means, he hired a chauffeur. He heard about my eye wash at a lecture I gave in Phoenix.

Almost five months later, I was back in town for another

lecture. At the end of the evening, he came up to me and waved his new driver's license. He had passed the driving test — without glasses.

Another example I remember was a lady from Evanston, Wyoming. Whenever she came to me, she was led in by either a child or a seeing eye dog. Over a ten year period, her eyesight had deteriorated so that she could hardly see at all.

To make a long story short, she tried the eyewash and showed up back in my office seven months later. She apparently kept at it quite religiously, because this time there was no child or seeing eye dog to lead her in. I was shocked, because I wasn't expecting her, and certainly didn't expect to see her walk in without help.

She greeted me, walked over to my desk, picked up my herbal book, opened it up and started slowly reading me the section on peppermint. She wasn't reading very fast, but she didn't miss a word.

So you see, it really depends on the individual case. I can't tell you how long it will take for your particular problem to improve. You just have to stick with it, day after day, until it does.

SWANNANOA: Can your eyewash help such minor problems as simple eyestrain or photosensitivity?

CHRISTOPHER: Of course. The eyewash makes the eyes stronger. Then they can take greater stress, whether it's strong lights, too dim light, too much reading, or whatever. All eye problems will improve.

The eyewash even helps problems not directly connected with vision. For example, a lady came to me once and just begged me to help her. I said, "What's the trouble?" She said, "I can hardly tear at all. It's been that way since I was a teenager."

Her problem was that her tear ducts were all clogged up. She used the eyewash and in no time at all, she was able to tear like everyone else.

The eyewash also helps the opposite problem, tearing too much. One businessman came to me with this problem. It was embarrassing for him to keep wiping the tears out of his eyes during business meetings. His tear ducts were infected and didn't work right. He used the eyewash. It eliminated the infection and irritation, and the excess tearing stopped.

Another problem the eye wash will help with is in eliminating floaters. These are spots in the eyes which can appear from time to time. They're terribly irritating. Many times the eye doctor will tell you, "You just have to live with it." Usually the eye wash will eliminate the floaters within 3-4 weeks.

SWANNANOA: What about serious problems like cataracts and glaucoma. How long does it take for them to improve? CHRISTOPHER: With cataracts, it usually takes 5 months or more. However, it can happen sooner. For instance, I remember one women who had cataracts for over 15 years and who had become totally blind because of them. She was very poor and couldn't afford an operation.

She heard about my eye wash and began to use it regularly, at least five times a day.

Nothing much happend in the beginning, except a little discharge of mucus and pus once in a while. It was three months down the road, and there were still no results at all. She called me discouraged and wanted to quit. She said, "It's too late for a woman my age to get results. After all, I've been blind for years. I should have started while the cataracts were still forming."

I told her, "Nothing doing. You keep right at it." I said that if she quit, there would be no hope. Her only hope was to continue.

She was still discouraged, but she agreed to keep going a while longer, if only out of respect for me. Well, one week later, she was in the bathroom and she felt something funny in her eyes. Something was irritating them. She propped one eye open and started to rub it. She felt a small, hardened slippery piece of tissue come off in her hand.

She reached for a small hand mirror and looked into it. She was amazed, because she could actually see herself. Of course, her face was blurry but nevertheless she could see it.

When she realized what had happened, after being totally blind for 15 years, after having to grope around in the dark, after being confined to her small house much of the time—and now, being able to see not only light, but her own face—well, she just sat down and cried.

You see, what had happened was that her cataract had come out of her eye. The eyewash had loosened it and caused it to be thrown off. Two days later, the cataract came off the other eye in the same manner. Her vision was still poor at first, but she could walk around the house without bumping into things.

Over a two month period, her vision became sharper. Now she reads large type and works in her garden. In time, I have every confidence that she'll regain full use of her eyes.

I have to admit it, but her case was unusual. Three months is fairly quick. But I have seen dozens of people who dissolved their cataracts in 5 months or more.

By contrast, glaucoma cases improve much more quickly.

I have seen the pressure come down in many glaucoma patients within weeks. That's because the eye wash cleans out the drainage ducts near the eye. When these ducts are all cleaned out, the pressure will return to normal. It's that simple. I've never seen one glaucoma patient that didn't get dramatic results when they used the eyewash.

SWANNANOA: What if someone has already gone blind. Can it be reversed?

CHRISTOPHER: Yes, it's possible.

For example, there was a man from Ruth, Nevada, who came to me some years ago with his 25-year-old son. The boy was blind and had been blind since birth. It looked helpless. Doctors had come from all over the country and they all agreed that nothing could be done.

Well, we started the eyewash right away. In less than six months, the boy cold tell if someone had switched on a light in the room. Before the year was out, he could tell you if a car went by and what color it was.

By the second year, he was able to read the headlines in the newspapers. After two and a half years, he was able to read fine print without glasses.

You might have a hard time accepting a story like this, but let me remind you that other organs in the body can also regenerate themselves. The liver regenerates itself all the time. So does the skin.

When you think about it for a while, it shouldn't seem too inconceivable that eye tissue could regenerate under the right circumstances, and in the right environment.

But anyway, for those who will accept a story like this, it should show them that there's always hope — not matter how bad the condition is.

SWANNANOA: We have just two more questions to wrap things up. First, some of your critics question the claims you make for herbs. They say you promote herbs because you make money selling herbs. Could you comment?

CHRISTOPHER: Yes, I do sell herbs, and frankly I do make money. But it would be ridiculous to think that the money I make in any way influences what I say about herbs. I can't just palm off a bunch of useless herbs on your readers or anyone else.

I've got a reputation at stake. It took me thirty years to get where I am now. I've got a big responsibility. Whether I like it or not, I am one of the foremost spokesmen for herbal medicine in the United States. Lay people, herbalists, and even medical doctors from all over the country follow my recommendations. With the position I have I just can't go around saying things about herbs that are not true.

If people weren't satisfied with the herbs they buy from me, they could always return them for a refund. If I didn't satisfy my customers, I'd be out of business in no time flat. Also, there are plenty of herbal suppliers besides me. You can buy herbs from any one of them. All of my formulas, including the eyebright formula, are public knowledge.

And there's just one more thing I'd like to say while I'm on it. I was involved with herbs long before there was any money in it, and long before they were popular. I've struggled for years to tell people about herbal medicine.

I've been ridiculed, ostracized, attacked, and even thrown in jail on numerous occasions. It's never been easy for me. If I were in it just for the money, I certainly didn't have to go through all that. I could have sold insurance or something else without any trouble.

SWANNANOA: Dr. Christopher, I notice that you yourself wear glasses. Why is that?

CHRISTOPHER: Yes, that's true. I do have to wear glasses for driving. But even though my eyes are not perfect, the eyewash has helped me enormously.

When I was a small boy, I had terrible vision. I could hardly see the blackboard. To make matter worse, I got hit in one eye by a baseball bat. The doctors said the eye would be blind for life.

My problem is that I don't use the eyewash regularly. I'm on the road all the time and I usually don't get to it. I always tell myself, "Tomorrow, I'm going to get on a regular schedule." Then, tomorrow comes and I have so much to do

that I put it off. It's the old case of the shoemaker going barefoot.

If I had used the eyewash faithfully, I have no doubt that I'd have perfect sight by now. But I still think I'm doing pretty well. One eye has 20/20 vision and the other is 20/15. (And remember, I'm close to 70 now.) If it weren't for the eyewash, I doubt I'd be able to see anything — with or without glasses.

We flew out to visit Mr. Sappington in Wisconsin. We asked him to read a phone book for us, and he did this without any trouble. We asked his wife if he was able to do this before he started the eyewash and she told us that he couldn't.

We wanted to know for sure if Mr. Sappington's eyesight had really improved, so we took him to a local eye doctor in town. Discussion with Mrs. Olivotti November 10, 1979

SWANNANOA: You said in your letter that you were helped by the herbal eyewash?

SWANNANOA: The right eye was the one you said you got rid of a cataract in.

OLIVOTTI: That is the one, yes.

SWANNANOA: How do you know that you had a cataract in that eye?

OLIVOTTI: The doctor told me. He confirmed it. There was no question about it.

"Before I took the eyewash I couldn't even see a block away. I was almost blind.

SWANNANOA: How long ago did he tell that you had it?

OLIVOTTI: About two years ago.

SWANNANOA: How do you know that you don't have a cataract now?

OLIVOTTI: I am pretty sure I can see almost perfectly now.

OLIVOTTI: Yes, my sight is coming back.

Conversation with Mrs. Olivotti on November 17, 1979, after she went back to her eye doctor. (We had requested her to get a complete eye examination.)

SWANNANOA: So you finally went back to your eye doctor?

OLIVOTTI: Yes, I went back this past Tuesday.

SWANNANOA: What did he say?

OLIVOTTI: He said that I had absolutely no cataract on my right eye.

SWANNANOA: How could be explain that?

OLIVOTTI: He said it was funny with cataracts. He said that sometimes they will go away like that. He said that he couldn't explain it and that he didn't know that much about cataracts.

He said that the eye vision had improved a little. And I said it had improved quite a bit, because I know what I could see with it.

And he said that reading inside and outside are two different things. So I suppose he has a point. And he said that I had a little astigmatism in the right eye, which I have always had. But, he did say that my vision was very good.

SWANNANOA: Did he change your prescription for your glasses?

OLIVOTTI: No, he didn't. My eyes used to need new glasses every six months. It was like this for the past two years. So this is the first time in quite a while that I don't need new glasses.

SWANNANOA: Did you mention to him about the eyewash?

OLIVOTTI: Yes, I did, and he wanted a copy of the Newsletter, but I didn't want to give it to him. I thought he might cause a lot of trouble.

Jean Bray Monroe, Louisiana We talked to this reader by telephone, and the following is a condensed version of our conversation.

SWANNANOA: You said in your letter that you had your restriction removed from your driver's license. Has your eyesight improved that much?

BRAY: Oh, yes. It was just a few years ago that I was told I was going blind.

SWANNANOA: What was your problem?

BRAY: Well, I have hypoglycemia. It runs from high to low blood sugar; and, of course, that affects your eyes. Anyway, it has just been amazing. I don't use my glasses very often anymore—for reading even, unless I am in a dark room. But I am expecting that to disappear pretty soon.

SWANNANOA: How soon after you used the eyewash did you notice the results?

BRAY: I'll tell you, when I first started it, the blurriness was horrible. I could hardly see to drive a car. I had so much film over my eyes. But then it started coming off in great big globs of this green mucus. It was yellowish green.

SWANNANOA: Right out of your eye?

BRAY: Yes, it would just roll out. I could just feel it when it was rolling out. I could tell when it was ready to start coming. I know one time I didn't feel it, and I had a customer in here and he said, "What's that matter in your eye?" And I looked and I had a whole quarter of my eye that was filled with this mucus, and I had not felt it that time.

SWANNANOA: Was it coming out on a daily basis?

BRAY: It sometimes would, and then it would wait a few days, and then come again. But just before it rolls off, you will get this very hazy vision.

SWANNANOA: How often did you use the eyewash?

BRAY: I used it about twice a day for about five minutes at a time.

SWANNANOA: After using the eyewash for a few months, did you still get mucus?

BRAY: Oh, yes. It lasted for several months.

SWANNANOA: It seems amazing that so much mucus would come out of the eyes.

BRAY: Yes, it does. I also had a terrible eye granulation problem.

SWANNANOA: Can you explain exactly what granulation is?

BRAY: It feels like your eyes are filled with sand. You can't see it, but your eyes feel so heavy. It just feels like someone had thrown a handful of sand in your eyes. And I lived with that off and on for years. When I started the eyewash, it really got worse before it got better. It felt like it had swelled up. And then all that green mucus started to come out. I felt like there must have been an infection in there.

SWANNANOA: Weren't you worried when all that mucus started to come out?

BRAY: Oh, no. I knew this was healing. Every time the mucus was about to come out, my vision would get blurred.

SWANNANOA: How long after you started the eyewash before you began to see better again?

BRAY: I'd say after just a few weeks.

SWANNANOA: When did you go back for your driver's test?

BRAY: I think it was about 4 months after I started.

SWANNANOA: Have your eyes been tested by a doctor?

BRAY: No. I haven't had them tested.

SWANNANOA: Are you sure you absolutely needed the glasses to drive before you started with the eyewash?

BRAY: Oh, yes. In fact, I had a military doctor tell me that I was going blind.

SWANNANOA: So your eyes were actually getting worse before you started with the eyewash?

BRAY: Yes, this was about five years ago, and they wanted to put prism lenses on me. I also had my brother check my eyes. He is an ophthalmologist. He verified how bad my eyes were. He also said I had astigmatism.

SWANNANOA: So this eyewash has helped your astigmatism, too?

BRAY: Yes, it has.

SWANNANOA: Wouldn't an eye doctor say that for farsighted people, they can often see better in the distance as they grow older?

BRAY: Yes, but I am now reading without my lenses, so they can't say that. That is what usually gets worse when you get older. Also, my eyes were getting worse until I used the eyewash. So I know it was the eyewash and not any other factor.

SWANNANOA: Thank you very much for answering our questions.

The following is a conversation we had with Mrs. Bray 6 months after we first talked to her.

SWANNANOA: What has happened since we talked to you the last time?

BRAY: Well, mucus is coming out of my eyes in quarter inch lengths, right out of the tear ducts. I can actually feel it oozing out of there when I squeeze my eyes shut. Sometimes it will do it continuously, and sometimes I'll go for days with nothing coming out.

SWANNANOA: Does it still look like little slivers of metal?

BRAY: Yes, I got some yesterday that did.

SWANNANOA: You mean, it actually looks like metal?

BRAY: Well, it's a dark brown, and that's what a metal

sliver looks like. And it's just a 16th of an inch, or even shorter. They will be lying in the bottom of the liquid, sticks of them instead of granules.

SWANNANOA: You said the pressure is lower now.

BRAY: Oh, you bet.

SWANNANOA: Did you have glaucoma before?

BRAY: I don't know.

SWANNANOA: How do you know the pressure is lower? Did you go to an eye doctor?

BRAY: Well, no, I can feel it; I mean the granulation is less, the pressure from the granules. Sometimes I'm without it completely. Right now I have a little because I'm getting ready to eliminate some more. And sometimes the mucus just rolls out of there.

SWANNANOA: How did your condition begin?

BRAY: I believe it was in May of 1952 that our daughter was hit by a car, and that's when I got this granulation.

SWANNANOA: Did you get the granulation instantly?

BRAY: Well, within a matter of a few days. All I can remember is that when she got out of the hospital, I would sit up and try to watch the children, and at 5:00 or 6:00 at night, I could hardly hold my eyes open because of the granulation.

SWANNANOA: Did it clog your eyes up completely?

BRAY: Yes, it was almost impossible to keep them open. I had to fight to keep them open.

SWANNANOA: Were you able to have a driver's license then?

BRAY: Yes, well, I didn't say anything to anybody. I could get by better during the day, but when night came and my husband was home, it was pretty bad. The doctors were calling me a hypochondriac and now my whole life has changed since I'm into nutrition. It's just a whole new world.

SWANNANOA: You said that you could drive now without your glasses.

BRAY: Yes, I've had a glasses restriction lifted officially from my driver's license. A year ago last February I went in to be tested. My driver's license wasn't due for renewal at that time, but they said if I wanted to come in and take an eye test, I could, and if I passed, they would release the restriction. So they did. Then I had to renew it this year, last February, and again I didn't need glasses.

SWANNANOA: You think that's because of the eyewash?


BRAY: Oh, I know it is.

SANDERS: At first I used it five times a day in washing my eyes. Of course, you drink half of it in the morning and half at night and it really works.

SWANNANOA: How long after you first used it did you notice that your eyesight was improving?

SANDERS: Oh, two or three days.

SWANNANOA: It was that soon?

SANDERS: Oh, sure.

SWANNANOA: That's hard to believe. Here you had been wearing your glasses for about 35 years and then you take the eyewash, and two days later you notice a difference. What did you notice?

SANDERS: My eyes began to clear up.

SWANNANOA: So within two days you could actually see things more clearly?

Beau Bromell, age 24, from Kansas City, Missouri, has been blind from birth. After using the eyewash for a year, he can now see sunlight and can also see flashes of lightning.



We spoke with his mother, Mrs. Bromell several times, and what appears below is an extract of our discussions with her.

SWANNANOA: How did Beau become blind?

BROMELL: They gave him too much oxygen as a baby, and it destroyed the retinas in his eyes.

He was born prematurely, and he had to have oxygen to breathe; but they made it too strong, and it damaged his eyes. It happened to thousands of babies back then before they found out. They were all "preemies"—premature—and they were all under five pounds, like Beau was.

It's called retrolental fibroplasia, and it made him totally blind, right from the beginning.

SWANNANOA: Did you try anything else before you tried the eyewash?

BROMELL: Oh, heavens, yes. You name it, and I've tried it. I have tried chiropractic, you know that, of course. And I tried the osteopaths and the medics and the optometrists, and every place I went, they said there was nothing I could do.

HEALTHVIEW: What did the medical doctors say?

BROMELL: They said that no one had ever found anything that could help retrolental fibroplasia. They said that when the retina is destroyed, as it is in Beau, there is nothing to work with; so you can't even do surgery, like a lens implant or anything like that.

I tried everything. Spirtualism, and healers, a whole bunch of them, and nothing took effect. And I tried oil—castor oil on his eyes, and hot packs, and the potato packs. Oh, I had him on just about everything—vitamins, herbs, chiropractors—there wasn't anything I didn't do.

SWANNANOA: What did you think when the doctors told you there was nothing you could do?

BROMELL: I didn't believe them. I knew he would be able to see one day. That's the only reason I adopted Beau in the first place, because I believed that, with God, all things are possible.

SWANNANOA: You adopted Beau? I didn't know that.

BROMELL: Oh yes. I adopted him when he was five months old. Then when I took him to an osteopath like I had to to adopt him, why the doc says, "Don't adopt this child. He'll never see." I was so mad I began to cry.

I said, "That's the only reason I want him. I'll be his eyes."

Oh, that made me mad for him to say, "Don't EVER, EVER adopt this child. He'll NEVER see."

But I believed Beau would see, because I believed God was more important than that doctor was.

Later on, I even had a vision about it. It was back in about 1964. There was a bright light, and Beau got his sight. It seemed like Beau and I were healed by this beautiful light, and then Beau and my picture was in a magazine in color, telling all about his sight.

The same night, Beau had the same dream like he could see. And since then, we both had a dream that he was driving a car, so we're sure he's going to have his sight.

SWANNANOA: How did you hear about the eyewash?

BROMELL: One of the owners of the healthfood store, and that's Healthfood Haven—it was Mrs. Bogart. She said, "There is something that is written up in a health magazine I think you ought to hear about."

And I said, "Well, honey, I just don't have the time. I'm so busy all the time."

"Well," she said, "YOU'LL BE INTERESTED IN THIS!!!" She sent the issue to me, and by golly, when I read about that eyewash, well, I've been up in seventh heaven ever since. I just know he's going to have his sight.

SWANNANOA: How long has Beau been using the eyewash?

BROMELL: About a year. But we stopped in the middle for a few months because my sister had a nervous breakdown; and I was so busy trying to help her, and too many things were happening, and I just couldn't do everything.

But we started a few weeks ago. Beau uses it twice a day, as much as five minutes each time.

SWANNANOA: How is he doing?

BROMELL: Well, it's slow, but he can see sunlight. One morning I opened up the drapes and he said, "Oh, Mom, the sun is so bright." And when we drive in the car and go under a tunnel or under an overpass, he can tell because he can see the lights get dimmer.

And the biggest thing that thrilled me was when he began to see lightning.

SWANNANOA: Before he used the eyewash, could Beau see anything?

BROMELL: Oh, heavens, no. Oh, no.

SWANNANOA: Could he tell when you would drive through a tunnel?

BROMELL: NO. NO, not at all. He couldn't see anything. Now he can tell when I turn on the lights in a room, although he can't tell which direction they are coming from.

SWANNANOA: So there's no question about it, Beau is beginning to show improvement?

BROMELL: That's right. There is a difference. I just KNOW he is going to see someday. I always knew it.

SWANNANOA: Thank you, Mrs. Bromell. We'll keep in touch. We *know* Beau can do it.

[Editor's Note: We suggested to Mrs. Bromell that she add Dr. Christopher's Lower Bowel Formula to Beau's program and that Beau use a compress at night of Dr. Christopher's B, F and C Tea over his eyes. Also, we suggested that Beau wasn't using the eyewash as much as he could, and said we felt that twice a day was not enough, and that he should use it more often, perhaps three or four times a day, and take the capsules internally, as well.

Mrs. Bromell said she will do everything we suggested and that she will let us know as soon as there is further improvement in Beau's vision. As soon as we hear from her, we'll let you know, because we know you are as anxious as we are to find out how Beau makes out. We are all rooting for him.]

[Editor's Note: We contacted Mrs. Bromell shortly before we went to press and were disappointed to find out that Beau was still not using the eyewash regularly. We told him that if we were blind, we would use the eyewash as much as possible. We hope he does.]

Baby Born Blind Can Now See

SWANNANOA: Dr. Christopher, you told us a story once about a blind baby that had gained it's eyesight. Can you tell us this story again?

CHRISTOPHER: Yes, surely. I knew of a baby that was born blind. The doctor said that it had been born without any optic nerves. Last April, I was staying at the Hotel Utah when this couple approached me with their little baby. It was at the stage where it was just beginning to crawl. They wanted to know if there was anything which I could recommend that could help the baby to see.

SWANNANOA: What did you recommend?

CHRISTOPHER: I told them to use the eyewash as a fomentation over the eyes. I also told them to put a few drops of my B & B tincture in the ears twice a day.

HARDER: Not like I should. Human nature being like it is, you know; when the pain is gone, I am not using it every day and I should be.

SWANNANOA: Well, thank you for talking with us. I'm sure you will appreciate this next issue on the eyewash.

HARDER: It sounds like it should be real good.

The following is part of a conversation we had with Mrs. McCracken.

SWANNANOA: Mrs. McCracken, you said in your letter that you were able to eliminate a large blood spot by using the eyewash?

"February, 1978, checkup showed permanent damage. Meanwhile, I had refused laser beam because I had been told it could destroy the vision in that left eye. SWANNANOA: What did he say?

HOWARD: No, he said that he couldn't understand why, but sometimes people will never have another occurrence of it, and others will have it come back periodically.

Keratoconus Improves on Eyewash

"My son has keratoconus in his eyes and he has been going to the VA Hospital and Stanford Eye Clinic in Palo Alto. When nothing could be done he was scheduled for Cornea Transplant. While waiting, he started using Dr. Christopher's Herbal Eyewash. When he was

checked the doctor said his eyes were not as bad as he had expected and he could have a soft contact lens instead of a transplant. Praise the Lord!"

We spoke with Mrs. T's son and this is our conversation below. We omitted his name to protect his identity completely.

The following is part of a conversation we had with this patient.

SWANNANOA: What is keratoconus?

PATIENT: It's where your eye starts coning; in other words, it starts pointing. I guess the eye stretches like a balloon would and pretty soon the layers of the eye start separating.

SWANNANOA: What happens as it continues to point out? Can it burst at the tip of the point?

PATIENT: Yes, it can; then you lose your eye and there is no way anything can be done for you.

SWANNANOA: Are doctors able to stop it in most cases?

PATIENT: From what I understand, there is no known cure for it. They don't even know what causes it.

SWANNANOA: What is the usual treatment?

PATIENT: They use hard contact lenses to hold the eye in place to keep it from pointing out. But it's only a temporary measure because the "pointing" eventually gets worse.

SWANNANOA: How bad was your case?

PATIENT: It became so bad that one or two layers inside the cornea of my right eye had actually broken. This was on the inside. Such "breaking" allows the fluid to get inside, and apparently, makes a kind of scar on the front which really distorts your vision.

I have a soft contact lens for comfort and then a hard contact lens on top of that to stop the eye from pointing. I think I was diagnosed with this keratoconus about eight years ago and I ended up in Stanford Hospital in Palo Alto.

I had a year of treatment there, but it got to the point with my right eye that they said there was nothing else they could do and the only thing left to do was a cornea transplant. I was on the waiting list for the transplant, and as soon as they had someone's cornea available, they were going to go ahead with the operation.

SWANNANOA: And what happened then?

PATIENT: That was about the time I first heard about the eyewash. It was in December about a year ago. I started to use the eyewash and after six months of use, I went back to see a different doctor, a doctor at the Veterans' Hospital.

SWANNANOA: What did he say?

PATIENT: He checked my eyes and then he said, "Your eyes aren't nearly as bad as I expected from reviewing

your records."

Now I am still checked periodically by the doctor from Stanford and I asked him, "Have my eyes improved?" And he said, "Well, I have never known of a case that was getting any better." And he also said, "The doctor just had exceptional success in fitting you with contact lenses."

SWANNANOA: Do you feel that it was really the eyewash and not the contacts that helped you?

PATIENT: Yes, I do. Oh, I almost forgot to mention something. When the first doctor saw me, he said, "Why do you want a cornea transplant? You don't need it. All you need is some contact lenses." And yet, six months earlier, a team of four top doctors from Stanford had consulted among themselves and all agreed that a transplant was the only thing that could help me. So I definitely feel I was helped.

SWANNANOA: Are you still using the eyewash?

PATIENT: No, I stopped for a while.

SWANNANOA: What happened?

PATIENT: My contact lenses were rubbing on my eyes all the time and they were keeping my eyes a little on the sore side. And the eyewash just made my eyes burn like anything. I finally got to the point where I got so much irritation and so much mucus in my eyes that I had to decide, "Am I going to continue what I am doing," because I did feel I needed the contacts so I wouldn't bump into things and hurt myself, or "should I stop for awhile?"

So I decided to stop until my eyes calmed down some.

SWANNANOA: Did you try diluting the eyewash?

PATIENT: I did try this and I found that the mucus just kept coming out for a number of days afterward. I started out using about one capsule to two cups of water and I did get it down to the point where I could take one capsule to about ¾ths of a cup of water. But even diluted, it made my eyes sting terribly. So much mucus came out at night that my eyes would be glued shut in the morning.

I decided that I would give it up for a little while until my eyes could settle down and then go back to using it. Now I am still taking the capsules. I think that when I start using the eyewash again I may dilute it even more, so I can use it and still live with it.

I am going back to the doctor soon and if anything interesting comes up I will let you know.

SWANNANOA: Please do, we surely would like to hear from you.

Editor's Note: We checked with this patient a number of months later to see how his condition was. His mother told us that he had still not gone back to regularly using the eyewash. This is a typical case: A person will get some relief from a condition and then as soon as they get a few unfamiliar reactions, they will stop using the eyewash. The readers that have gotten the best results with the eyewash have stuck with it. The eyewash won't work if you don't use it.

Staph Infection

Reader from Florida Eliminates Incurable Staph Infection from Eye.

"He said I would have to use eye medicine every day for the rest of my life. He explained that if I didn't each time an ulcer appeared, I would get scar tissue, and enough scar tissue causes blindness. He wrote out a prescription for 'Blephamide' and told me to use it four times a day for a week and then once a day for life. He then added, 'But, I don't like the side effects of this drug.' I said, 'What are they?' He answered, 'Cataracts or glaucoma.'

"Great!! I felt I was caught between the devil and the deep blue sea!

"The following June, a friend paid us a visit from

Michigan. She told me about Dr. Christopher's herbal eyewash. I went out and bought some and started using it orally and as an eyewash.

The following is a condensed version of a conversation we had with Mrs. Shaver by phone.

SWANNANOA: You said you had ulcers right on the eyeball?

SHAVER: Yes, right on the eyeball. I still have the scars because I can look in the mirror and see them. But I don't have any more ulcers on my eyes now.

SWANNANOA: I assume that it must be pretty rare to get ulcers on the eye.

SHAVER: Oh, it's bad. You know it is bad in your mouth, but get one on your eye!

SWANNANOA: What was it like?

SHAVER: Very painful, because every time you blink your eye, you go over a sore. My ulcer was a white dot right on my iris. I noticed my eyes started burning real bad. And bright light hurt them, and they were watering and it was real painful. So I went to the mirror and I saw this white dot on my eye.

SWANNANOA: Was it on both eyes?

SHAVER: Yes, both eyes. So I went to the emergency room at the hospital. I live right behind the hospital. As a matter of fact, I work there. So anyway, I went over there and they looked, and the doctor said I had better see a specialist. He said, "I don't fool with eyes, but you've got something real dangerous."

So I went over to Tallahassee to an eye specialist and he just looked in my eyes and right off the bat he said, "Why, you've got staph infection." He said I would have the staph infection for the rest of my life. He said there was no known cure. He told me I would have to use special medicine for the rest of my life. The Eyebright doesn't burn as much as this medicine did.

SWANNANOA: It must have really burned them.

SHAVER: Yes, you know that stuff really smarts. OK,

so he also told me that the side effects of the medicine could be cataracts and glaucoma. He told me that unless I put these drops in my eyes, it was called Blephamide, every single day, that I would go blind. He told me about one black lady that had the exact same condition that I had and that she ignored the problem and she eventually went blind. You see, when you have any ulcer on the eye, it will heal. But then you will have scar tissue. He said that the new ulcer will break close to the pupil. You never get an ulcer on the same spot. And it just works its way across the pupil, and when it works its way all across, you are blind. And he said this lady had gone blind because she had never gone to the doctor.

SWANNANOA: It is the staph infection which causes the ulcer, right?

SHAVER: Yes, that is right. Well, a friend of mine from Michigan gave me your magazine and she told me about the eyewash. So I went to the health food store and got some. And I was really leery about using it in my eye because the doctor had me so scared. He told me that if I didn't use the medicine every day I would go blind. So I took the eyewash by capsule only. Then I met my friend again and she said that I didn't have anything to be afraid of. So I said, "OK." I started using the eyewash. I did that for a couple of weeks and then I decided to drop the medicine completely and see if the eyewash would help.

SWANNANOA: Did you use the eyewash every day?

SHAVER: I did then, but I don't use it every day now. Now I may go a few days without it, and then I will go a week with it.

SWANNANOA: How many times did you use it every day?

"Considering all the toxins which were in my eyes, it was no surprise I had a severe infection."

SHAVER: I guess I used it about 4-5 times.

SWANNANOA: How long did you use it in each eye?

SHAVER: Oh, I have my own method.

HEALTHVIEW: How do you do it?

SHAVER: I don't have the nerve to open my eyes, you know, because it burns. So what I do is to put the eyewash in a glass eyedropper and I pull the bottom eyelid open and put in the eyewash. Do you know what I am saying? I put the eyewash right inside the eyelid.

SWANNANOA: Doesn't it sting?

SHAVER: Sure it does.

SWANNANOA: Then why don't you just use it as an eyewash?

SHAVER: I don't like using the cup. I don't have the nerve to just put the eyewash right on my eye. Anyway, the cup was so large and a lot of it went right down my

face. The first week or so you wouldn't believe the stuff that came out.

SWANNANOA: What came out?

SHAVER: Oh, everything. You know, when you were a little kid and your eyes were glued shut?

SWANNANOA: Sure do.

SHAVER: Well, that is how my eyes were in the morning. My eyes were just glued. I would have to go peel the hard matter and the white pus off.

SWANNANOA: How long did the pus and mucus come out?

SHAVER: It came out for three weeks.

SWANNANOA: Three weeks straight?

SHAVER: Yes, just about every day. Considering what came out, it seems it is no wonder I had an infection. But I don't have any problem now. I think I got all the infection out of my eyes.

SWANNANOA: How are your eyes now? Has your vision improved?

SHAVER: I think my vision has improved a little bit. I am sure of it because I can read without bifocals now.

SWANNANOA: So, you went back to the doctor. He said the infection was completely gone?

SHAVER: Yes. He looked in my eyes with that big machine, and he said, "Your eyes look great—the cornea is just as clear as it can be. It looks just fine." Then he wanted to know what I was there for. So I reminded him. I said, "You remember I was here in December, and I had staph." "Oh, yes, I remember that," you know, and I said, "You prescribed the blephamide. Well, I used that and I used the Vascon regular that you prescribed," and I said, "I used it until about June." Then I said, "A friend of mine told me about an herbal eyewash. Now when I was here last time, I showed it to you, and you didn't think it was going to work, you know.

But I said I decided to use the eyewash and give it a good try, and then I decided to drop the blephamide. Then I said, "I had such good results with it that even when I quit the herbal eyewash, I had no more ulcers on the eyeball." I told him that I felt that it cured it, and I said, "I want you just to check my eyes," and I told him about the magazine and you wanting me to come back.

Then I said, "They're going to call me, and I'm going to tell them the results of what you say." And he said, "Well, your eyes look good," but he said, "Now Jerry, let me explain something to you. A lot of healing has to do with our mental attitude. If you had told me that blephamide really did the trick, I would have been glad to write another prescription for you; or if the

Vascon regular had done the trick, I would write another prescription, but," he said, "if you feel that these herbs are helping you, then I'm sure they are. You know, any placebo will do."

SWANNANOA: You must have laughed when you heard that.

SHAVER: Yes, really. I mean, if any placebo will do, why didn't blephamide cure me?

SWANNANOA: You gave it a good chance, didn't you?

SHAVER: Six months.

SWANNANOA: And it didn't work?

SHAVER: No, and if I missed one day, by evening I had another ulcer. My eyes were watery, and I knew right then I was going to have a problem; and I'd look, and there was an ulcer, and I'd have to go right back and use that blephamide. I was supposed to use one drop a day, but if I had an ulcer, I had to go to four drops a day. Then when it cured, you know, got healed up, then I was back to one drop a day; and if I missed a day, I had another ulcer. Six months I tried that. That's a fair chance.

I mean Eyebright did it in about two months or a month or whatever, and then he said, "You know, any placebo would do it."

SWANNANOA: How come *they* can't come out with the placebo that does it?

SHAVER: Yes, that's right.

SWANNANOA: Did you ask him if he had heard of Dr. Christopher?

SHAVER: Yes, I asked him that. No, he hadn't. He said, "Of course, he's an herbalist and I'm a medical doctor." I said, "Have you ever heard of Eyebright, the herb, Eyebright?" He said, "No." Then I said, "Well, I'm surprised. It's been used for hundreds of years." He had never heard of it. He said, "You know, it's very possible that I mis-diagnosed."

SWANNANOA: Possible? After all that you went through?

SHAVER: Yes, that's right. And last year, he was so positive. I mean he looked in my eyes and said, "You've got staph infection, and it is incurable. I mean you've got it for the rest of your life. There's nothing you can do," was what he said. "It's incurable."

SWANNANOA: It seems unusual that he would give you a prescription for something as strong as blephamide . . . and such a dangerous prescription. This prescription causes blindness . . . it causes cataracts and glaucoma.

That brings up the question that if he did misdiagnose, why did he give you those drugs?

SHAVER: That's right, because he told me that I had the staph. He said that it's so hard to control. He said, "There's only one drug on the market that will control staph—not cure it, control it. But I just don't like the side effects of it."

And that's when I said, "Well, what are the side

effects?" He said, "cataracts and glaucoma." Well, if he mis-diagnosed, I could have gotten cataracts and glaucoma on a mis-diagnosis.

SWANNANOA: That's pretty serious.

SHAVER: I know. But it's their professional pride. They want it to be drugs. When it's not, they get upset.

Following are the highlights of our conversation with Mr. Brightman.

SWANNANOA: When did you first find out you had increased pressure in your eyes?

BRIGHTMAN: It was in 1971, when my opthalmologist sent me down to N. Y. University Hospital and they examined me; and yes, it turned out I had a glaucoma condition. They started me off on Pilocarpine drops. They drove me out of my mind. They closed down the lens of the eye.

SWANNANOA: You mean you couldn't see well with the drops?

BRIGHTMAN: Oh, I was half-blind from them. I even lost my sense of proportion. And once walking to work I stumbled over a very low curb and fell flat on my face.

The doctors tried to counteract the effects of the Pilocarpine with drops of Epitrate. That's something that's supposed to keep the lens open. Everything was always half dark. I really don't know how I survived in my work. For me, it was worse than doing nothing.

I tried to talk to my opthalmologist but he was very professional and he simply indicated that he didn't want to talk to me and was I questioning his professional judgment.

Eventually, I got very interested in some of the offbeat literature on health and I came across the Bates method of eye exercise. I found particularly that the palming and the sunbathing seemed to relieve the strain a great deal. It didn't do anything about the glaucoma but I did have a sense of relief, so I figured that maybe some of this offbeat stuff was worthwhile. And then along came your Newsletter eventually.

About this time, my condition was a little better but not much better. The Pilocarpine was closing down my eyes so much that I had to stop taking it three days before I visited the eye doctor. Otherwise, he had to give me drop after drop of another drug to open up the eyes just to be able to examine them.

I finally said, "I don't want to have the Pilocarpine; with that stuff I am half blind." I was miserable with it. So he put me on Epinol and then later he put me on to Timoptic, the newest of the drugs.

Both of them succeeded in a measure, I guess, in controlling pressure but it is only a control and they do nothing to the liquids to flush them out.

My eyes began to drain pus and that was when I began to get well.

It doesn't make you blind but it does give you a misty cloud over your eyes, and that's the same symptom that glaucoma causes anyway, which I didn't have when I went on the Pilocarpine.

I had the herbs at this time, but they were on the shelf. When I got the eyewash, I thought, I'll give these new drugs a chance. After all, I am his patient, and I'm not that disobedient to a doctor that I'm going to defy his orders.

Well, with all the shadow effect I was getting, I thought I could do no harm from trying the eyewash. So I made

up a batch and tried it. And all of a sudden what began to happen was that I began to flush. The flushing was first evidenced through excessive sinus drainage. I would blow and blow and blow my nose.

But it took a long time to bring the pressure down. For a while, I left off the drops and I did not bring down the pressure with just the eyewash. . . . In fact, the pressure went up, and I got scolded by the eye doctor. He told me to use the drops faithfully—I hadn't told him about the eyewash. So for two weeks I used the drops and eyewash in combination and my pressure went down.

After a while, my eyes began to drain pus and that was when I began to get well. It wasn't just the nasal excretion, but it was the drainage of the pus right through the eyes. And when that happened after a while, my sinus drainage quit. After that condition occurred in me, I went back to the eye doctor and he said, "Your pressure is very normal."

He hasn't officially relieved me of the drops yet, so I am continuing with the drops morning and night, along with the eyewash morning and evening, and the combination seems to help me.

SWANNANOA: How is your vision now?

BRIGHTMAN: My eyes are now far better than when they originally diagnosed my condition in 1971. After the sinus drainage, I have a visual acuity I haven't had in years. But I am still very dependent on glasses. My astigmatism is such that I can see the time on my radio alarm clock, but I can't read or anything like that.

There seems to be an improvement, because now the eyewash doesn't sting anymore; it's just like a bracing cocktail.

SWANNANOA: Did you ever try the eyewash by itself without the drops?

BRIGHTMAN: Yes, I did experiment with it by itself for awhile, and the pressure went up. I had pressure in my high teens and twenties, but when I went off the eyedrops and went on the eyewash alone, the pressure went up to thirty.

SWANNANOA: This happened to other people. Dr. Christopher says it's just part of the cleansing process

BRIGHTMAN: I am sure it is, but I just didn't want to take the chance, especially since the eyedrops were keeping it under control.

SWANNANOA: Absolutely.

BRIGHTMAN: There is one thing I want to add. I think my change in diet had a part to play in the improvement in my eyesight. When I was diagnosed as having glaucoma, I was almost in a diabetic condition and my weight was high. Since then, I have changed my diet completely and my blood pressure and cholesterol have normalized, and I think this has helped my eyes too.

"At that time my pressure in my eyes was 25. I was at his office 2 weeks later; the infection was gone, and the pressure was 21. I continued seeing him at 3-month intervals for 2 years. He never could get the pressure down entirely so he put me on a new medication (can't remember the name of it). It was a dark-colored drop, and real strong; it was 5%. My eyes began watering constantly so badly, I was ashamed to go out in public; he would not reduce it. He said, 'Its got the pressure down and is keeping it down and we are not doing anything to it.'

"He washed out my tear ducts and told me to come back if my eyes watered any more. They watered constantly when using the stuff, so I stopped using it. While my tear ducts were clean I decided to keep them clear. He wanted to make me a tear duct; I said 'No; the ones I have will be O.K., if I quit this medication.'

"I called my daughter in Fort Worth to get me an appointment with a doctor I had heard a lot about. It was three weeks before I could get an appointment (in the meantime I didn't use any drops) and when he took the pressure it was 35. He told me I needed a doctor at home (in Gainesville). I told him yes that's right, and when one comes here I'll use him. It was 2 years before one came and he put me to using Isopto-Carpine 4% but couldn't get the pressure down and then a new medicine came out (Timoptic). He put me on it, 0.5%. It helped more than anything but he told me to also use the Isopto-Carpine 4% along with it; I did.

"But in September last year I ordered the Herbal tea from Dr. Christopher and started using it in October. I used the drops along with it a day or so. The eyewash made my eyes so sore and pus ran out of them and each morning they were stuck up. ROMINE: Well, it never was that way before, so it must have been.

icine for seven years.

He examined it very thoroughly and announced no sign of a cataract!

"The glasses I was wearing were too strong, and he reduced that prescription.

"I did not tell him what I had done, but I did ask him if he knew of anything that could be done to dissolve the cataract once it had formed. He said there was nothing they could do, except surgery!

DUTTON: The rest of my vision is improving, too. I can see clearly enough now to thread needles.


SWANNANOA: How long do you use the eyewash every day?

"About six years ago I developed Sjogren's disease, which is one of the little 'benefits' of rheumatoid arthritis, and means that I had no fluid in my eyes. 'You have to learn to live with it,' was the official medical position. I was told that absolutely nothing could be done to bring back the fluid that dried up in my ducts. That position and my own pain was most uncomfortable to live with.

"Then approximately three years ago I developed a compounded problem; due to the extreme dryness of my eyes I began to get 'pig-tails' on my corneas. Before these were discovered I virtually lived in pain and darkness for about six months—blinking painfully and incessantly and lying in darkness most of the time with a washcloth of ice cubes on my eyes to ease the pain when my eyes were open.

"I thought I had been conditioned to pain as I had had rheumatoid arthritis for 19 years, but this was more than I bargained for. Finally it got so bad I had to go to my opthalmologist who removed several 'pigtails' and bandaged one eye to recuperate. It was fine for a few days, then more 'pig-tails' formed and I had to go back to him every few days to have them removed so that I could see and relieve the pain.

"'Pig-tails' were explained to me as pieces of mucus that form on the cornea; my natural tears would have washed them away, but my dry-eye condition caused them to lodge themselves on the cornea and I could not move my eyes without causing pain and irritation. Each time I blinked I thought I would die. I was told that this condition could cause great eye damage and the medication I used could cause a thinning of the cornea and possible rupture.

"My doctor gave no encouragement and said there was little he could do or anyone could do because once my tear ducts dried up that was it—nevermore tears. I got the strong impression that my doctor and his staff were sick of seeing me there every other day or so and would have loved for me to go to another doctor. The only reason I didn't was that I went through so much with this opthalmologist I thought that he would soon come up with some sort of positive help. I sincerely believe that he was as frustrated as I was.

"Finally he had an out—he was going on vacation he told me and knowing I would need almost daily care, he referred me to a specialist in a large New York City hospital. This was the straw that broke the camel's back; the eye specialist gave me an examination and saw the terrible shape my eyes were in as well as my state of mind. He suggested 'goggles' (a type that kept moisture around the eyes), which might help. However, he had to make a few phone calls to find a pair.

"No amount of wetting solution helped." My husband kept applying ice packs to soothe my eyes, that's how bad they were."

"While we sat there he did make several phone calls but the answer he got each time was that they were no longer manufactured or available. It seemed that modern medicine was referring to tools out of the stone age with those 'goggles' but I was only a patient, so what did I know!

"It was at this point that he suggested soft contact lenses. These he claimed would not allow the eyelid to press against the cornea every time I blinked which was causing the pain. These lenses could be moistened with a solution in the eye as often as needed, thus keeping the eye moist. Well, he did fit me with the soft lenses (non-prescriptive) and told me to wear them, sleep in them and return the next day and he would remove them. He never told me or my husband (who was with me) how to remove them. Since I had to trust him I thought they could remain in my eyes until the next day with no problems. The lenses seemed to help as soon as they were placed in my eyes and I was encouraged for the first time in a long time—until I went to bed that night.

"After a few hours of sleep, I awoke about 3 am because of pain and really bad irritability because of the lenses being in my eyes and drying while I slept. No amount of wetting solution helped. My husband kept applying ice packs to soothe my eyes and frantically tried to reach the specialist—but it was 3 am and we only got his answering service who said the message would be given to him as soon as possible.

"The 'soon as possible' turned out to be 9 am the next morning. We were due at his office at 11 am and so all he said was that he would see us when we got there later. By this time I was tearing my hair out and without eating breakfast we hurried to New York. Once there, he removed the lenses but now we had more trouble—the lenses had scratched the corneas. I would have more pain so he prescribed eye medication. I left his office depressed and one eye bandaged—he could not bandage both because I would not be able to function at all and my state of mind could not tolerate that.

"Even with the medication, it took a while to heal. The specialist said the soft lenses were the answer and told me to go home and rest and when my regular doctor returned from his vacation I should return to him and get a pair of soft contact lenses.

"I was told by both doctors that I could not wear prescriptive contact lenses because they would be too thick and would be too uncomfortable. So, my doctor fitted me with nonprescriptive soft lenses and now I know he really ripped me off. He saw that I was desperate and in agony and seized the opportunity. Initially he told my husband that they would not cost as much as prescription lenses, but when he gave them to me, he said the cost was the same as prescription lenses and charged me \$375.00 for them. This cost was in addition to my almost daily visits (most he termed 'emergency' and charged me more than for a regular visit). Since he could not teach me to insert the lenses myself (my arthritis took a toll on my hands and fingers) he said he would teach my husband to do it for me; the instruction lasted about 5 minutes, and the results were a daily disaster for both myself and my husband. Day after day it became increasingly evident that there had to be a better way!

"My husband is a naturopath, nutrition consultant, and massage therapist and remembered an article about Eyebright. He found Dr. Christopher's article and read what people had to say about Herbal Eyebright benefits. He went to our health food store and brought it home. I immediately began to take it orally and as an eyewash. This couldn't have happened soon enough because now I was suffering infections from the insertion and removal of the lenses. In the mornings I couldn't open my eyes because of the sticky mucus.

The following is a conversation we had with Mrs. Iuppo by phone:

SWANNANOA: Can you briefly describe your case to us?

IUPPO: Well, I had a condition known as Sjogren's Disease. It's one of the side effects of arthritis. It is a drying up of the fluid in the eye, and that's how I developed it.

SWANNANOA: How long did you have it?

IUPPO: About six years.

SWANNANOA: Six years. That's a long time. There was actually no fluid in your eye at all?

IUPPO: That's what the doctor claimed at the time—my opthalmologist.

SWANNANOA: It's amazing how the eye can function at all with very little fluid.

IUPPO: Yes, it is. My husband thought there had to be a different way because he is a naturopath nutrition consultant and he had read about Dr. Christopher's herbal Eyebright. He went out and got that for me; he said, something has got to work. I do have a limited amount of tears. I had been taking homeopathic remedies also, and nutrition, because of the arthritis and this Sjogren's Disease, but the ophthalmologist said at the time that there was nothing he could do, and that was it.

SWANNANOA: What different things had he prescribed?

IUPPO: I had taken all kinds of drugs internally and locally for my eyes, and nothing seemed to work. As a matter of fact, it had gotten worse. And it usually irritated it more than anything else.

SWANNANOA: What were some of the drugs he gave you?

IUPPO: I would have to look back at the names because it's been a long time since I have taken them. I do have some of the things in my medicine chest.

SWANNANOA: And you were using these for about six years?

IUPPO: No, it was six years ago when I developed the disease. About three years ago, as I stated in my letter, I had a compounded problem. Due to the dryness, I had what the doctor termed "pigtails" on my corneas. And this was a result of the dryness I had. The mucus would form and not be able to move, because I had no fluid. The fluid would normally take out anything that entered the eye, or was on the eye. I lived in virtual blindness. I would lie on the couch with ice in a wash-cloth most of the time. In fact I said to him. "Dr. . . . , I need to wash it out with something, can't I just wash my eye?" He said, "No, that wouldn't help you at all."

SWANNANOA: And you did this for three years?

IUPPO: I did it that way for three years, all day long. I was in virtual agony and pain. You can't imagine what it would possibly mean. I could not go out socially. It was just impossible. Every time I blinked my eyes, it was agonizing.

SWANNANOA: So, you really didn't go out for six years then.

IUPPO: Well, during the first three years that I had Sjogren's Disease, I was able to go out on occasion, because when I started taking the homeopathic remedies, my eye problems eased up a little. I could not go places where there was smoke or the lighting was too bright.

SWANNANOA: Did you go to a number of eye doctors, or just one?

IUPPO: No, I went to an ophthalmologist. We live in a small town, and the only ophthalmologist in my town, or anywhere near where we live is the one in the medical building here. And I stayed with him as I stated in my letter, because once you go to someone, you feel that eventually he will find out what is wrong and how to alleviate it or give you some relief. His credentials were very good. He made me come back every other day.

SWANNANOA: So you didn't go to another eye doctor to have it checked out.

IUPPO: Yes, I did. My doctor was getting tired of seeing me come back because he didn't know what to do, but he wouldn't tell me that he didn't know what to do. So he was going on vacation, and he sent me to New York to Columbia Hospital, and give me the name of a specialist there. He told me to go see this man, and I did. The specialist didn't know what to do for me at first. He wanted to give me some sort of goggles that had been used some years ago which would keep fluid in the eye area. They would keep my eyes moist. But they don't make them anymore, or they are not being manufactured, and he couldn't find a pair.

SWANNANOA: Even if they had had them, who would want to wear them in public?

IUPPO: He said he knew the goggles would be unsightly, but that was my only solution.

SWANNANOA: How many people suffer from Sjogren's Disease?

IUPPO: I have found many people who have this condition. It is usually associated with rheumatoid arthritis. However, we have found several people who did not have diagnosed rheumatoid arthritis and did suffer from this disease. Ophthalmologists say that there is nothing they can do for this condition.

SWANNANOA: Is that the official position of the eye profession?

IUPPO: As far as I know, yes. Because there are many artificial fluids out on the market. If you go into a drugstore, you'll see many kinds of artificial fluids on the market now.

SWANNANOA: I wasn't even aware of that.

IUPPO: You go into the drugstore now, and you'll find maybe six or seven different varieties. Now they are not just making them for me. They are making them for a lot of people. And they are very, very expensive.

SWANNANOA: So, these various fluids are for people suffering from different degrees of the same condition?

SWANNANOA: I didn't realize this disease was a problem.

IUPPO: It is a very big problem. I had never known of the name Sjogren's Disease. The only reason the doctor told me about it was because I had applied for insurance. They told me it wouldn't cover an eye examination. So I said to the doctor, "What is it that I have so that I can tell them what it is? They want to know exactly what it is." Then he came out with this

term, Sjogren's Disease and said it's a common outgrowth of rheumatoid arthritis. That's how I found that out; otherwise, he wouldn't have told me that either.

SWANNANOA: Did he tell you anything about the disease?

IUPPO: He said one of the things that could happen with Sjogren's Disease is that you can get infections in your eye, your cornea can become thin, and you may lose your sight.

SWANNANOA: I wonder if that has happened to many people?

IUPPO: That I don't know, and I would hate to find out. It is a problem. That's what we were very worried about.

SWANNANOA: So you were worried about losing your vision.

IUPPO: Of course I was. It was bad enough that I was living in darkness. As a matter of fact, at times I would rather have had no sight at all than the agony and pain that I was in.

SWANNANOA: When you say darkness, do you mean putting the . . .

IUPPO: Yes, I just could not open my eyes. I just had to lie down. And I have a son, a husband, and a home to care for, and it was extremely difficult.

SWANNANOA: You were fortunate that you didn't have to work.

IUPPO: That's right.

SWANNANOA: I don't know what you would have done.

IUPPO: Well, I would have just done what the doctor said, just learned to live with it.

SWANNANOA: So you had to keep your eyes closed during most of the day?

IUPPO: Most of the time, because it was very painful.

SWANNANOA: How did you do anything, such as preparing meals for your husband?

"I could not wear the soft contact lenses for very long because I had no fluid in my eyes. I had to keep putting the saline solution in my eyes, so I could only wear them for four hours a day."

IUPPO: Well, I did it because I'm a very determined person. I knew my responsibilities and I just had to do certain things.

SWANNANOA: Boy, a living Hell for six years. Did you ever wear the goggles?

office, he told me that they didn't make them anymore. Then, at that time, he said, "Well, we'll fit you with contact lenses. They can't be prescriptive because the

prescription would be too thick and it would not serve any purpose." The purpose of the contact lenses is to prevent the eyelid from rubbing against the cornea. But as I said in my letter, they really ripped me off because they knew how much agony I was in. And they took advantage of me.

SWANNANOA: So you wore those contacts for some time. Did that help?

IUPPO: Yes, the contact lenses did help, but I could not put them in myself. They are very tricky. Soft contact lenses are very, very tricky.

SWANNANOA: How long could you wear them at one time?

IUPPO: I could not wear them very long because I had no fluid in my eyes. I had to keep putting the saline solution in at the same time so I could only wear them for a maximum of four hours a day. The lenses would start to get tight in my eyes and become very uncomfortable.

SWANNANOA: I should think you would have been better off just keeping your eyes closed.

IUPPO: You can't go through life with closed eyes. My husband had to put the lenses in for me, and for him to place them in my eyes was very difficult, because normally if you put a contact lens in an eye that has fluid, it does not hurt, scratch, or irritate. When he would put them in my eyes, until I could get enough fluid in my eyes, they would be very uncomfortable, and I would nearly go out of my mind. He would see me very irritated and depressed and every morning was just a terrible thing to wake up to. There had to be a better way. So, he remembered reading about the herbal Eyebright. He went out to the health food store that we deal with and brought it home, and I started taking it from that time on internally, and started making the solution for my eyes. And it started to help.

SWANNANOA: How long after you first used the herbal eyewash did you notice any results?

IUPPO: Well, it took a while at first to get used to the stinging. My eyes were very sore because of the infections. However, within a very short time, I found that the irritability had subsided and the stinging was not as bad, and I didn't rub my eyes as much as a result, and the mucus was removed, so I was more comfortable.

SWANNANOA: So you weren't getting any more "pigtails?"

IUPPO: That's right.

SWANNANOA: When did the moisture come back? **IUPPO:** Well, as time went on, my husband would look

at my eyes, and say, "Your eyes look wet, they look moist." He noticed that there was moisture in my eyes. And the fact that I didn't have to wear my contact lenses so often and that I didn't get the "pigtails" so often, indicated that there must be some sort of lubricant.

He said, "Well, that's only temporary; but," he said, "even that way, you will never have any tears." He couldn't attribute the moisture to anything and he told me it would be just a "temporary thing, same as it always was." At that time, he thought I was wearing the lenses. I wasn't. But he would never have understood. He is a medical doctor, and he wouldn't understand about Eyebright. I just never discussed it with him.

SWANNANOA: So you now have moist eyes?

IUPPO: Yes. I still don't cry tears, you know, abundant tears. That I can't do yet.

SWANNANOA: Can you go out in public?

IUPPO: I'm always out.

SWANNANOA: So, the dryness of your eyes is really no problem for you now?

IUPPO: I have no problem. I drive, I do everything. I'm very active in the community; I'm very active at my husband's office; I'm just a very active person. That's why it hit us so hard when it did happen.

SWANNANOA: It was like getting a new lease on life. You must be in ecstasy.

IUPPO: That's right. And our social life, everything is just different.

SWANNANOA: Do you still use the eyewash?

IUPPO: Yes, I do.

SWANNANOA: Dr. Christopher told a story about a girl who, years ago, couldn't cry at all. Then she used the eyewash, and she could. It sounds like the same situation.

IUPPO: Well, if I get emotional, my eyes will fill up, but I just don't have the abundant tears I did have.

SWANNANOA: I think it is just a matter of time until your eyes will be normally moist.

IUPPO: Probably, probably, but I keep on taking it. I will not stop. As a matter of fact, there are a few times when I have gone off of it, and my eyes have become irritated. We are not sure whether or not it is psychological because I'm so dependent on it.

SWANNANOA: How long do you use the wash every day?

IUPPO: There are quite a few. Since I found out what it was, I have found a lot of people who have had it.

Part V

Questions and Answers on the Herbal Eyewash

When we first published the original eyewash interview in July of 1978, we had no idea that it would generate so many questions. Almost as soon as the interview went out, we started to receive dozens and dozens of questions about the eyewash which had not been covered in the original interview.

The majority of questions centered around the bad reactions people had to the eyewash, so there was no way we could have anticipated these questions. When we published that first interview, we had talked to very few people who had actually used the eyewash. Even Dr. Christopher himself wasn't aware of all the reactions people would have to it since the eyewash had not been used extensively until our readers found out about it.

This past July we took all of the questions we had at the time and we went out to see Dr. Christopher again in Salt Lake City. Dr. Christopher spent an entire day with us discussing the eyewash and he answered every single question we asked him as best as he could. We would like to add that Dr. Christopher was, as usual, extremely kind and patient as he calmly answered question after question on the eyewash.

We returned home to Charlottesville, and we continued to talk to Dr. Christopher for the next 4 months by phone as the questions kept on coming in.

Our aim in publishing these questions and answers was to present to you a practical manual on the eyewash. We wanted you to have—in one place, all of the information you would need to practically use and henefit from the eyewash. We didn't want anyone to have to flip through 6 different issues to find an answer to a question.

Some of these questions may be a bit repetitive, but we tried to make this Report as complete as possible.

Any additional questions our readers may have, will be answered in our second report on the eyewash.

Eyewash Formula

QUESTION: "What is the formula of the herbal eyewash, and in what proportion is each herb?"

P.D. New York, New York

CHRISTOPHER: There are five herbs in the eyewash formula. They are eyebright tea, cayenne pepper, goldenseal tea, bayberry, and red raspberry leaves. Each of the herbs is mixed in equal proportion, except the cayenne pepper. Use ½ part cayenne pepper.

Reader Finds Eyewash Instructions Confusing

QUESTION: "I find the instructions on taking the formula internally very confusing and contradictory. The Newsletter says to take three capsules twice a day. Three capsules make one teaspoon. That would be two teaspoons per day.

"The directions that came with the capsules say to take one capsule three times per day. That would be one teaspoon per day.

"My last order in bulk came in with another set of directions! It says to drink a half a cup of tea with one teaspoon of the formula twice a day. (One teaspoon per cup—drinking half in the morning and half in the evening.)

"Now, when you make a tea out of anything the dregs settle or are strained off—so there is a considerable difference in the amount of the formula taken internally with the tea. This matter should certainly be clarified with more specific instructions."

CHRISTOPHER: The basic system is to make three cups of the eyewash tea a day, with a teaspoon of the eyewash powder per cup. Then strain each cup of tea through some natural fiber like cotton. From each cup take out two full eyeglasses for washing your eyes. Drink the rest. This gives you three washings a day and almost three full cups of tea a day.

If you are using capsules, allow three capsules per teaspoon, as you mentioned. However, as I have mentioned elsewhere, it is generally cheaper to get the eyewash in powder, not capsule, form.

How to Use Eyewash Capsules?

QUESTION: "Do you put the capsules in Distilled H_20 or do you remove the ingredients from the capsules and put them in the water?"

CHRISTOPHER: You remove the ingredients first and put them in the water. But this is an expensive way to make tea. The eyewash in general is much cheaper to use if you buy it in loose form in 4 or 8 ounce bags.

How Long Should One Use the Eyewash?

QUESTION: "I think that Dr. Christopher was not specific enough in his directions. When he says in severe cases you can use the wash five times a day, he did not specify whether that should be 5 minutes each time or 25 minutes total (divided between two eyes, or 5 minutes, or whatever, for each eye 5 times a day, or a total of 50 minutes per day)."

CHRISTOPHER: If you have severe eye problems, you can use the eyewash 5 times a day, for five minutes each time in each eye. This is just a general recommendation. The longer your eye can take the wash, the quicker it will heal. Many people I know have taken the wash up to 7 and 9 times a day, and they have gotten good results. I think this is one case where, within limits, the more you take, the better results you will get. I think this makes sense. If you take the wash for just a few minutes each day, you cannot expect to change a chronic long-term eye problem as quickly as when you use it more.

How Strong Should the Eyewash Be?

QUESTION: "I think better instructions should have been given [to readers] as to how much distilled water should be used. It says a cup, which can mean 6 or 8 ounces. I used 8 ounces the first time, and between 6 and 7 the second time, which may be too strong."

CHRISTOPHER: We use a standard cup measurement which is medically classified as 8 ounces. But regardless of that, you still may have to adjust the concentration until you find a level that suits your own eyes. Every person is different. The best I can do is give the average level and you have to take it from there.

Is Once a Day Soaking of Eyes Enough?

QUESTION: "I soak each eye from 15 to 30 minutes each day. Then maybe I work in another 5 to 10 minutes for each eye later in the day. Will I receive the same results as I would if I were soaking each eye for five minutes at different times during the day?"

CHRISTOPHER: Usually, it is better to soak the eyes several times a day instead of once. But, it's hard to say. You may get just as good results from one long soak, although I doubt it. I'm not really sure.

Eyewash—How Long to Take It

QUESTION: "If the eyes are corrected, do you have to

keep on using the eyewash?"

Indianapolis, Indiana

CHRISTOPHER: No. As soon as the eyes are healed, if you follow a respectable diet, the eyes will take care of themselves. I know people who got rid of their eyeglasses and never had to go back to the eyewash at all. We always teach people to go on a mucusless diet, which means you should avoid eating milk and wheat products. Neither of these foods is good for the eyes.

Burning Sensation

QUESTION: "My wife has been using your eyewash in all different strengths. Sometimes she has had a burning sensation, and at other times she was able to cope with it.

"However, she discovered that the burning sensation had destroyed part of her eyelashes, and subsequently she completely stopped its use.

"Please, I will appreciate it very much if you will advise if she should continue with the use of the eyewash or perhaps other suggestions."

CHRISTOPHER: The burning sensation is caused by the toxic poisons coming out. Some poisons coming from the rectum or vagina or other places can almost eat the skin off. Those toxins are vicious. I've had people who have yelled and screamed so loud that you could hear them a block away when the poisons came out.

When these toxins come out, they come out RED HOT. I have had people who have passed cancerous tumors from the vagina, the urethral tract and the rectum, and they were very uncomfortable when those poisons came out.

Pouches under Eyes

QUESTION: "Pouches have appeared under both eyes since I started to use the herbal eyewash. I hope you can give me some answer on this. All the claims for the eyewash seem to be for special cases only."

CHRISTOPHER: The pouches are liquids or toxic poisons that have come out of the eye. They have accumulated beneath your eye, but they will go away.

You should use the same fomentation that I recommended for the person with puffy eyelids. (Editor: See page 76.)

But don't stop using the eyewash. The people who get results are not special cases—they are just people who use it consistently—both day and night—and who continue using it and don't stop just because they run into problems.

Unfortunately, many people use the eyewash for a few weeks and then they give up for any one of a hundred different reasons. If you are persistent, you WILL get results. I have seen too many successful cases for me to believe otherwise.

Old Glasses Seem a Little Too Strong

QUESTION: "I am fourteen years old and I have been nearsighted for six years. My eyesight has steadily decreased, and now I wear glasses that are quite thick. You couldn't know how happy I was when I read Dr. Christopher's article on Eyebright—I'd resigned myself to the idea of wearing glasses for the rest of my life!

"I started the eyewash and let me tell you, it stings painfully, and after giving up in despair a few times, I

finally settled down to using it twice a day.

"I have been using the eyewash for a few months now, without many results. I noticed that when I put my glasses back on, that they seemed a little too strong, but I suppose that is because my eyes had to get reaccustomed to wearing glasses. I am getting pretty discouraged, and I was wondering if I was doing anything wrong. Does the eyewash work faster if a person is younger or just the opposite?"

CHRISTOPHER: I might be wrong, but I think you are wearing glasses that are too strong for you. I think your eyes are getting stronger. It is true that young people generally can get faster results than older people, but this wouldn't be true in all cases. If you want your FULL eyesight back, you'll have to keep at it for longer than just a few months.

Eyewash Causes Eyes to Become Sensitive to Light

QUESTION: "The eyewash has helped me a lot. I can see at night better than I can ever remember, so I can drive at night without being so scared.

"Also, I can see to read and thread needles!!!!

"My contacts don't hurt me as much. They were getting so I could hardly wear them.

"Although, my eyes do seem sensitive to light now. The sun hurts and bright light hurts. Maybe my eyes are just letting in more light now and I will adjust."*

CHRISTOPHER: That film in the eyes has protected the eyes from the sun. Now, it is just a question of the eyes getting accustomed to the sun again. But that was some letter. It is so nice to hear about people having beneficial results.

Will Eyewash Eliminate Floaters in 3-4 Weeks?

QUESTION: "Dr. Christopher mentioned that usually the eyewash will eliminate the floaters within 3-4 weeks. Is there, in my case, any chance that they might disappear if I continue the eyewash, even if I do it only for this reason? I have used the eyewash for 4 months."

CHRISTOPHER: You must keep at it for a lot longer than 4 months. Every case is different. Yes, some people have eliminated their floaters in 3-4 weeks, but everyone is different.

Nearsightedness Does NOT Improve

QUESTION: "When I read about the remarkable results people had gotten from using your herbal eyewash, I decided that my case would be an easy one to cure, since my nearsightedness is relatively mild and I have worn glasses for only 15 years.

"I began using the eyewash last November, washing 3 times a day as you suggested. I started with a formula of 2 capsules per cup of distilled water and increased the strength to 3 capsules per cup 2-3 months ago.

"Sometimes people will use the eyewash for an entire year with no results at all—and then all of a sudden their eyes will heal completely. This is exactly why you should stick with the eyewash and never give up."




"After six months of this business, I have come to the conclusion that this is like most miracle cures: while they bring forth fantastic results in some people, they simply do not work for everyone. I know natural methods take time. That is why I have given the eyewash a half a year to 'prove' itself. I was not waiting for an overnight improvement, but since I cannot perceive even a slight gradual one, I feel I am wasting my time and money on this eyewash.

"The eyewash probably did help eliminate the black 'floaters' that come occasionally as a result of eyestrain at work. Is my lack of success unusual?"

CHRISTOPHER: Many people have to use the eyewash for one and even two FULL years before they can get any results. The person in this letter has only used it for six months.

The people that really value their eyesight will wait patiently for years to get back their sight. I guess it is like putting good food in front of a person who is not hungry. I know many, many people who put up with all the pain and tears and pus, and everything else, and they finally were able to get positive results. But, it took time. There is just no way around it.



Eyewash Irritates Eyelids

QUESTION: "In response to your request for reactions on the Christopher herbal eyewash, I report that I ordered and received what was prescribed and used it for a short time. I found, however, that it did not work in my case. It irritated my eyelids so badly that I had to discontinue it entirely."

CHRISTOPHER: Yes, this is just the toxic poisons coming out.

SWANNANOA: We are just amazed at how many different and varied reactions people have to the eyewash.

CHRISTOPHER: Oh, yes. Weakness in the human body varies from one person to another.

Nearsightedness and Allergy Condition

QUESTION: "When visual problems, such as nearsightedness, are complicated by allergy conditions affecting the eyes, can the herbal eyewash still be an effective remedy? The allergy conditions referred to are a general type and include hypersensitivity to certain types of pollen, food substances and dust."

CHRISTOPHER: If you have an allergy condition, you should also take the lower bowel formula to clean out your intestine. You have to get those toxins out of your body. There is too big a load to be carried out through your eyes. Try to avoid all milk products and all wheat products. And most important, try to drink at least a gallon of distilled water every day, and, of course, take the eyewash as often as you can. If you have had the nearsightedness for some time, you will have to be very patient, but you WILL get results. You just have to stick with it.

Floater Forms in Eye

QUESTION: "A not-so-good thing happened to me while I was using the eyewash, and it may not have been caused by it. A large floater appeared in my left eye and has not left after several months. My doctor tells me that it probably will never leave and that he does not know what causes floaters.

"After the floater appeared, I quit the eyewash, and the blurring of my eyes returned. After using the eyewash again for two days, the blurring disappeared again."

CHRISTOPHER: Floaters are usually caused by the transverse colon being plugged up. There are two drainage ducts from the eyes to the transverse colon.

Whenever the transverse colon gets plugged up, it plugs these drainage canals.

So I would recommend that this person take the lower bowel formula to clean themselves out.

SWANNANOA: How do you know that there are drainage ducts from the eye to the intestine?

CHRISTOPHER: I don't know for sure, but some doctors have told me this.

SWANNANOA: Have you ever had any patients who got rid of floaters after they went on the lower bowel formula?

CHRISTOPHER: Yes, along with the eyewash.

Eyewash Causes Pus in Eyes

QUESTION: "I used the eyewash for two months, but I finally had to give up—my eyes became so sore, I couldn't keep it up.

"I diluted the solution to one half, and it still just burned so badly I gave up. When I first started using it, the pus, in the morning especially, was quite heavy; and after about two weeks, it was less and less."

CHRISTOPHER: The eyewash is a "cell proliferant." It causes the good cells to grow rapidly, and this pushes off the bad cells. This is a common reaction. I would advise to just keep on with the eyewash. This is the only way you can get results. You can't expect results if you don't consistently use it. The eyewash may burn the eyes, and it may be temporarily very painful, but it will never harm the eyes.

If this person stops the eyewash, he will have that pus in his safety deposit box all his life.

Eyewash Causes Pain in Groin

QUESTION: "About Dr. Christopher's herbal eyewash: I have cataracts, not too bad yet. I started the eyewash 2 times a day and the capsules 2 times a day. After a while, I got a pain in my groin on the right side. I stopped the capsules and the pain went away. I started the capsules again and the pain came back, so I quit.

"After about six months I happened to discover that my eyesight was definitely worse. I had such high hopes. So now I have stopped all; am looking for something else to try."

CHRISTOPHER: This is the first case I have ever heard of in which the eyewash caused a pain in the groin. As I said in one of the other questions, I would imagine that this person is not in the best of health. When a person is weak, taking even small amounts of anything new to the body will cause problems.

Can Eyewash Make Eye Diseases Worse?

QUESTION: "We would like very much to know if there is any kind of eye disease that the wash would make worse."

CHRISTOPHER: None that we know of.

Evewash "Burns" Eyes Terribly

QUESTION: "I have tried Dr. Christopher's Herbal Eyewash (4 times) and I couldn't bear with it. It was so painful that I had to discontinue it. What does this mean? I want to believe in the tea, but I just cannot do it.

"Maybe if I can dilute it more? The tea burns my eyes terribly. Please help."

CHRISTOPHER: The cayenne pepper in the eyewash brings the toxins out and causes the pain. But it is the FEAR of the cayenne that causes the most problems. It is this fear that has stopped many, many people from getting well. The ones that have gotten the best results are the ones that have eliminated any fear from their thoughts.

Undissolved Cayenne Pepper in Eye

QUESTION: "I was very anxious about using the eyewash to improve my eyesight. I followed the directions carefully, and for 2 days everything went well. But on the third day, my eye became irritated and my eyelids became red and swollen. Having complete faith in the eyewash, I used it one more time, but my eye worsened. I thought it would clear up in a couple of days, but it didn't.

"After several days, I became worried and went to see an eye doctor, telling him I had gotten some cayenne pepper in my eye. He gave me some drops and it cleared up in a few days. Now I'm fearful about using it again.

"This affected only one eye, so there must have been some undissolved cayenne that got into the one eye, though I had carefully strained it. Not realizing this, I washed the affected eye and it worsened. Please comment."

CHRISTOPHER: As I have said over and over again, I think the toxins that are already in your eye are irritating it. Cayenne pepper cannot hurt your eye in any manner. I had one of my students throw cayenne pepper right in his eye in front of a large audience, just to show that it was harmless. Tears came into his eyes, but when he finally opened them, they were clear and sparkling. Cayenne can be painful, as many of you know, but it cannot do any harm.

Eyes Have Yellowish Cast

QUESTION: "I have been taking the eyewash three times a day since June 30th. My right eye (the better one) is especially painful and sensitive to the wash and has been somewhat bloodshot since I began using the eyewash. My eyes seem to have a yellowish cast. The white is no longer clear as it used to be. This morning when I awoke, both eyes were extremely bloodshot to the point of appearing that I have a 'pinkeye.'

"Is this a normal reaction that I can expect to clear up?"

CHRISTOPHER: Your eyes have to get worse before they will get better. I think what is causing your problem is a poor liver. If you take my liver-gall bladder combination, you should get some relief. You should take no less than two tablets, three times a day. And I can't stress enough the importance of taking the lower bowel formula. If you can improve the liver and your intestine, your eyes should become less and less yellow.

Dry Eyes

QUESTION: "I have tried the eyewash for about 6 months. I got quite a bit of mucus but discontinued using it after my eyes started feeling very dry from it. What was causing the dryness? Would it be beneficial for me to start using it again?"

CHRISTOPHER: Absolutely. Go ahead and use it again and get those tear ducts going. I've never heard of it causing dryness. The eyes might become drier, but this will be only temporary. This is only part of the cleansing routine.

If a person has dry eyes, this indicates he needs the eyewash more than ever. Also, a person with dry eyes should step up his water intake. He should try his best to drink a gallon of water a day.

Just one more thing I use for patients with dry eyes is unsalted sunflower seeds. The natural oils in the seeds are good for dry eyes.

[Editors' Note: We just talked to a Mrs. Howard from Fayetteville, North Carolina, who says that when her eyes became dry, she used the eyewash for several days and the natural moisture came back.]

Please check with your eye doctor

before using the herbal eyewash.

Diseased Vitreous and
Perforated Corneas

QUESTION: "I have a friend who has been told by her doctor that she has a diseased vitreous of the eye and also perforated corneas. She would like to know if it would be safe for her to use the herbal eyewash on her eyes."

CHRISTOPHER: I think there is hope. I would use the herbal eyewash as a fomentation over the eye. Just soak some cotton cloth in the wash and then place it over the closed eye. It will go right through the skin and be absorbed.

Damaged Optical Nerve

QUESTION: "I'm writing for a friend of mine who went blind about 10 years ago. He was working as a logger when a tree hit the back of his head. Pressure damaged the optical nerve. He has been operated on. At the present time, he can see only high lights. Do you think the Eyebright could restore his sight?"

CHRISTOPHER: After the operation, we can't promise anything. It may work or it may not. After a man has worked on the area, we don't know what he's done. There's always a possibility. It won't do your friend any harm, and it may help.

SWANNANOA: What if the optical nerve was cut? Could a person regain their sight in a case like that?

CHRISTOPHER: Yes, definitely so.

SWANNANOA: Have you ever heard of a case like that?

CHRISTOPHER: Yes, we have even had a case where the spinal nerve was cut and it was rebuilt. We had one fellow that was paralyzed from the waist down. He followed my "incurable" program, and he is no longer paralyzed from the waist down. You just have to give the good Lord a chance.

Cataracts Already Removed

QUESTION: "I would like to know if the herbal eyewash can be used if a person has had cataracts removed from the eyes."

CHRISTOPHER: Yes, we have had many people use the eyewash after they have had their cataracts removed.

Glaucoma Operation Causes Blisters

QUESTION: "My sister had a glaucoma operation on both eyes, which resulted in blisters on her eyes. She's afraid of getting infection if she uses the eyewash, and should infection occur, she cannot tolerate cortisone. Would the eyewash dissolve the blisters? How would she prevent any infection?"

CHRISTOPHER: If she gets an infection, it is an infection that is *already* there. The eyewash does not carry infection. But if any infection does come out, it will not damage the eye.

As far as the blisters go, that is something new to me.

Eyebright Capsules Give Reader Diarrhea

QUESTION: "Unfortunately, I cannot take the capsules or tea internally, although I have tried to at various intervals. Just one capsule gives me diarrhea. Since I can't take the herbs internally, I'm wondering if I am wasting my time just using the eyewash. I'm wondering what will happen if I stop."

CHRISTOPHER: This is an unusual thing. He has a bad physical condition. If he has diarrhea from just taking a few Eyebright capsules, his bowels are in serious condition. I would recommend that he go on the full mucusless diet, along with a three-day cleansing program.

Will Eyewash Help Corneal Transplant?

QUESTION: "Is it advisable to use the herbal eyewash if one has had a corneal transplant?"

CHRISTOPHER: We have had a few such cases, but what the results are I cannot tell you.

Eyewash Causes Blackout in Eye

QUESTION: "I started using your eyewash on May 21, 1978. I felt my eyes getting clearer, and I continued using it.

"On July 17, about two weeks after I started the eyewash, I had a sudden blackout of my right eye and lost sight in that eye.

"On July 23, I went to the eye doctor. He said I had a vitreous hemorrhage of the right eye. Is it possible that the eyewash caused this?

"July 26 I started to have mucus and pus in the left (good) eye; on the 27th also in the blind (right) eye.

"Dear Doctor, please send me some word as to what is the best to do. Shall I continue using the eyewash? Is there any chance of my sight returning?"

CHRISTOPHER: I feel that the blackout happened "in spite of" and NOT "because of" the eyewash. The eyewash can do nothing but good in strengthening and rebuilding the eye area. I don't know what condition your body is in, but I would suspect that you need to go on a good nutritional diet and a good cleansing program. I have noticed again and again over the years, that people with healthy bodies have much less problem with the eyewash than people who have neglected their health.

Eyewash Causes Tearing

QUESTION: "I would like to report that after using the eyewash for a few months, my better eye began to tear and is still tearing. Should I continue to use the eyewash?"

CHRISTOPHER: Yes, absolutely. The tearing is just a normal reaction. It is just the toxic poisons coming out.

SWANNANOA: Why do some people have mucus and some people tears?

CHRISTOPHER: I think you will find out that it produces tears with everybody, eventually. Many people don't tear in the beginning because the tear ducts have been clogged.

We had an interesting story where a young lady came to me and said that she could never cry. I immediately put her on the herbal eyewash, and within no time, she was the happiest lady you ever saw. She said that she could cry at will.

Doctor Claims Mucus Is Really Body's Defense against Cayenne Pepper

QUESTION: "A number of doctors have told me that rather than the poisons being thrown out as stated in the article, the mucus-like stuff glueing the eyes shut during the night was made up of white corpuscles, which the body sent out to defend itself from the invader which, in this case, was the cayenne pepper among other things."

CHRISTOPHER: That's absolutely ridiculous. I've never heard that argument before.

SWANNANOA: Let's just say that the outpouring of mucus is the body's method of protecting itself from cayenne pepper. If this gets the kind of results we have reported in this issue, then what's the problem?

Woman Wants to Continue Using Weakened Solution of Eyewash

QUESTION: "My question is—should I continue the eyewash in a weakened solution? If I don't dilute the eyewash, it really burns. I don't mind the discomfort for a while, if I know I'm doing the right thing."

CHRISTOPHER: There are so many thousands of people who are taking that discomfort and they are getting results. If you want your eyesight back, you will have to put up with a little discomfort. So keep up with the eyewash. Of course, I think it will take you *longer* to get back your sight if you use a diluted solution.

Eyesight Gets Worse After Using Eyewash

QUESTION: "After I used the herbal eyewash, I found that I was no longer able to read store labels or prices, or simply sign my name without putting on my glasses. My vision has definitely deteriorated, even in my good eye. My question is: Should I resume the eyewash treatment?"

CHRISTOPHER: You certainly should. The eyes have to get worse before they get better. In some people the eyes get a lot worse than others, but the eyes will always get better. When all the mucus and toxins come out, the sight will improve. I can assure you.

Reader Has Hard Time Getting Glass Eyecup

QUESTION: "The instructions call for a glass eyecup. Every druggist tells me to look for one in an antique shop—there's no such thing any more—only plastic. That's what I'm using. What's the story? Can any of your readers get glass eyecups? If so, please let me know."

CHRISTOPHER: We sell the glass cups at our Herb Shop. I'm surprised to hear that they are often hard to obtain. I thought that most drug stores did carry them.

Eyewash Tea Causes High Blood Pressure

QUESTION: "I have discontinued the eyewash because the ingestion of your formula caused high blood pressure.

"Please note that my blood pressure has always been normal. Since I discontinued the eyewash (after about two months), my blood pressure is again normal. I am 70 years old."

CHRISTOPHER: I have never heard of a case like this. This is a very, very rare case. We have a formula of cayenne and garlic which helps to keep the blood pressure down. You should take from one to three teaspoons a day.

Can Eyewash Help Cataract 'Inside' the Eye?

QUESTION: "Could you do me a favor: I would like to know from Dr. Christopher if he has had any users of the eyewash who have experienced a cure of the type of cataract which obscures the lens itself? Mention was made in his Newsletter article of the sloughing off of the


type which grows on the *outside* of the eye, but nothing specifically was said about the internal lens type."

CHRISTOPHER: We have had success with both types. The eyewash will help a cataract, even if it is on the inside of the eye.

Will Eyewash Be Safe for Eye with Lens Implant?

QUESTION: "I am interested in using the herbal eyewash for my eyes. However, last November I had cataract surgery and a lens implant in my right eye. Had I known about the Eyebright, I would not have had the surgery. My question is this: Is it safe for me to use Eyebright in the left eye? Is it safe for me to use Eyebright in the eye that was operated on? I would like to

discuss this with the doctor who operated, but I know doctors are not interested in vitamins, herbs, etc. I would like to use Eyebright in both eyes, but dare not until I know no harm would result to my eyes or the implant."

CHRISTOPHER: I cannot answer whether the eyewash will be safe for an implanted lens or not. I have never had a case like that.

How Can Eyewash Taken Internally Help the Eyes?

QUESTION: "I am confused about Dr. Christopher's statement that one must drink or take 3 capsules of the formula internally every day. Please have him explain the 'what' and 'why' of this. How can it help the eyes by going into the stomach?"

CHRISTOPHER: The human body is computerized, and those herbs that are good for a certain area like the lungs, the heart, the kidney, will go to that certain area. In this case, the herbs will travel to the eye. We have had a few cases where a person only took the Eyebright tea internally, and they still got results. Of course, it takes longer than if you used the tea externally, but it still works.

Needs Help for Ingrown Eyelashes

QUESTION: "A customer said, 'Every two months I have to go to the eye doctor to have about 5-10 ingrown eyelashes pulled out. They grow down under the eyelid and scratch the eye.' I promised her I would ask you about it."

CHRISTOPHER: No, I've never heard that one before. I can't give an answer to that one.

Will Eyewash Restore Lost Central Vision?

QUESTION: "Three years ago, my husband had a sun stroke working in our garden in over 100 degree heat. Several months later, he lost his central vision in one eye. Now this past December, he lost the vision in the other eye. He is desperate, not being able to see to do things around the house and yard."

CHRISTOPHER: The eyewash can only do good. It can do no harm. I would certainly recommend that your husband try it.

Will Eyewash Remove Scar in Back of Eye?

QUESTION: "I just learned about your herbal eye-

wash. My husband had a cataract operation and an implant, but he has a scar in the back of the eye from a broken blood vessel or hardening of the arteries. Will your eyewash help to dissolve the scar? He can't get glasses, on account of the scar."

CHRISTOPHER: It will, but it takes a long period of time. I have known cases where scars definitely diminished in size. The eyewash is a cell proliferant. It causes new cells to grow, and at the same time it pushes old cells off.

Can Eyewash Help Ruptured Blood Vessels?

QUESTION: "My husband lost his eyesight last May. The doctor said the blood vessels behind his eyes ruptured, and the blood seeped into the gel between the retina and the eye and has blocked out all his vision. Do you think the herbal eyewash would give him back his sight?"

CHRISTOPHER: Yes, as long as he, in addition, takes cayenne orally in a glass of water. He should work up gradually to a teaspoon three times a day. He should start with a quarter of a teaspoon and work up from there. The cayenne is what stops hardening of the arteries because it rebuilds the veinal structure.

Also, in that type of condition, he should not consume salt at all. Salt can cause blindness over a period of time because it is hard on the eye arteries.

He should definitely use the eyewash several times a day. We have had cases in which a person has regained his sight back after a ruptured artery, but this does not happen in every case.

Eyewash Causes Sight to Get Worse

QUESTION: "I did want to write someone about the eyewash. I have been using myself as a guinea pig and have religiously followed the instructions for the Eyebright eyewash.

"I seem to be having trouble seeing even bridge cards across the table and street signs, even in the daytime, where before I didn't even use glasses, except for reading. CHRISTOPHER: It certainly should. You just have a lot of toxins which are apparently coming out in liquid form and are then crystalizing.

Will Cayenne Damage the Kidneys?

QUESTION: "Once the herbs which make up the eyewash are strained through sterilized cotton, will the cayenne pepper remain a threat to people who have kidney stones? Doctors say avoid pepper at all times. I would appreciate Dr. Christopher's comments."

Hardening of the Eye Arteries

CHRISTOPHER: Yes, it will. The eyewash will soften the arteries. Please try to drink as much distilled water as you can. A gallon a day is fine.

Puffy Eyelids from Eyewash

QUESTION: "The only problem I have with the eyewash is that in the morning when I arise, and for two to three hours (sometimes more), my upper eyelids are

badly swollen and puffy. I find the heaviness distracting, and, of course, the drooping eyelids are not particularly esthetic. Is there anything I can do about this condition? I had it only to a minor degree in one eye, but now after taking the eyewash, it is severe in both eyes."

CHRISTOPHER: It will eventually go away when the eye is healed. In the meantime, you can use a fomentation of 3 parts mullein, 3 parts red raspberry leaf, and 1 part lobelia. This will draw the water out.

QUESTION: "Is it safe to take the Eyebright capsules if I'm pregnant? I had just started using the eyewash and taking the capsules when I discovered that I was pregnant. I hope it did no harm."

CHRISTOPHER: Yes, it is safe. It can do no harm.

Goldenseal and Intestinal Bacteria

QUESTION: "My health food store says that goldenseal destroys intestinal bacteria—the good ones, as well as the bad ones. This makes me wonder if it is advisable to take the eyewash capsules."

CHRISTOPHER: The eyewash formula has goldenseal in it, but it is in a formula where it does its job without any bad response. Too much goldenseal by itself can cause health problems, but in the eye combination with four other herbs, it is completely safe.

Astigmatism

QUESTION: "Is the herbal eyewash beneficial to someone with astigmatism?"

CHRISTOPHER: Yes, it can be very beneficial. But you have to be patient. Astigmatism is generally long-standing, and it will take some time to heal it. But the eyewash will work.

Ruptured Blood Vessel

QUESTION: "My sister in Fresno began to use your eyewash but had to quit because her eyes became so bloodshot and a blood vessel ruptured in one eye. Is this a normal reaction?"

CHRISTOPHER: At times this does happen when there is a calcium deficiency. You should take the calc

tea combination. A number of people to whom this has happened have come to me and said the eyewash ruptured their blood vessels. The condition of weak vessels was there long before they took the eyewash.

If you take the calcium combination (calc tea) as directed on the label, you should be able to receive some help, but don't just rely on one herbal combination. You should also eat a good diet with plenty of fresh garden vegetables. Herbs should never be a substitute for a good diet.

Is Boiled Tap Water OK for Eyewash?

QUESTION: "Is it all right to use boiled tap water for the eyewash solution, instead of distilled water?"

CHRISTOPHER: You can't boil all the minerals out of the tap water, nor can you destroy all the bacterial toxins it may contain. However, if you can't get distilled water, boiled tap water could suffice.

Eyes Smarting from Eyewash

QUESTION: "I expected the eyewash to sting for the first few days, but after two weeks, it is still stinging as bad as before. Could I be damaging my eyes?"

CHRISTOPHER: No, the eyewash cannot damage the eyes in any way. The smarting is just part of the procedure.

Sties in Eye from Eyewash

QUESTION: "After using the eyewash for about one month, I got a sty in my eye. After it appeared, I reduced the concentration of the eyewash to one-half of what it was before, and the sty disappeared. Then, after anothemonth, I got another sty. This has happened to my brother and me about three or four times.

"I really want to continue using the eyewash to improve my eyesight. I had made progress, as my eye were 'stuck together' when I woke up in the morning.

"What do you suggest to prevent getting any more sties so that I can continue to use the eyewash?"

Thinning Cornea

QUESTION: "I have had keratoconus (bulging, this ning cornea) for 29 years. I have had the best doctor

who have done all they can for me . . . short of corneal transplant. Is this treatment safe for thin corneas? They have warned me for the past eleven years or more that they can very easily rupture due to the thinness of them."

CHRISTOPHER: I can't see why the eyewash should do you any harm. It should only strengthen your eyes because it's merely a food to rebuild areas of the eyes that are suffering. However, in your case, it would be better to go carefully and to dilute the eyewash to a weak solution until you are used to it.

Eyewash without Cayenne?

QUESTION: "I am extra sensitive to any kind of stimulant and realized that the cayenne was probably too strong for me. When I used the eyewash at any time after 12 noon, I lay awake all night feeling just as stimulated as if I had drunk a cup of coffee.

"So I got the other herbs from the health food store and made up the eyewash without it. Will this help?"

CHRISTOPHER: I can't guarantee the eyewash without the cayenne. If it is too stimulating, use it earlier in the day; and if that doesn't work, dilute it before using it.

Stringy Mucus

QUESTION: "I am writing for a friend who has been using the eyewash for 5 months. What alarmed her was something that felt like threads on her eyes. Her daughter used a Q-tip, and it came off her eye in a long string. Is this unusual? Should she continue to use the eyewash?"

CHRISTOPHER: This is not unusual. Many people experience strings of mucus coming out of their eyes. It's all part of the cleansing process.


Cataracts Removed—Still Hope?

Using the Same Eyewash for Each Eye

Stitches in Retina



QUESTION: "Must the eyewash be cooled before using it?"

Plastic Eyecups

QUESTION: "Are plastic eyecups OK to use?"

CHRISTOPHER: The glass eyecup is far superior to plastic. Under no conditions should you use aluminum eyecups.

Can Eyewash Stain Eyes?

QUESTION: "I have used the eyewash 3 times daily for my cataracts. Many times the eyewash drippings will stain my cloth and the sheets. I cannot remove the stains. Will the eyewash stain the eyes in the same manner?"

Question on Cataracts

QUESTION: "Dr. Christopher describes a particular case in which a woman removed both cataracts with the rinse of the herbal eyewash. I understood that when the cataract is removed, the lens goes with it. Is this true only when surgically removed?"

Jelly-like Substance in Back of Eye

QUESTION: "I have developed a problem with my eye, and I would like to know if anything can be done to help.

"In the back hemisphere of the eye, there is a jellylike substance that, instead of being like HARD jello, is mushy. Two eye doctors have said the same thing. When I move my head, I see spots and sometimes sparks to the left of my eye. I am willing to try anything. Can you help me?"

CHRISTOPHER: I have never heard of a case like that, so it would be hard for me to comment on it. If you can take the eyewash without discomfort, you may be able to be helped. But never give up! I have seen many people get well from "incurable" conditions that even I didn't think were possible. So I'll be praying for you, Marie.

How Long To Use Eyewash?

QUESTION: "My husband, who has cataracts on one eye, has been faithful in using the eyewash—but that has been for only 6 weeks. We have to be patient. HERE IS WHAT WE DO WANT DR. CHRISTOPHER TO GO INTO. HOW LONG SHOULD WE USE THE ONE BATCH OF EYEWASH??? In other words, we make up a batch of the eyewash—whether it be a cup or ½ cup—how long should we continue to use that before we make up another batch???"

CHRISTOPHER: You should make up a batch of eyewash once a day and use it the same day. You should not keep it longer than one day.

Granules in Eye

QUESTION: "I have been using Dr. Christopher's eyewash approximately 2-3 months, with no specific results. Granules in the eye are formed overnight when used at bedtime. I believe this is the *tea* sedimentation, not mucus or waste matter as suggested!"

QUESTION: "What is the rationale for using the product as an eyewash as opposed to an eyedrop? Most of the preps are drops, and I hardly ever fill prescriptions for washes, which are usually intended for the physical flushing out of impediments in the eye. On the other hand, drops put enough of the active ingredient in the eye to do the job. My point is, it would seem like a waste of the product to use it as a wash if a few drops would do the job. Most of the wash ends up spilling down the face, anyway. At least it did for me. Also, why can't the Eyebright capsules be simply swallowed instead of making them into a tea?"

CHRISTOPHER: If the eyewash is used properly, it will NOT spill down the face. A few drops are simply not enough. They just won't do the job. It is important to take the capsules, but the wash works many times faster. The wash filters directly into the eye and this is why it is so effective.

"Gritty" Substance Comes out of Eye

QUESTION: "Several members of our family use the eyewash. On awakening in the morning, many of us complain of sticky eyelashes, and we also complain of a gritty substance on them which does not remove easily. Also, all of us complain of itching."

CHRISTOPHER: The gritty substance is mucus that hardens into what we call "sleepy sand." This is very beneficial because it shows that the eye is starting to clear out. The itching is just a matter of toxins. This frequently occurs when those toxins come out.

Does the Eye Absorb the Eyewash?

QUESTION: "Is it possible for the eye to absorb the eyewash solution for 5 minutes at a time?"

CHRISTOPHER: Yes. The more you use it, the more of the eyewash will be absorbed in the eye. If you use the eyewash for 5 minutes at a time, this is plenty of time for a good amount of eyewash to be absorbed.

Cross-Eyedness

QUESTION: "Will the eyewash correct crosseyedness?"

CHRISTOPHER: With cross-eyedness, I recommend the full eyewash program, both internally and externally. We also include a program of putting B&B tincture in the ear. This herbal solution feeds the motor nerves near the eye and in back of the medulla. The eyewash will strengthen the muscles connected to the eyes and this is one of the main problems with cross-eyedness. I have also heard of cross-eyedness being cured by a cranial technique. I used to know a man that moved a certain spot inside the mouth and the cross-eyedness would improve almost immediately.

If you decide to use the B&B tincture alone with the eyewash, you should use a few drops inside the ear every night for six nights and then take a night off. You should also rub a little of the tincture on the back of the neck.

Stronger Solution

QUESTION: "I could tolerate a stronger solution than the 1 tablespoon per cup of distilled water. Would that be beneficial?"

CHRISTOPHER: Yes, it would. Absolutely. I have had people who took the eyewash every hour of the day in strong concentrations, and they got faster results.

Eyes Improve—Then Don't Get Better

QUESTION: "After two weeks of faithful application of the herbal eyewash and taking the capsules, I could read some newsprint and store labels without reading glasses. Needless to say, I was thrilled.

QUESTION: "My family carries a hereditary eye disease called Retinitis Pigmentosa. Does Dr. Christopher have any record of the eyewash helping someone with this disease? Could it harm you?"

Diabetic with Cataracts

QUESTION: "I am a diabetic with cataracts. I use the eyewash and take the Eyebright combination capsules. Should I take the pancreas tea capsules instead of the Eyebright capsules, or should I alternate them?"

Eyewash Price Seems High

QUESTION: "The eyewash price quoted from the Herb Shop in Utah seems HIGH. Can't you suggest a less expensive source? (All of us are not wealthy, you know. Those who live on fixed incomes can have trouble making ends meet.)"

CHRISTOPHER: We have kept the price as low as we can and still survive.

[Editors' note: We feel Dr. Christopher is correct. The price really isn't that high. We figured the price if you buy the herbs in bulk and then mix them yourself, and you really don't save much at all. Plus, you have to spend all that time mixing each of the herbs. And then, what would a person do with ten pounds of the eyewash?]

NO Improvement with Eyewash

QUESTION: "I started taking Dr. Christopher's herbal eyewash on Dec. 26, 1978. I took it at least three times a day. I have also been taking the capsules internally. So far, 'NO Improvement of Eyesight.' I saw Dr. Christopher at a lecture and told him my problem, and he said that it could take from 1-2 years to notice any improvement. With faith and hope, I am awaiting an answer."

CHRISTOPHER: Yes, that's right, it can take one or two years. Many people have had their problems for years and years. It can take time to rebuild the eye. I have had many cases where the eyewash would not work for 6 or 8 months, and then all of a sudden people would notice an immediate improvement. We knew of a fellow who had a cataract, and he took the eyewash for almost an entire year with no success. Then all of a sudden, his cataract cleared completely. And then I had a case where a cataract cleared in 7 days. There are no two people alike. You just have to have faith and NEVER give up.

Hereditary Focal Problems

QUESTION: "Does the eyewash correct hereditary problems?"

K.I. Corona, New York

CHRISTOPHER: Yes, but it takes longer on focal problems. It's a rebuilding job. I do believe that weaknesses in the eyes can be passed down from generation to generation. But you CAN overcome these weaknesses, no matter how serious they are. When you feed and clean the eyes, they will become better, no matter how weak they may be. You can rebuild weak eyes. I've just heard of a girl in southern Utah who had polio. She had one leg that was 4 inches shorter than the other one. By using my "incurable" program, especially the bone, flesh and cartilage formula, she now has two legs that are of equal length. So if herbs can rebuild the bone, I'm sure they can rebuild the eyes. I know they can, because I've seen it happen so many times.

Eyewash for Young People

QUESTION: "Does the eyewash benefit the young as much as the old?"

CHRISTOPHER: Definitely. It works faster on the young.

Retinal Hemorrhage

QUESTION: "My husband had a retinal hemorrhage and has only about 30% vision. We would like to know if Dr. Christopher's eyewash will help restore his vision. He had the hemorrhage about 14 months ago."

CHRISTOPHER: Yes, the eyewash can help; you just have to give it a chance. Your husband should also take a whole gallon of distilled water every day in addition to the eyewash tea. Distilled water helps because it flushes out many wastes in the eye so the veins will become healthier. The distilled water also takes many inorganic minerals out of the body. I'm sold on distilled water because I'm not in a wheelchair anymore. It helped me and I still take it, just about every single day.

Eyewash for Pets

QUESTION: "Are there any specific recommendations Dr. Christopher can give for my little dog? I love the little fellow and desire so much to have his sight return, if there's any way to do it. I hope you can help

me. One herbalist for dogs does not feel dogs should be given cayenne pepper; yet Dr. Christopher says this is a most important part of the formula."

CHRISTOPHER: We have had many people who have treated their dogs and cats with the eyewash. You can give it to them in a liquid form with their meals or put it in an eyedropper and put a few drops in the eye. Preferably you should use them both.

Red-hot Feeling in Eyes

QUESTION: "I have been using Dr. Christopher's Herbal Eyewash... off and on for over six months. The reason for the OFF is: my right eye cannot get accustomed to the feeling that a red-hot wire has been jabbed in my eyeball. The feeling is for a second or so, but the pain is awful.

"My eyes feel so great AFTER I have gone through this, I cannot give it up completely.

"Ask Dr. Christopher if my right eye will ever become accustomed to the eyewash. I only use half-strength as it is and use it 3 times a day. What am I doing wrong?"

CHRISTOPHER: You are doing nothing wrong. This has happened to a number of people. There is evidently some irritated nerve in there. You might try diluting it a little further and hope that this will help. Most of the people I have talked to have eventually become accustomed to the eyewash, but there are a few that always have problems.

Two things that might help you are my calc tea formula and my nervine formula. Both of these herbal products will help you to rebuild your nerves. You should take 2 cups of both of these teas every day. You can also take them in capsule form, if you like.

Cysts on Eyelid

QUESTION: "Dear Dr. Christopher,

Help! Help! I need someone to suggest an alternative to surgery.

"I have 3 cysts (Chalazions) inside my lower right eyelid. Have consulted two ophthalmologists. Both say I must have surgery. Neither can say that the results would be good. In fact, they say that the cysts can return after surgery, too.

"I am very discouraged, and the doctors are angry with me for not submitting to surgery immediately. What they are really saying is that they will mutilate my eyelid time and again, but will not guarantee good results.

"Can you help? Please, please!"

N.W. Hoffman Estates, Illinois CHRISTOPHER: You should use the eyewash three or more times a day and also drink the tea at night. Also, you should use the following fomentation right on your eyelid three times a week when you go to bed. Put one tablespoon of red raspberry leaf tea in a cup of boiled water. Let it steep until it has cooled. Then add 6-10 drops of either elderberry tincture or black walnut tincture. Then take a piece of sterilized cotton and dip it in this solution and place it right on the eyelid.

If you follow my directions faithfully, you should expect some good results.

Macula Degeneration

QUESTION: "If a person has macula degeneration, what help may he or she expect from the use of the eye wash?"

CHRISTOPHER: I am not really acquainted with this condition, so I can't tell you what to expect. However, the more serious the condition, the greater your chances of recovery by following our entire program in addition to the eyewash. Let me know what happens.

Floaters Increase on Eyewash?

QUESTION: "I started using the eyewash because of the large number of floaters in my eyes and because I also have a film that floats like the floaters. I started using the eyewash over 13 weeks ago.

"For a long time, there was no change in my eyes. Then, the number of floaters began to increase until now they bother me all the time. I am concerned that my distant vision is worse and my reading vision slightly worse."

CHRISTOPHER: This is a good sign. It's got to get worse before it gets better. We had another letter on floaters way back there where we talked about cleaning out the transverse colon with the lower bowel formula, which applies here too.

Reader Uses Eyewash for 9 Months—Eyes Keep Getting Worse

QUESTION: "I am 72 years old now and did not have any eye trouble until I was 68. I did not even wear glasses. I first noticed some diminished vision in 1976 and had an exam by an optometrist in Detroit who said I had cataracts but no glaucoma. He fitted me with

glasses and said I would need an operation in the future.

"I was still driving at the time but eventually had to stop as my vision receded. I started with the eyewash and kept with it for 9 months. My vision has continued to recede and I can no longer read normal print. I had to add a magnifying glass to my glasses and even now I can only read with great effort. Even this letter was a great effort to see to write.

"I am continuing the program for a few more weeks, but if a miracle doesn't happen I am going through with the operation. I hope to hear from you as I cannot go on with the eyes getting worse."

CHRISTOPHER: This is the odd thing about the eyewash. Some people get results right away and others have to wait for 2 to $2\frac{1}{2}$ years for improvement. And while you are waiting for improvement, the eyes may continue to get worse. Perhaps you can increase the

strength of the eyewash solution slightly, or add parts of my "incurables" program to your regimen, such as the B and B tincture, the red clover combination for the bloodstream, the lower bowel formula and the mucusless diet. Anything additional you can do will only speed your recovery.

There is nothing that could do you any harm from this formula in any way. All we're doing in the healing process is bringing the toxic and bad material which clouds the vision to the surface. This does panic people of course, but with some people they clear it in a hurry; with others it takes many, many months.

SWANNANOA: Do you ever have people lose their vision for a while?

CHRISTOPHER: Very rarely, the eyes can go completely blind for a while, then it comes back again. It comes back so that they can do without their glasses and can read fine print.

Anyone who wants to go as quickly as they can on these things should do our basics, the three-day cleanse with the apple juice, the bowel cleansing, the blood cleansing, and everything else. If you do all this, you'll heal that much faster.

A lot of people don't cleanse their bodies or change their diet and they are pumping poisons into their eyes faster than they can ever clear them out.

Increased Ocular Pressure from Eyewash?

QUESTION: "I went to my Doctor after I started using the eyewash and the pressure had shot up to 39 in one eye and 32 in the other. They had been about 22 so I had to go back in a week. I quit the eyewash and they went back down to 22. My eye doctor didn't know what happened because I didn't tell him.

"I need to know now what I had done wrong, as now I am afraid to use the eyewash again."

CHRISTOPHER: No there's no problem there because what we're doing is stirring up toxic poisons so fast that it gets worse before it gets better again. With the large majority of people, they use the eyewash for a couple of weeks and go in and find the pressure is down.

Pain and Burning from Eyewash

QUESTION: "The evening after my fourth day of using the eyewash my eyes began to burn and the lids also and as the evening wore on they hurt more and more. I had to apply cold compresses until late into the night to stop the pain. The next days my eyes were almost swollen shut and the eye balls were fiery red and the condition took several days to clear up.

"Ten days later, I used the eyewash again, and after the third wash, it happened again, although not as severe. Now I'm afraid to use it again, although I do have cataracts and would like very much to be rid of them—without surgery."

CHRISTOPHER: She's got a nice case of eye problem there that has to be cleared. And as they pull the toxic poisons out so fast, sometimes it gets too rough for them, they've got to taper it off a little. But also you use the fomentation over the eyes at night to try and rebuild them. Use the fomentation with the red raspberry leaf with the mullein. (Editor: See Page 77.)

Eyes Get Too Dry from Eyewash

QUESTION: "About an hour after I use the eyewash, I have a film come over the eyes. In a couple of weeks this ended and my eyes felt dry. In the A.M., upon awakening, the eyeballs felt hard (like a marble) and dry and it was difficult to open my eyes. The lids felt stuck to the eyeball—a most uncomfortable feeling.

"My eyes felt stronger, although I could not be sure I felt any better. I've worn glasses 47 years, since I was 17. Now my eyes do not tire as easily.

"However, because of the almost frightening discomfort, I have discontinued use of the eyewash. At times, I have had to literally pull my eyes open. Is there any way I can alleviate this so I can continue to use the eyewash?"

Mrs. M. R. Port Allen, Louisiana

CHRISTOPHER: What's happening is that the tear ducts are being healed here, and they are not putting out the liquids. So in this case, she should use unsalted sunflower seeds. Use more oils in her diet, so she can assist in lubricating her tear ducts.

She is probably so dehydrated that the tear ducts don't want to work. She should be drinking a gallon of distilled water a day, but not during or right after meals. Tell her to step up that liquid, and I don't mean coffee or Coca-Cola.

Detached Retina from Eyewash Use?

QUESTION: "I really got bad results from the eyewash. I used it for about three months and it resulted in a detached retina which required surgery. Since the surgery I still have vision but not that good in the eye."

CHRISTOPHER: I am sorry to learn what happened to you, but this is in spite of using the eyewash, and not because of it. As I have said many, many times, the eyewash can do no harm. Your eyes must have been in a bad condition in the first place and the fact that you used the eyewash is NOT the reason your retina detached.

It is still possible for the eyewash to help repair your eyes, but you should go "slow and easy" to see what happens. Also, get yourself on a good program. You can't always rely on the eyewash by itself to do the entire job. After all, the eyeballs are connected with the rest of the body. They are not independent, and you can't always get them well by ignoring everything else and using the eyewash to bail you out.

Lens Implant and Eyewash?

QUESTION: "My mother is developing cataracts and she suspects that she has glaucoma too. Her problem lies in the fact that she has permanent lenses in her eyes.

"Her doctor has prescribed cortisone to control the infection in her eye. She also takes penicillin.

"Would it be all right for her to use the eyewash formula? Would it be safe for her to use the eyewash with the permanent lenses in and in view of the medicines she is taking?"

CHRISTOPHER: I don't think the eyewash would interfere with her implanted lenses or with her other medications, but to be safe, it would probably be best to use an extremely diluted solution at first and see what happens.

Does Eyewash Cause Excessive Tearing?

QUESTION: "I store the eyewash in a small plastic bottle in the refrigerator. I apply the solution cold to the eye, at about the temperature it comes out of the refrigerator. I notice now, too, that out-of-doors in the cold, my eyes tear excessively and the tear ducts do not handle the flow, so that tears keep spilling over my face. Any suggestions?"

CHRISTOPHER: First of all, we do not recommend putting the eyewash on cold. It should be put on at room temperature. Aside from that, I am not sure why your eyes should be tearing like that. I should hope that with continued use of the eyewash, the tear ducts will heal themselves and correct the problem. To be honest, this is something I have never heard of before.

Reader Claims Eyewash Caused Severe Infection

QUESTION: "After three days of herbal eyewash used at 1/8th strength, I increased the solution to 1/4 teaspoon per cup of water and bathed the right eye six times that day instead of three.

"As I was preparing for bed I felt a twinge in the right eye but felt nothing more and slept well through the night. Early the next morning I was awakened by jabs of pain in the right eye and found my vision blurred and distorted. I went on to work, the pains stopped suddenly at 10:30 A.M., and I made an appointment with the doctor for the next day.

"Examination showed that I had either burned off or torn off a patch of skin from the right eyeball, and Sulamyd drops and ointments were prescribed. There was little improvement during the next week, and the next examination showed that I had a herpes virus infection in the eye. Vira-A was prescribed but the condition worsened and I spent a week in the hospital having various medications instilled every hour day and night. At the end of the week, the infected area had been reduced to the size of a pinhead and I was discharged. My vision had improved from a milky zero at the height of the infection to about 20/500 at that point.

"After almost three months of further medication, and expenses, amounting to almost \$1,500, the infection is gone, my eye is almost normal-looking, but my vision has improved to only 20/300.

"On October 25, 1979, my eye was examined by the head of the Department of Ophthalmology at the University Hospital, University of Oregon, Portland. He was not able to come up with any diagnosis at the time, and was not sure that there was very much help for the problem. He and my own ophthalmologist here in Salem have decided to try an eyedrop that is supposed to dissolve the mucus plaque on the eyeball, and I will begin these on Monday, November 5 (this evening).

"My purpose in writing is not to criticize the herbal eyewash, because I am sure that most of the people who try it will be helped; however, I wonder whether people who have no knowledge of eyes and symptoms and problems should be tempted into using a substance without first warning them to consult a doctor. (In many cases the doctor probably would disapprove of any method except his own, however.) I shudder to think that both of my eyes might have responded in the same way, and I am grateful to have the full use of the left eye.

"Would Dr. Christopher care to comment on any of this?"

CHRISTOPHER: I have seen no tea on the face of the earth that could tear off a patch of skin. No tea can do that

SWANNANOA: Why do you think she got that tremendous blow-up and infection?

CHRISTOPHER: This condition of rebuilding an area of the body makes it go through a lot of physical change and it could have drawn toxic poison from other parts of the body. The eyewash DID NOT give her herpes virus but it could have pulled it from another part of the body and caused it to erupt through the eyes. I think her biggest mistake was to stop the eyewash completely, not even use it in a diluted form, and go through an intensive series of medications. Her eyes will never become normal that way.

Readers Question Christopher Statement About Cataracts

QUESTION: "I am very concerned about a statement by Dr. Christopher[in your latest newsletter]; so much so that I am afraid to show this issue to my ophthalmologist.

"Quote: 'You see, what had happened was that her cataract had come out of her eye. The eyewash had loosened it and caused it to be thrown off. Two days

later the cataract came off the other eye in the same manner.'

"It is my understanding that the term 'cataract' refers to an opacity of the crystaline lens. Since the lens is within the eye how could a cataract come off in one's hand? I would greatly appreciate an explanation of Dr. Christopher's statement."

CHRISTOPHER: It doesn't matter how deep it is within the lens, it will come to the surface. Now we've had them in deep like this, but it takes longer. The tea that we use doesn't just work on the surface of the eye. It penetrates clear through to the back of the lens, even to the optic nerve. It goes through the whole eye and drives off bad cells; it doesn't matter how deep they are.

Does Eyewash Cause Infection?

QUESTION: "It may be that the method of making the eyewash is not well spelled out. Distilled water is sterile as is the distilled water after it is heated. The eye glass is washed routinely. Therefore, I find it hard to visualize how one can get bacterial infection from using the eyewash medication. The bacteria is not coming from inside the eye. It is either coming from the eye wash or something in the eyewash or the receptacle for the eyewash. (Emphasis supplied.)"

A Medical Doctor (Name withheld on request) Winter Haven, Florida

CHRISTOPHER: There is nothing toxic in the eyewash, and although everything can and does contain bacteria, including the eyewash, I do not believe it causes infection in anyone. I believe the infection is coming from the eye itself or else is drawn there for elimination from another part of the body. The infection doesn't necessarily have to be in the eye itself, it can be drawn to it from the bloodstream.

Eyes Puffed Up Like Balloons

QUESTION: "I used the eyewash and the response was unfavorable because my eyes puffed up like balloons, so I stopped the treatment right away. I spent about \$21.00 on it and it's all right down the drain."

CHRISTOPHER: Well, her eyes are retaining water there. You could use the compress I recommended on page 77 to remove the excess liquid. But I am wondering if it is a kidney problem. Generally, that would cause a lot of bloating around the eye area and the eyewash would bring it to the surface.

If it is a kidney problem, they should use the kidney formula and use parsley tea with it.

Skin Reaction from Eyewash?

QUESTION: "After several months of using your eyewash I stopped because my eyes were so bloodshot. Six weeks after I stopped, I gradually broke out with a rash and the face around my eyes is covered with bumps like spider bites. Hard, sore bumps under my skin. Also along the jaw, back of the ears and all around the neck. Could this be a delayed reaction to the herbal eyewash?"

CHRISTOPHER: Well, it would be in spite of, not because of; there's no question about that. Because that sounds like a glandular problem there. It might be that the eyewash has stirred up enough toxins to irritate the glands, but we would recommend the mullein and lobelia to help clear the glands and speed it up. Use the mullein and lobelia—3 parts mullein to 1 part lobelia—internally and as a fomentation and that will help to clear up a glandular condition.

SWANNANOA: Why do the eyes get so bloodshot in many people?

CHRISTOPHER: The eye is weak in the first place and now we're working it over, you know, accentuating the blood running through there. If they've been using a lot of sugary materials, or bread products, that will weaken the eye. But over a period of time the eyes will rebuild themselves and heal. In the meantime, users may have to dilute the solution until the bloodshot problem goes away.

How to Regenerate Optic Nerve

QUESTION: "I have been totally blind for about 2 years from what ophthalmologists called temporal arteritis or a hemorrhage which rendered the optic nerve inactive. I wish to use any natural remedies which possibly would reactivate the optic nerve."

CHRISTOPHER: In addition to the B and B tincture, you should try the oil of garlic in the ear, 3 to 6 drops of each 6 nights a week. This will go into the brain and repair the main motor nerve in the brain and the optic nerve as well. You definitely should use it.

[Editor's Note: To give you an idea of the power of Dr. Christopher's B and B tincture routine, we recently spoke with Mrs. Grace Bromell in Kansas City, and she told us her brother had bad hearing. He tried the B and B JUST ONCE, and the next week when he went to church he could hardly stand the noise, because he wasn't used to the increased sensitivity. Of course, this example pertains to ears, and not eyes and also, not everybody gets this kind of result, but it does give you an idea of what can happen.]

Keratoconus Question

QUESTION: "Has Dr. Christopher had any experience with keratoconus with his eyewash?"

CHRISTOPHER: The term is unknown to me, but I can't say that the eyewash won't help. It has helped so many other conditions.

Is Eyewash Safe for Heart Patients?

QUESTION: "I am a heart patient who just got out of the hospital $1\frac{1}{2}$ years ago and I want to know if it is safe to take the eyewash capsules twice a day as you recommended?"

CHRISTOPHER: Yes, it has nothing to do with that. It is nothing but beneficial.

Getting Eyewash in Bulk?

QUESTION: "I would like to buy the eyewash in bulk as it would be much cheaper and I could get my cataracts healed much faster if I had it in bulk. Then I would drink the tea and do my eyes more as the capsules don't last that long and they are quite expensive."

"P.S. My husband died two years ago at 75 years of age. It isn't very pleasant to be alone unless you can use your eyes for everything like reading and sewing which I love to do."

CHRISTOPHER: I can understand your concern with keeping costs down. However, there is no need to get the eyewash in capsules. It also comes in powder form.

Eyewash Irritates Roof of Mouth

QUESTION: "I have tried taking the eyewash 3 different times and each time the roof of my mouth and throat gets very irritated (itchy). Why would this happen with the eyewash?"

Joanna Sellards Topeka, Kansas CHRISTOPHER: Again, it sounds like we're stirring up toxic poisons in the body. But the eyewash didn't cause the problem. It was there already. Maybe you should try the mullein lobelia compress also, on the throat area, and take it internally too.

Pressure and Aching Near Eyes

QUESTION: "My purpose for trying the eyewash is a problem I have had for many years. The problem seems to be the fact that I'm conscious of the fact that I have eyes in my head. The aching, burning, pressure and headachy feeling I have most of the time causes me to blink and stretch the eyes and facial muscles continuously, causing severe headaches and worsening of the eye problem.

"This got so bad five years ago that I consulted an ophthalmologist in tears. He couldn't find any real problem with the eyes, insinuating it might be just a bad habit. A pituitary tumor was discovered and it was removed but I have continued to have the same trouble with my eyes. I still complain to ophthalmologists and M.D.'s with no success. This problem, along with the pain, has affected my looks and personality extremely."

CHRISTOPHER: I would recommend in a case like this to use the bone, flesh and cartilage formula as a cap over the entire skull six nights a week as well as using the eyewash. It sounds a little deeper set than just an eye problem.


To make the bone, flesh and cartilage formula, soak the tea in cold water for 4 to 6 hours, then simmer for 20 minutes, no more, then strain and continue to simmer slowly until the tea is one-half its original volume. Don't simmer more than 20 minutes with the ingredients in because if you do the goodness of the tea will go back into the herbs and you will actually weaken the solution instead of making it stronger.

If it's a pituitary or pineal tumor or cyst, it will absolutely leave with the bone, flesh and cartilage compress. It will absolutely be dissolved. Incidentally, be sure to cover the compress with plastic to keep the moisture in all night.

Also, in this case, I would recommend using the B and B tincture in the ears, 3 to 6 drops a night, six nights a week, and plug the ear with cotton after using it so that it doesn't run out. Also, use the B and B tincture orally, about 6 drops in some water, three times a day.

SWANNANOA: She said the tumor was removed but she still had the same trouble with her eyes.

CHRISTOPHER: Well, even if the tumor were removed surgically, it wouldn't go to the cause. And what we're doing is going to the cause so that there won't be any more tumors. I feel sure that the bone, flesh and cartilage and the B and B tincture will solve her problem.

Eyewash Capsules Cause Indigestion


QUESTION: "The third time I used the eyewash I started having a pain in my left chest and some indigestion after eating. I stopped taking the eyewash capsules and no more pain and indigestion."

CHRISTOPHER: The person isn't used to using cayenne. He should use more water with it. He is evidently just barely getting it down. He should drink more water with the capsules.

Mullein-Lobelia Didn't Soothe Eyes

QUESTION: "We started with the eyewash but diluted 50%. Still the eyes were sore and red and burned considerably. We stopped using it and used the lobelia-



"The eyewash will not work as well without the cayenne pepper. I think that in most cases the fear of the cayenne causes more problems than the cayenne itself."

mullein solution, also diluted 50%. This also is painful to the eyes and if used several times a day, they become red and inflamed. What would you suggest?"

CHRISTOPHER: Try using slippery elm gruel as a fomentation, 1 teaspoon to a cup of water. But you've got to take the slippery elm powder and mix it into a paste with a little water before you can add a whole cup, otherwise it won't mix properly in water; make a paste first and thin it down. The slippery elm will soothe the eyes.

We have had so many cases that have used the mullein-lobelia successfully—but I guess your eyes are too sensitive, so stick to the slippery elm, and dilute the eyewash even more, until you reach a good level that doesn't cause prolonged soreness.

Are Eyewash Capsules O.K. If You Have Ulcers?

QUESTION: "I must ask if we can use the capsules for the eyewash if we both have ulcers, angina condition and high blood pressure. I doubt that the stomach can take the cayenne, as we react to any spice at all."

CHRISTOPHER: We use cayenne to cure ulcers. A teaspoonful three times a day has helped many people realize that ulcers aren't necessary.

And cayenne will help clear out the arteries, so it is good for anyone with a heart condition.

It's a shame that the people who need cayenne the most can have trouble taking it. If you have trouble taking it, it's a sure sign that you need it. You'll just have to start slowly, and take it with food at first, so it doesn't hit an empty stomach. Gradually increase your dosage.

Opaque Spot in Eyes

QUESTION: "I have an opaque spot in my right eye and I hope the eyewash will clear that up, if possible.

"I have been bathing my eyes with eyebright and goldenseal and it brought globules of yellow matter or pus into the corners of the eyes, and glued eyelashes together. It frightened me and I quit. What can I do to clear up this opaque spot?

My doctor told me to stay off all dairy products for a year, but I do not think it has helped me, for I am still spitting up as much phlegm as I did before."

CHRISTOPHER: You shouldn't have quit. You were getting excellent results, or that pus wouldn't have started to come out. Do you want to keep it locked up in there for the rest of your life? Just keep going. If these were the results you got from using just eyebright and goldenseal, imagine how much better you would do on the complete eyewash formula.

To get rid of mucus, you not only have to eliminate dairy products, but you should go on our Three Day Cleansing Program, and go on the Mucusless Diet.

Reader Can't Afford to Use Eyewash as Tea

"Dear Dr. Christopher,

I am eighteen years old and I have been using the eyewash for three months. My eyes are very bad and I need the eyewash, but I can't afford to take it as a tea

in addition to the eyewash. I don't make much money, only from babysitting, and with drinking the eyewash twice a day, it won't last me long.

"I figured it would cost me about twenty-five dollars a month. I can't afford that so what should I do? Should I stop taking the eyewash altogether? How important is drinking the tea?"

CHRISTOPHER: I can't see why the eyewash should be that expensive. If you make three cups a day of the tea and remove an eyecupful for the eyewashing, you will have almost three cups left for drinking. Three cups should use at most 3 teaspoonsful of the powder. At that rate, a 4 ounce bag should last you 15 days. So your monthly bill should be no more than \$10.00, unless you have to buy it in the mail and pay postage. If you have to, slightly reduce the concentration of the tea to conserve its use.

However, I'd rather see you try to get another babysitting job and raise enough to take the full dosage. It's worth the effort, believe me.

Cause of Low Oil Content in Tears

QUESTION: "Every time I go to one of these eye doctors I would ask them, 'What is the cause of this chronic low-grade infection and inflammation?' They then reply that it is due to what they call a 'Low Oil Content' in your tears, which causes the tears to break apart over the eye thus leaving parts of the eye exposed and without adequate tear-film protection.

"Next I invariably ask the final question, What is the cause of this low oil content in my tears?' to which they invariably shrug their shoulders in a futile gesture. Could this low oil content be caused by a nutritional deficiency? Is there any special herb that will correct the problem? I can't use the eyewash with cayenne pepper in it because of this problem."

CHRISTOPHER: You should eat raw sunflower seeds. The oil in sunflower seeds has a special attraction for the tear glands in the eyes; it gets there faster than anything else. Also, as I said elsewhere, add more oils to your diet, like raw olive oil.

As far as being afraid of the cayenne pepper because of your dry eyes, I don't think you'll have a problem. I have given the eyewash to people who were so dry they never cried at all because they had no tears to cry with. And the eyewash brought them back to normal. So I think you'll do just fine with it.

Where Does All the Mucus Come From?

QUESTION: "On the second day of using the eyewash the sticky, yellow matter was coming from my eyes so fast I could hardly see at times. The next morning my eyes were glued shut. I had to pull the dried matter off from my eyelashes. Now the mucus has slowed up and the eyes are taking longer washings.

"I can't understand how so much matter could collect in such a small space. Could this possibly come from another area such as the sinus?"

CHRISTOPHER: Yes, the mucus and other matter is probably coming from other areas too, like the sinus. This is something that happens with many people. Just be thankful that the eyewash is giving you such a good cleaning out. You needed it.

Blindness from Multiple Sclerosis

QUESTION: "Can the eyewash help those who have become blind from multiple sclerosis?

"I have multiple sclerosis, and like so many others, it affects my vision.

"I have one good eye. I cut out all sugar 8 years ago and exposed the upper lids of my eyes to the sun for 10 to 15 minutes every sunny day. This is best done by reclining and looking down at toes or grass. This is said to affect all glands of the body and the eyes. It has worked for me for I have better sight in my good eye than most people have at my age. My other eye is slightly crossed and can only see to count fingers. I can't read with it at all. Would the eyewash help it?"

CHRISTOPHER: Yes, I don't see any reason why the eyewash shouldn't help a person with multiple sclerosis. Of course, anyone with your condition should be on the entire "incurables" program. A lot of people from the Amish Country in Pennsylvania are using that program and are getting marvelous results with multiple sclerosis, cerebral palsy and other "incurable" conditions.

Thank you for the tip on sunlight. Any mild exposure to the sun like that can only do you good.

Glaucoma and Eyewash

QUESTION: "I am under my doctor's care and he had me taking a 2% solution of Pilocarpine for my glaucoma. Should I discontinue this and use the eyewash instead?"

CHRISTOPHER: I would never tell you to completely discontinue using your drops, but I would recommend

that you use the eyewash and slowly ease off on the medication until you are sure the eyewash is helping your glaucoma. Many people have written me and told me how little faith they have in Pilocarpine. But still, I always tell them to make sure the eyewash is working first before they stop using their medication.

Infection from Eyewash?

QUESTION: "After use of the eyewash, my eyes became infected with pus forming. A drop of antibiotic Garamycin cured this. I diluted the eyewash 50% and used it again. It again became infected and was cured by Garamycin. What do I do now?"

CHRISTOPHER: The eyewash is NOT causing your infection. You already have that. All the eyewash is doing is bringing it out. You will never cure the problem with drugs, because it will probably come back, as indeed it has. The only way to really help your eyes is to stick to the eyewash and get the cleansing over with. If you stop in midstream, you will be in the middle of an infection with only drugs to turn to. Next time, don't stop the eyewash.

Also, if you have repeated infections from the use of eyewash, make sure you clean out your colon with our Lower Bowel Formula and use the Red Clover Combination to cleanse your bloodstream.

Can Eyewash Help Detached Retina?

QUESTION: "My son's right eye was operated on a year ago for a detached retina, and it has held so far for the past 15 months. However, it has resulted in a serious loss of vision and was correctable only with lens to a 20/40 vision.

"His other eye has had 4 operations for detached retina in the past 6 months. The last operation was unsuccessful and the retina has not started to heal as hoped and there is also fluid in the back of the eye. The Doctor has said he cannot do anything further and that our son may lose the sight of the eye.

"Is it possible under these conditions to use your 'Eyebright' Formula?"

CHRISTOPHER: I don't have any experience with this condition, but I don't see any reason why the eyewash shouldn't help. You may also want to use it as a compress at night over the eyes. I am sorry I cannot give you any more information on this.

Diabetes and Eyewash

QUESTION: "My nephew, who is 29, has had diabetes since he was 9 and his eyesight is failing rapidly. Is your formula safe for his eyes? I hope and pray it is so, because if a lifetime blind person could now see, why couldn't it help a diabetic?"

CHRISTOPHER: I'm glad to see you are optimistic. Yes, by all means, use the eyewash. It can only do your nephew good.

I also recommend your nephew take a special blend of herbs called Pancreas Tea. You see, many diabetics suffer from eye problems because the disease affects the optic nerve. That's why it's important to correct the cause of your nephew's problems.

There's an interesting story about how I developed this Pancreas Tea. A few years ago I recommended some juniper berries for a patient of mine. He said he had these in his garden, so he didn't have to buy them. One day he came to show me some of his berries and I saw right away that they weren't juniper berries but cedar berries. I started to tell him not to take these anymore, when he interrupted me and said, "Oh, I don't want to stop taking these. I noticed that I don't have to take that much insulin anymore."

I was astounded. I told him to triple the dose and before long he didn't have to take any insulin. That's how I accidentally stumbled upon a great herb for diabetics. I added a few more herbs to make the cedar berries more effective and called the mixture Pancreas Tea.

Please let me know how everything works out. Just to be on the safe side, check with your doctor first.

Can Lower Bowel Formula Be Used in Case of Spastic Colon?

QUESTION: "Can the lower bowel formula be used by someone who has a very easily irritated and spastic colon?"

CHRISTOPHER: Yes, it can. But if it does cause irritation, use it with a slippery elm gruel. Use a teaspoon or more per cup. [Editor: See instructions on how to mix this up on page 89, on the question entitled, 'Mullein-Lobelia Didn't Soothe Eyes.' Also, we included this question because many of our readers are adding the Lower Bowel Formula to their programs to make the eyewash work faster.]

Conjunctivitis

QUESTION: "Cataracts and glaucoma have been talked

about in your Newsletter, but nothing concerning conjunctivitis. Please get some doctor or herbalist to explain the cause of conjunctivitis and what can be done to be free of it."

CHRISTOPHER: I don't have that much experience with conjunctivitis, but basically I can tell you that it is defined as inflammation of the delicate membrane lining the eyelids and covering the eyeball. Since we have had many people use the eyewash and recover from various types of eye inflammation, I see no reason why the eyewash shouldn't help people with conjunctivitis.

Editor Worries about Sight Getting Worse

QUESTION: "I am at the point of having a cataract operation this summer and cannot wait much longer because of the clouding up. As an editor—a fellow editor with you—I need my eyes constantly. But there is one point of obscurity which holds me back from using the eyewash. Several people in letters have said that after a while, their eyes get much worse and they can hardly see for a while. The answer from Dr. Christopher is always that this is a good sign, that they should continue and the sight will come back. But never is there any indication of the time span to expect of these processes.

"I cannot afford, for example, to start a treatment under which I may have no sight for several months or even weeks. I am both a teacher and editor and cannot go more than a week or so without doing editorial work.

"So my question is this: if my sight turns bad while using the eyewash, how long, roughly, should it take to recover sight? Is there a high probability that I would not be able to see at all for some period, even a short one, so that I could not do anything during this time? I fear this would be too dangerous for me."

CHRISTOPHER: I can understand your predicament but it is an impossible thing to give you an exact timespan. Usually the eyes don't go bad for more than a few days; however, in a severe case, it is impossible to predict what will happen.

Maybe you could speed your recovery by using the eyewash as a fomentation on the eyes at night. Use a cloth dampened with the eyewash solution, place it over the eyes and cover with a small piece of plastic to keep the moisture in. Let me know if this helps.

Also, and as I have told many many other readers, you should definitely consider going on the entire "in-

curables" program, or at least on the blood-cleansing and bowel-cleansing portion to try to speed up your recovery.

Eyewash Causes Black-Out in Eye

QUESTION: "I started using your eyewash on May 21, 1978. I felt my eyes getting clearer, and I continued using it. On July 17, about two weeks after I started the eyewash, I had a sudden black-out of my right eye and lost sight in that eye.

"On July 23, I went to the eye doctor. He said I had a vitreous hemorrhage of the right eye. Is it possible that the eyewash caused this?

"Dear Doctor, please send me some word as to what is the best to do. Shall I continue using the eyewash? Is there any chance of my sight returning?"

CHRISTOPHER: I feel that the black-out happened "in spite of" and NOT "because of" the eyewash. The eyewash can do nothing but good in strengthening and rebuilding the eye area. I don't know what condition your body is in, but I would suspect that you need to go on a good nutritional diet and a good cleansing program. I have noticed again and again over the years, that the people with healthy bodies have fewer problems with the eyewash than people who have neglected their health.

I would also like to add that your eyes may flare up every seven days, seven weeks, and every seven years. The body works on a healing cycle of seven, and so when you have a flare-up, it may not be that you are doing anything wrong. It may very likely be just a part of the cleansing cycle.

Every seven years I have a flare-up of my arthritis; it has actually put me back in a wheelchair for weeks at a time. This year, I had one of the healing crises for a few days. I got so stiff and sore I had to cancel a few lectures and stay at home and take care of myself. So please, expect your eyes to get worse. You can get your sight back, but not if you stop the eyewash.

Will Eyewash Help Cryptococcus Virus?

QUESTION: "Enclosed are xeroxed copies regarding the tragic illness of my husband, who suffered loss of sight due to the fungus or virus called cryptococcus meningitis.

"A lady in Tulsa, seeing the last account of his progress, sent us a copy of the Newsletter which has an interview with Dr. Christopher.

"The purpose of this letter is to ask if you think treatment with herbs would aid my husband's optic nerves? It is a very rare virus and until 11 years ago, they had no cure as you are probably aware.

"Can you please help us?"

CHRISTOPHER: The eyewash should be able to offer you some hope. It can never hurt you. I could not say for sure whether the eyewash will definitely work, but I can tell you that I have heard stories how blind people have regained their sight with the eyewash.

You should also take the eyewash as a tea. In each glass of tea, add 6-10 drops of black walnut tincture. Be sure to drink at least three glasses a day.

You should also use 6 drops of B&B tincture in your ear every night before you go to bed. Use a soft piece of cotton to hold the liquid in. Also, take 6-10 drops of this a day internally with a glass of water and rub some into the back of the neck. This will help to feed the motor nerves which help control the optic nerve.

Try to take the eyewash as much as you can. I know it's a lot of work, but I think it will be well worth it.

Hole in Eye for Drainage

QUESTION: "I met a lady who asked a question I could not show the answer for in your letters! A doctor she knew used a 'cool laser' to make a hole in the eye above the lid so you can't see it. This lets the fluids that cause the pressure to drain out. The lady said she must be careful not to let anything get in these holes, and she was afraid to use the eyewash because of that.

We feel that such stories as these should be the *rule* rather than the exception.

We believe that people can improve their eyesight FAR, FAR beyond what is considered as normal today. If a person has "perfect" vision and if he uses the eyewash—consistently—every day, we see no reason why his eyesight won't improve beyond normal limits.

The stench that comes out of your intestine after you take this tea is sometimes almost unbearable. With those kind of toxins in the body, how could anyone expect to have good vision?

As far as diet goes, one very important point that you should follow is that you should avoid ALL junk food. We are sure that many of our readers know this already, but it never hurts to mention it again. A few of the foods which you should avoid include: refined sugar, donuts, fast chain hamburgers, soda pop, pastry goods, white bread, potato chips, greasy fried chicken, and commercial ice cream. Eating junk food every once in a while will probably not do anyone any great harm, but it adds up.

You should eat only whole natural foods. Try to eat at least 20% of your food raw, including as many raw fruits and vegetables as possible. Also, try not to eat too many dairy products such as ice cream, cheese, and yogurt. We feel that milk products can cause a

great deal of mucus in the body and this mucus can cause the eyes to operate inefficiently. It will clog-up your entire system. If you want to have perfect vision, take our word for it, stay away from milk products.

You should treat your body like a temple. Only feed it the best foods. Remember, clean and sparkling eyes are only an extension of a clean and sparkling body. The cleaner and healthier your body is, the quicker you will be able to eliminate your eye problems with the herbal eyewash.

How to Make and Use the Eyewash

- 1. To make the eyewash, put one teaspoon of the formula in a cup of boiling distilled water. You should never use tap water. When the tea has cooled and when the herbs have settled to the bottom, pour off the liquid into a clean cup.
- 2. If you prefer, you can filter the liquid before you pour it off. You can use cotton or wool, or a fine strainer.
- 3. It is best to use the eyewash when it is lukewarm, although some people do prefer using it when it is cool. Make sure that it is not hot. Try to make the eyewash fresh every day, and do not let it stand without being refrigerated.
- 4. Pour the eyewash liquid into a glass eyecup. Most drug stores sell glass eyecups, but if your drug store does not sell them, you can buy the eyecup directly from the herb shop.
- 5. The best advice we can give you is to use the eyewash as often as you can stand it. Use it directly on the eye. Some people use it for just a few seconds on each eye; some people use it for five minutes on each eye. You will have to experiment. Each person seems to have his own unique way of using the eyewash.
- 6. Many people blink their eyes when the eyewash is in the eyes. Others blink their eyes for a few moments and then keep their lids open.
- 7. There is no "official" method of using the eyewash. Dr. Christopher has given his recommendations, but these are only guidelines.
- 8. If the eyewash stings a little and you really can't stand it, try diluting it. If it still bothers you, stop it for a while and then try it again.

- 9. Dr. Christopher has told us many times that the fear of the eyewash causes more problems than the eyewash itself.
- 10. Dr. Christopher also recommends that you take the eyewash internally as a tea. Use one teaspoon of the formula per cup of boiling water. Take it three times a day. Use honey to flavor.
